OFFICIAL MINUTES OF THE NOVI SCHOOL BOARD

August 27, 1958
 A special meeting was called to order by President Heslop at 8:15 p.m.
 Present: Heslop, Crawford, Erwin, Taylor, Bernard and Dr. Medlyn.
 Also present were Mr. William and Charles W. Lane & Associates and Mr. Dobrowski of Stephen & Allen, Inc.
 Mr. Welland reported that the electrical service installation has been completed, and that the permanent pump installation was completed on August 23. Consumers Power Co. stated that gas service would be completed to the Orchard Hills school on September 4.
 Mr. Dobrowski stated that he had signed Consumers Power's request for an additional assessment agreement over his property.
 Mr. Welland reported further that the State Fire Marshal had given preliminary approval for the use of the building, and that a waiver for use of Unit A could be secured.
 Mr. Dobrowski stated that top soil was still piled on the road right-of-way, but assumed that this was to be removed. His primary concern was still with a solution to the drainage problem, and he requested a date on which a yes or no answer on his request for a storm drain. He was informed that the board would give the answer when all information necessary for a decision had been gathered.
 A review of a meeting at the job site with Mr. DeLman of the Oakland County Drain Commission was given by Heslop, Bernard, Dr. Medlyn. No stand was taken by Mr. DeLman. An excerpt from "Michigan Law on Farm Drainage" in which statements on similar problems were made, was read.
 Moved by Crawford, supported by Taylor that Mr. Meredith be called upon to give legal advice with regard to the drainage problem. Moved by Bernard, supported by Crawford that Mr. Meredith was to give answers as to our obligations, if they exist, and what action, if any, should be taken.
 Mr. Welland presented bids on iron removal and water softening for both schools. No action was taken on the bids.
 A comparison of the cost of the sale of the \$225,000 in bonds in two issues as opposed to one indicated additional costs of approximately \$2075. The bonding attorneys had recommended one series to attract more buyers and to obtain a more favorable interest rate.
 Mr. Erwin suggested that it might

not be necessary to sell the entire amount. It was proposed that the unallocated remainder in the revised budget be used for a planning fund for the future high school and further alterations of the Novi school for emergency uses such as the possible storm drain construction at the Orchard Hills school.
 Motion by Crawford, supported by Bernard to sell the entire \$225,000 of bonds in one issue. Motion carried.
 The formal resolution regarding the issuance of \$225,000 of bonds was read by the secretary and was approved by Crawford, supported by Bernard. Resolution carried unanimously on a roll call vote.
 Mr. Taylor reported on the advertising and sale of the bonds by sealed bids and authorization to the secretary to forward a copy of the same to the Municipal Finance Commission for approval as given by Crawford, supported by Bernard. Resolution carried unanimously on a roll call vote.
 September 10, 1958
 The regular meeting was called to order at 8:25 p.m. by President Heslop.
 Present: Heslop, Crawford, Taylor, Erwin, Bernard and Dr. Medlyn. Also present were Mr. Meredith, Mr. Lane, Mr. Welland and Mr. Hildebrand of Standard Oil Co.
 The minutes of the previous regular and special meetings were read and approved as read.
 The following treasurer's report was read by Mr. Crawford and approved as read:
 General Fund, \$18,944.70.
 1955 Building and Site, — \$22,500.00.
 1955 Debt Retirement, \$8,420.06.
 1955 Debt Retirement, \$26,127.19.
 1957 Debt Retirement, \$11,932.90.
 It was agreed that the following quotations on gasoline requirements:
 Standard, \$1.17 gallon; Ashland, \$1.40 gallon; Pure, \$1.60 gallon; Guernsey Farms Dairy (\$1.05 half pint), and Wilson Dairy (\$1.04 half pint). Discussion of preferences and performance followed. Moved by Bernard, supported by Crawford that the proposal of Farmington Dairy be accepted. Motion carried.
 It was agreed that the name plaque for the Orchard Hills school will list first the board members who served during the initiation of the project, followed by the names of the newly elected members.
 Moved by Bernard, supported by Taylor that the Orchard Hills school be extended eastward to the 1957. The bonding attorneys had recommended one series to attract more buyers and to obtain a more favorable interest rate.
 A discussion indicating the necessity of holding an election soon in question.

**MUSTANGS ARE MUDDERS;
ROLL OVER BRIGHTON, 26-0**

The mud didn't slow down the Mustangs! Coach Ron Schipper's undefeated gridgers ground out their biggest total yardage of the season in crushing previously unbeaten Brighton, 26-0.

The win left Northville almost a cinch to cop a third-straight Wayne-Oakland league title. It also removed the biggest threat to the Mustangs' hopes for an undefeated, untied season.

Friday night Northville could do no wrong. In a game played through intermittent and often heavy rains, the Mustangs ran and passed as though it were a sunny afternoon. They piled up 115 yards passing and 297 yards rushing for a total offensive of 412 yards.

Meanwhile, the defensive unit was holding Brighton to a total of 88 yards on the ground and in the air.

Bob Starnes and Spike Walker again led the Mustangs' offense. Starnes ran beautifully to score three times, the longest effort a smartly executed "Statue of Liberty" good for 84 yards.

Walker consistently churned up the middle for needed yardage and continued to perform as one of the best line-backing backs ever to wear a Mustang uniform. The Starnes-Walker duo gives Northville an inside-outside running threat like Army's famed wartime "Blanchard-Davis" teams.

Sharp blocking and tackling also played a key roll in Friday night's game as the Mustangs hit a peak performance to match their Milford game.

The Mustangs scored twice in the first quarter through the air and on the ground. Starnes took a 20-yard pass from Bill Boyd for the first tally with five minutes of the first quarter left to play. Earlier Boyd had hit Starnes for 16 yards.

Starnes' Statue of Liberty score came on third down late in the first quarter. He romped 84 yards untouched as the play completely fooled Brighton. Captain Wade Deal's kick was good and Northville led 15-0 at the half.

After a scoreless third period played in a steady rain, Starnes again broke into the scoring column with a 39-yard off-attack sprint. Larry Nitzel and Walker contributed good gains in the series of plays that led to the score.

Coach Schipper gave the entire bench an opportunity to play and the reserves proved they could score, too. In the final seconds of the game Jim Starnes plunged over from the three. Deal's attempt was no good.

Friday night the Mustangs travel to Clarkston, victims of a 20 to 0 beating at the hands of West Bloomfield last week.
