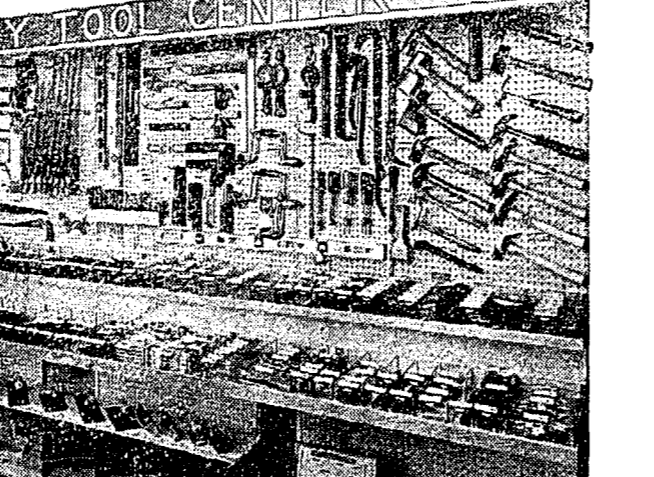

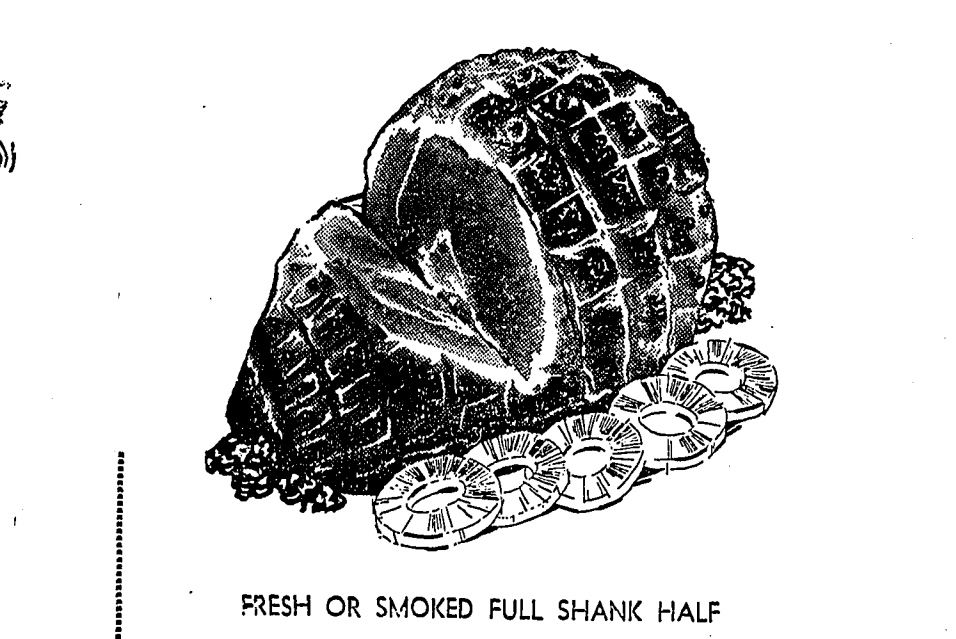

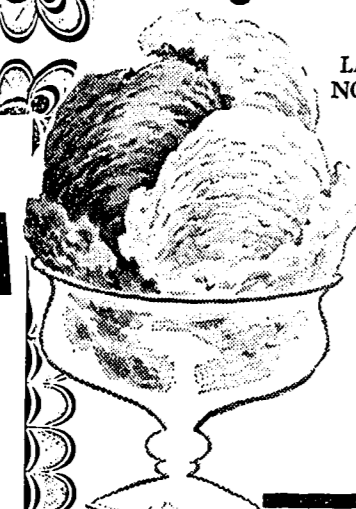

Michigan Mirror Dem Candidates All Set

DEMOCRATS have given the umpire their batting order for the 1958 campaign as Republicans intensified their search for challengers.

The umpire in this political ball game for high stakes is the voter who goes to the polls next November 7.

Technically, the Democratic lineup is only tentative, but the choices are not expected to have more than token opposition in the primary.

He has gained poise and strength in his first year in the legislature and now, at the ripe old age of 22, he shows vigor and a willingness to learn from party leaders, yet he is anxious to get things done.

Unmarried, he became famous for a crack during debate on a subject involving the fairer sex. Blushing a trifle, he strode to the microphone to say:

"I don't feel I'm qualified to speak on this subject."

Strange was elected following a stiff fight in the primary when he ran against his political science professor at Central Michigan college. At the time of the election he was too young to take office. Since his 21st birthday took place before the legislature convened, he was able to take his proper seat at the first session.

His interests stress government at the local level.

In session Strange introduced more than 14 bills, most of which are designed to provide more effective control of political affairs and government services to the individual.

These include provisions which would give the probate court permission at its discretion to release names of juvenile offenders; permit the engagement of a deputy treasurer with permission of a township board; improve administration of county road commissions; and a school aid bill.

He is especially interested in a bill which would remove the power of a village to levy a poll tax, which he thinks should be done in the interests of keeping state law modernized.

He is also anxious to pass a bill which would permit delegates to a Fall County Convention to elect officers of the County Committee including its chairman.

First to announce was Lt. Gov. Philip A. Hart, who will go after the seat now held by U.S. Senator Charles E. Potter, now finishing his first six-year term.

Potter charged immediately that Gov. Williams "made up Hart's mind for him" and welcomed his challenger "to the swim".

The Potter charge carries a good deal of truth, if significance can be attached to Williams' statement months ago that two officers—governor and senator—remain open for Democrats.

"I will run for one and Phil for the other," he said.

The Hart announcement made Williams' decision to run for a sixth term anti-climatic. Williams, eyeing a presidential berth in 1960, feels he would be more attractive as a county governor than as a gubernatorial candidate.

Williams allowed Hart to announce his candidacy for the Senate first for publicity reasons, observers said.

"Obviously, it was to draw attention to Hart because he (Williams) felt he had not opposition and he wanted to do Phil a good turn," said one Republican leader.

Whether Hart ran for either office, it was decided months ago that Senator John B. Swainson (D-Detroit) was the choice to replace him as lieutenant governor.

Both Hart and Swainson, now Senate minority leader and a strong voice in party councils, are wounded veterans of World War II. Swainson walks on a pair of artificial legs.

Both are good speakers. Hart has presided over the Senate for three years and Swainson has been in his position of party leadership on the floor for two years.

Williams' naming Hart for the next step in his political career, has turned over a large number of speaking engagements to the 46-year-old lieutenant governor.

Swainson has been the only legislator chosen to carry the Democratic message to the voters in an off-year.

Republicans have in Potter the only certain candidate in the 1958 election.

They still lack an obvious candidate for governor, though Rep. George Sallade (R-Ann Arbor) has said he would like to go against Williams. Party leaders have quietly been mentioning House Speaker George Van Pelt (R-Zeeland).

The rest of the Republican ticket will apparently be chosen at the party convention. The Democrats, all incumbents, are expected to be
