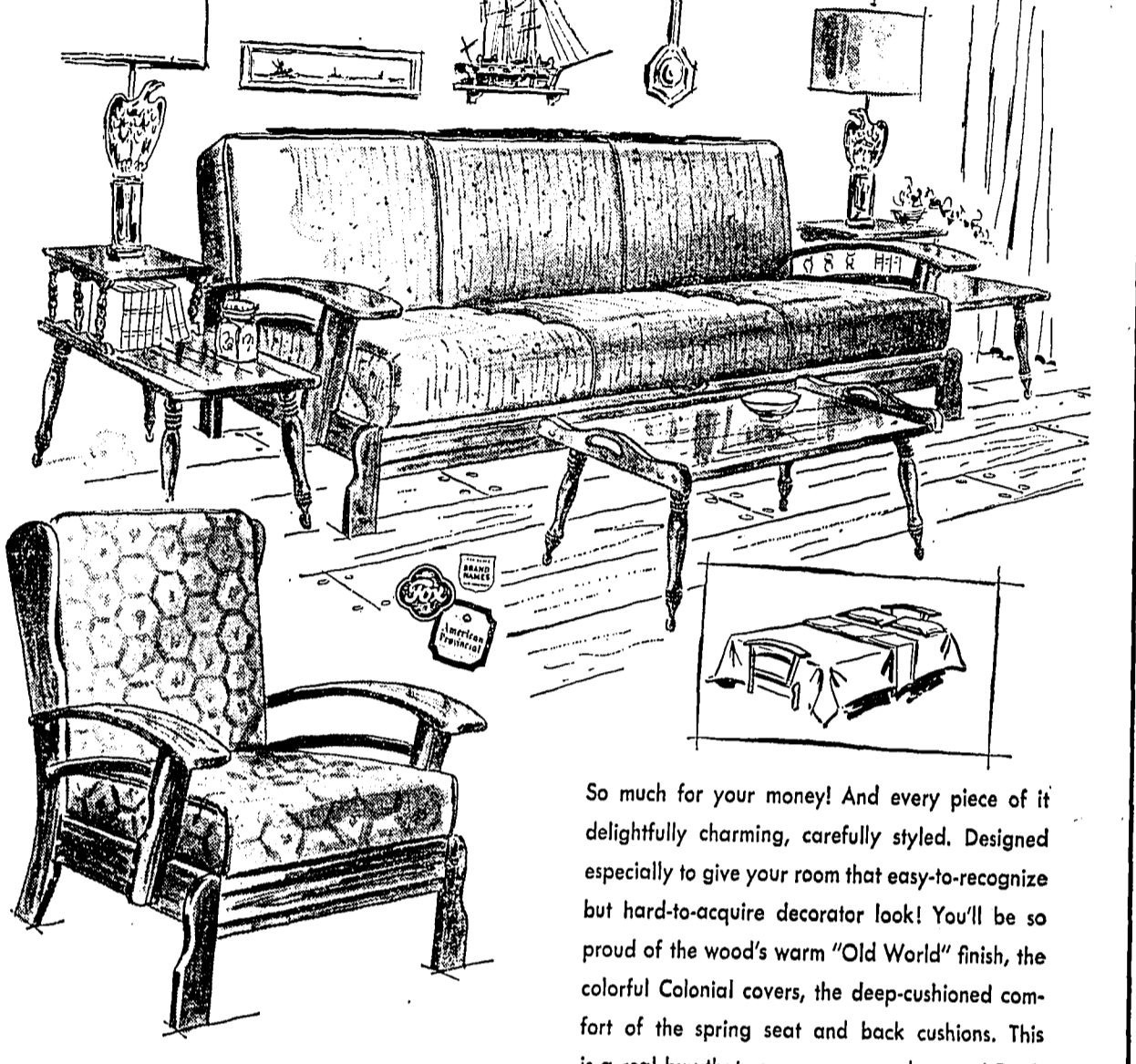

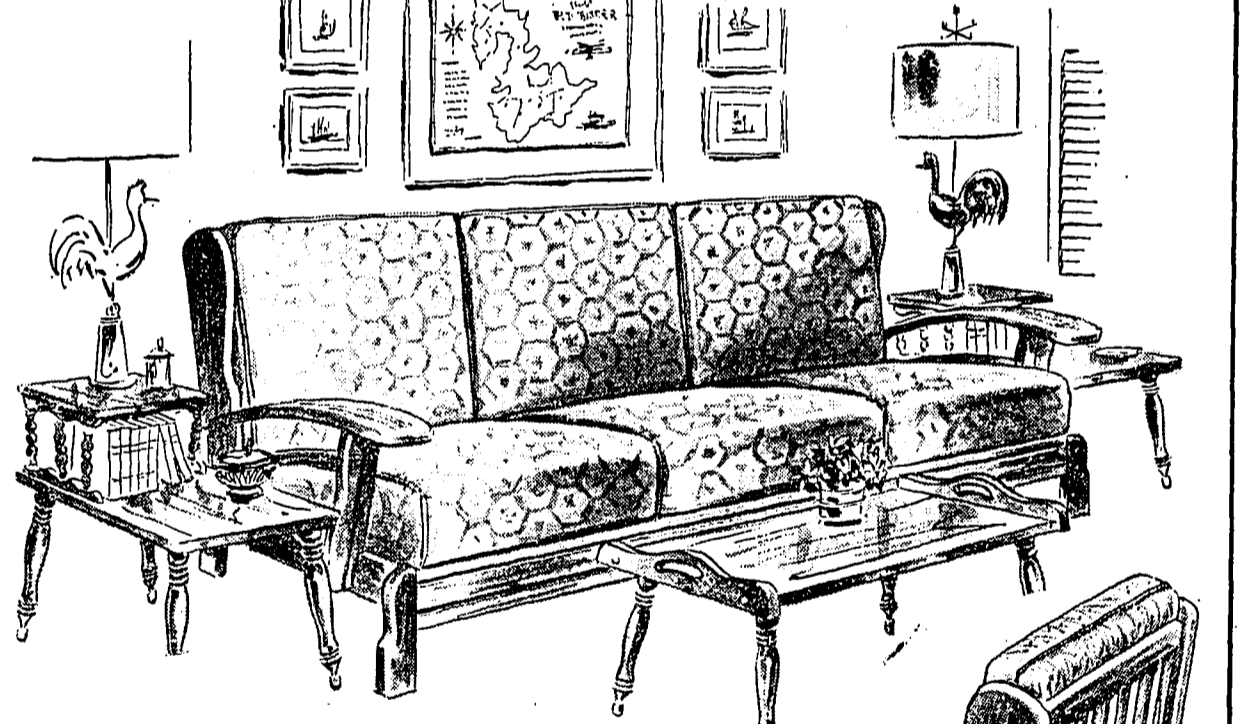

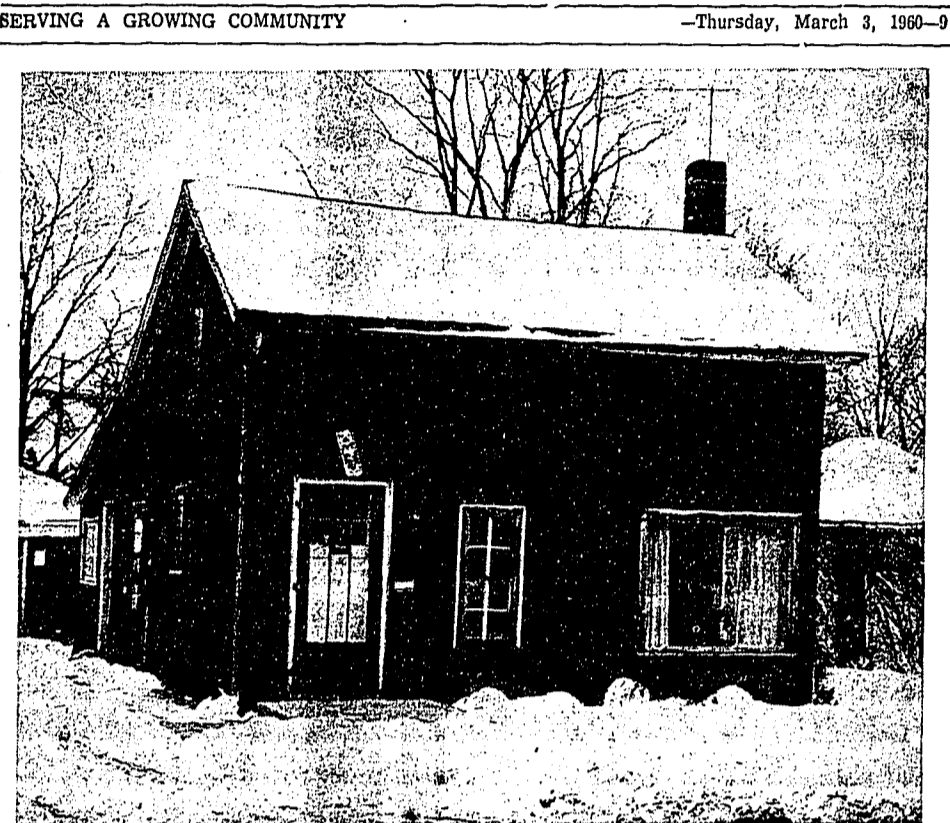

But No One's Jubilant Mustangs End Cage Season With Sizzling 82-56 Win Sports THE NOVI NEWS—Thursday, March 3, 1960—11

The curtains rang down on a rousing last performance Saturday night as the fired-up Mustangs clinched a dismal cage season by crushing South Lyon here, 82-56. But much of the joviality in winning dropped to the wayside in the wake of Friday's discouraging loss to Clarkston which tagged Northville as the bottom rung in the Wayne-Oakland league ladder. Friday's 67-59 loss at Clarkston left Northville holding a season record in the league of three wins and eight losses. In the overall season, including non-league tilts, the Mustangs ended with a record of six wins and nine defeats. Clarenceville and Brighton claimed a share of the league championship Friday as the Bulldogs rolled over Holly, 68-58, and the Trojans clipped Milford 52-48. By losing to Clarenceville, Milford slipped to a second-place tie after an amazing climb from the cellar to tie for first place. The Trojans, who earlier in the season were favored to