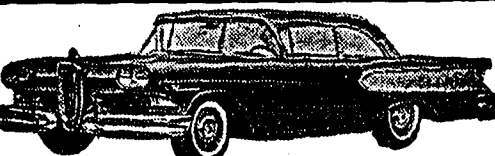

Dems Take Bows for Benefits

REPUBLICANS, while acting prudently and in good faith, lost part of a chance for a big bow on the public stage at an election year. Democrats stole the show when the legislature enacted a federal program to extend unemployment compensation benefits to 115,000 jobless at a cost of \$30,000,000.

It all started when Republicans sponsored a proposed extension of benefits during the legislative session but held back to wait for Congressional action. Democrats charged that the original Republican plans were not enough.

Then Republicans went for the federal program. When Gov. Williams signed the bill, the Democratic delegation in the legislature was photographed behind his desk and each received a pen with which he signed the bill.

Political experts see the situation as a real-time political issue this year. They predict it will be a vital vote-getter among the unemployed and those who are jittery about business and industry and their fate in the recession.

When the economic machinery goes into a tailspin, unemployment comes first and is greatest in the larger industries. The small businesses, especially the 95 percent of firms which employ 20 or fewer people, operate even in times of boom with a minimum of workers and therefore cannot lay them off in times of recession.

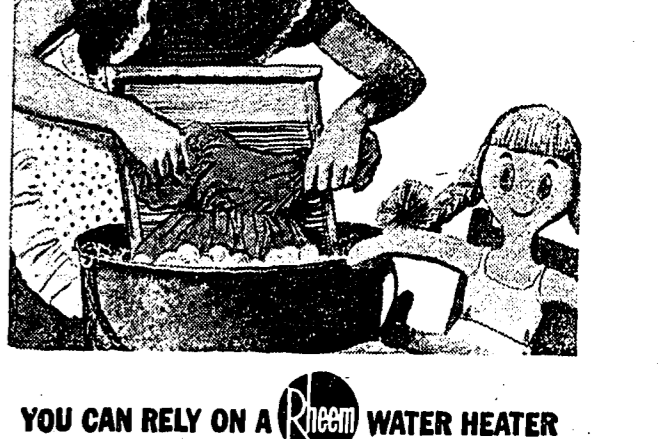

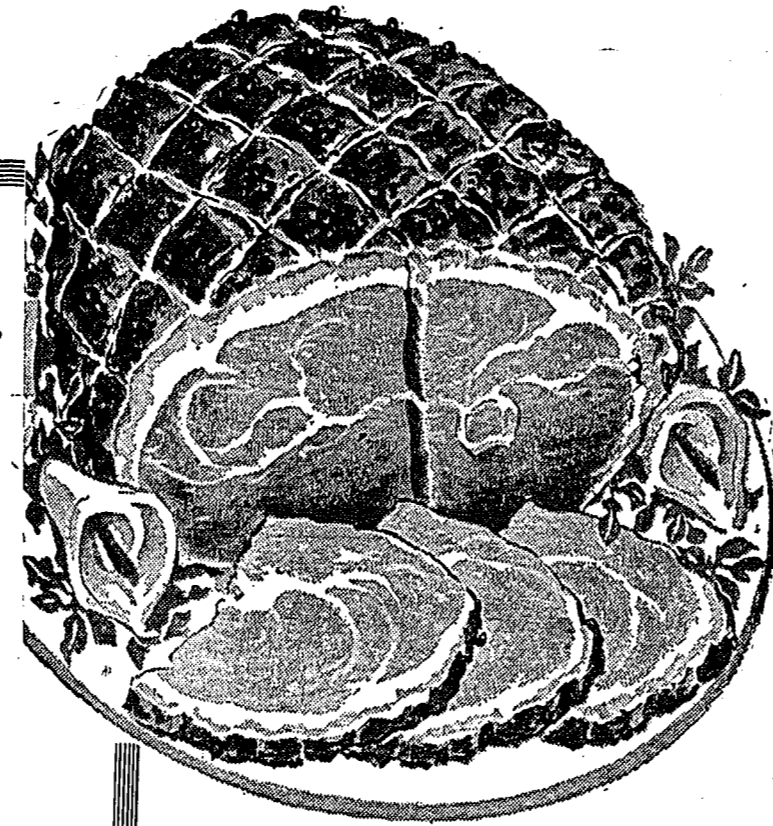

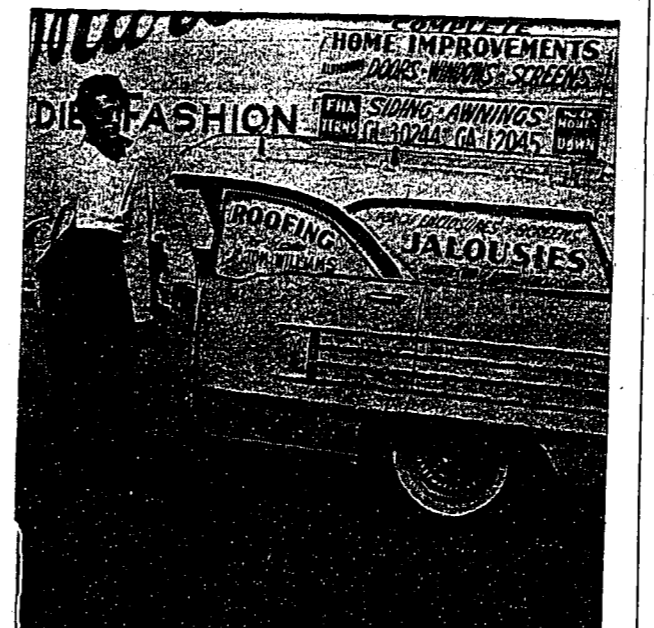
