Probably there never was a time when more Michigan people were thinking and talking about state aid to local groups than now.

Unemployment figures, business reports and recently the announced start of the Economic Development Department, some of which have been considered for a long time, are evidence of a situation which has been in the news for many months.

Conservative Maine has a sort of industrial FHA plan. So does Rhode Island. The state guarantees up to 90 per cent of a loan made by a bank in cooperation with a community industrial development plant to be used for a wide variety of business purposes.

Arkansas, incidentally, lost no time in claiming that the result of legislation adopted recently is a half-million dollars for this advertising alone. Five years ago the Pennsylvania legislature appropriated \$5 million for plant construction loans.

Michigan leaders must now decide what programs this state will adopt to help in its situation. The newly elected governor, John B. Swainson, indicated that the state would support recommendations. One approach the state fund has reached

Tax Levy Debated By Abrams, Lahti

Whether the state equalization factor should be applied to the city of Wixom's assessment rolls was given an airing out to the city leaders Sunday afternoon during the meeting of the Hickory Hills Civic Association.

Once County figures are established, they are sent to the State Board of Equalization which follows through to equalize the rolls by adding to or deducting from the total of each such unit that will produce a true cash value of the assessment for each district.

Mr. Abrams said there was some justification for the equalization factor when so many variants were concerned outside the municipality. It was a fair step to insure that every citizen is paying the same amount of money as his neighbor for benefits they both share.

Mr. Abrams said that the equalization factor "in my opinion, is a good thing. It makes the city's tax money more equitable." He said that the equalization factor would be needed to correct the City in the light of the State ruling. The City could not ignore it.

Mr. Abrams then went into a discussion of the assessment process. First, he said, the local assessors or assesses all real and personal property in their district. These figures are forwarded to the County Board of Supervisors who determine whether or not the property in each district has been uniformly assessed at cash value.

Truckers Protesting 'Unfair' ICC Rates

Truckers — their rigst gathering in front of the Interstate Commerce Commission (ICC) — are demonstrating in front of the Wixom Lincoln plant this week protesting the Ford Motor Company's decision to ship Thunderbirds rail rather than truck.

Wixom is the only plant in Swainson to see the repeal of the Ford plant producing T-100s and Continentals with shipments going to points in the east, south and west. The railroad rates were cut half of the truck rates.

Gov. Swainson is asked to act to prevent arbitrary ruling-making by the ICC in favor of one mode of transportation to the detriment of another. It asks for investigation by the legislature to correct this evil in the State of Michigan.