win the W-O crown, finished in fourth, while Clarkston grabbed a place of second place. Despite its impressive 14-4 season record, South Lyon was no match Saturday for the Mustangs who seemed best on paper but that they are a far better basketball team than is indicated by their last-place finish. Coach Dutch Van Ingen, who is far from discouraged over this his first season as the varsity coach, weaved regulars and substitutes in and out of the game to pilot his club to its most impressive win of the year. The Mustangs were ineffective in the opening minutes as the Lions exchanged blow for blow. But by midway in the quarter, the local capers sparked to life leaving the Lions coughing in the dust. At the first quarter mark, Northville was out front, 14-11; by intermission, 30-24 lead. Northville led 58-30 at the end of the third quarter. Rick Guard Hager, Alchines, mission the Mustangs held a corner that in his best performance of the season, led Northville's second half attack with four field goals and a single charity shot in the third stanza and six field goals in the final period. His sizzling performance under the basket matched an equally stellar job of ball handling which brought screams of approval from delighted fans. Altogether, the 5'10" senior fired 31 points to lead his team in scoring. Sophomore Steve Juday, who started the season strong, lost his rise midway in the season and then bounced back with an average of 12 points throughout the final six games, scored 10 points Saturday. Center Wade Deal and Forward Jim Patterson each scored 13 points to help boost the score to a season high of 82 points. Percentage-wise, the Lions were tons at the free throw line, but the Mustangs tossed in 20 points in 40 attempts while South Lyon scored only 14 in 22 attempts. Although Northville took the short-end of a 67-59 score at Clarkston Friday, the Mustangs turned or some almost elated over the fact that the Wolves will move into a new gymnasium next season. Taking advantage of "herald box gym", which has brought complaints from most league coaches, Clarkston grabbed an early first-quarter lead and then galloped to the wire unopposed. The quarter scores were: 11-13, 19-15, 14-17 and 31-29. Juday took scoring laurels for Northville with 17 points. Patterson and Alchines were next high with 11 points each.

Coach Joe Wilkinson, who has announced that he probably will give up coaching next season, had some trying minutes Friday when the Frosh suddenly rallied to life in the third period and ported to a 50-29 victory. With the win over West Bloomfield here, the freshmen closed the season with 15 victories without a loss. Coupled with last year's string, the overall record is 29 victories without a defeat. The victory streak is one of the longest ever recorded in Northville high school competition. Craig Bell pumped in 18 points against the Lakers to grab scoring laurels for his squad. Teammates Dikran Orskanian and Don Biery were runners-up with 10 and 11 points, respectively. Quarter scores: 9-5, 7-10, 21-15 and 17-8. According to Wilkinson, three of his players topped the 100 mark in scoring this season. They are: Bell 244, Tom Swiss 152, and Biery 105. **LENT**

These observances on the day before Ash Wednesday are, as it were, introductions to the discipline which devout Christian are often times inclined to impose upon themselves during the forty days of Lent.

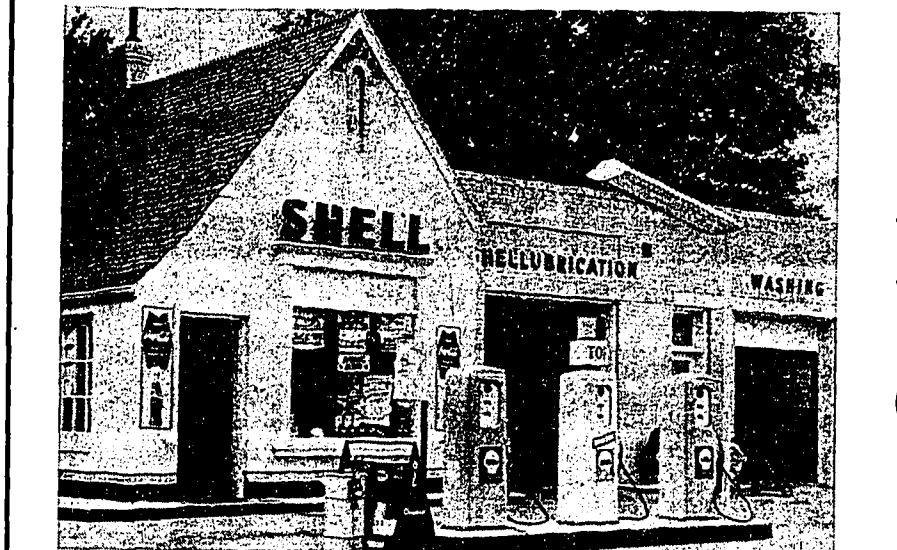



SPEAKING for the Record

Novi's Citizens Development committee is off to a strong start, thanks primarily to an extremely high percentage of replies to their questionnaire.

The committee, bent upon determining what kind of a community the majority of the residents desire and then mapping out a program to provide this atmosphere, sent out 1,500 questionnaires. To date 519 answers have been returned and analyzed.

The information covers such material as: how long one has lived in Novi; in what area of the community he resides; what factors attracted the resident to Novi; how many children in the community; whether he is a property owner and whether his place of employment is in Novi; and finally, if the area is developing in the manner in which the resident had hoped.

While some of the answers might, on the surface, appear to indicate a variety of certain positions, the committee must (and undoubtedly will) consider them in the light of the questions asked.

For example, 465 of the 519 said they were attracted to Novi by "suburban atmosphere" or "quiet country atmosphere", and 199 more to "escape high taxes".

Very few (only 19) said they moved to Novi to live in an industrial area.

But then, this is something like the old question, "when did you stop beating your wife?"
