Geologist Speaks Here

Former State Conservation Department Geologist Helen Martin gave a unique and fascinating account of history and conservation from a geological point of view recently before an audience made up predominantly of Northville teachers and members of the garden club and D.A.R.

Miss Martin prefaced her outline of man's development and his use of minerals with a survey of the earth's evolution before the advent of human beings.

Touching on Michigan's role in the refinement of civilization, she went on to discuss conservation of mineral resources, which, she explained, is affected by the discovery of new methods to detect and extract mineral wastes are former waste materials that would have otherwise been useless and by finding new uses for former waste products. She noted that formation of mineral wastes are now being utilized as never before.

"We have wool that never saw a sheep. We have wax that never saw a bee. We have fur that never saw a beaver."

Northville Teachers club sponsored Miss Martin's talk. Besides her earlier work with the conservation department, Miss Martin is now national chairman of Federated Garden Clubs, on the National Committee of Geological Research and has worked with Standard Oil as a geologist.

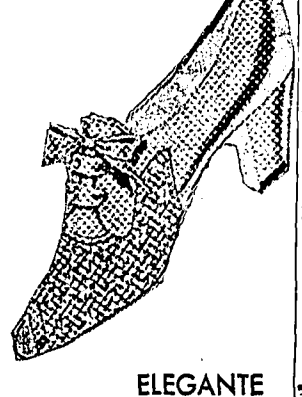

READERS SPEAK: Assessments Not Wanted

We will have to educate them!

This is a statement made by a Councilman in one of his addresses to some 250 to 300 signatures on petitions filed objecting to our special assessment on our unpaved streets.

In other words, we, comprising signatures of a past village president, former councilman, business and civil leaders, plus good sound citizens, who signed those petitions did not know what they were signing.

It is true there are arguments on both sides of this delicate subject. However, the opinion of those of us who signed said petitions think our cause is just and equitable, more so than any other kind of argument presented for said assessment.

Is it not odd that since 1927 to date any of our past councilors during those years had not seen fit to change the method of paving our streets? I had been of service to our community as your councilman for eight years and my street is still unpaved. But, during all that time I agreed with the principal of that which we lived.

In the years of 1927 and 1929 our village fathers attempted and did set up a special assessment district at the request of property owners of certain streets to have their streets paved.

However, there was an illegality in the assessment roll caused by the over assessment of the 5% allowed for any one year based upon the assessed valuation of the premises. (See state case no. 22529 referring that it was contrary to Section 1623 of compiled laws of 1929 and section 27.20 C.L. (1915)). The roll was set up for a ten year period. This illegality caused a law suit in which the village was determined by the court that the total amount of money that would be lawfully collected by the village was \$45,000.00.

The village had to refund any over assessment upon request and that refund came mostly out of the general funds. Payments were made on bonds from 1927 to 1939 which were defaulted leaving the village to float a new issue for a period of thirteen years at a cost of \$136,724.48 which was paid off out of the general fund by the year of 1952.

We most all agree the paving of streets should have been via special assessment method. However, there was a case created a specific problem and expense and as a result our leaders in the past said the streets should be paved out of general funds.

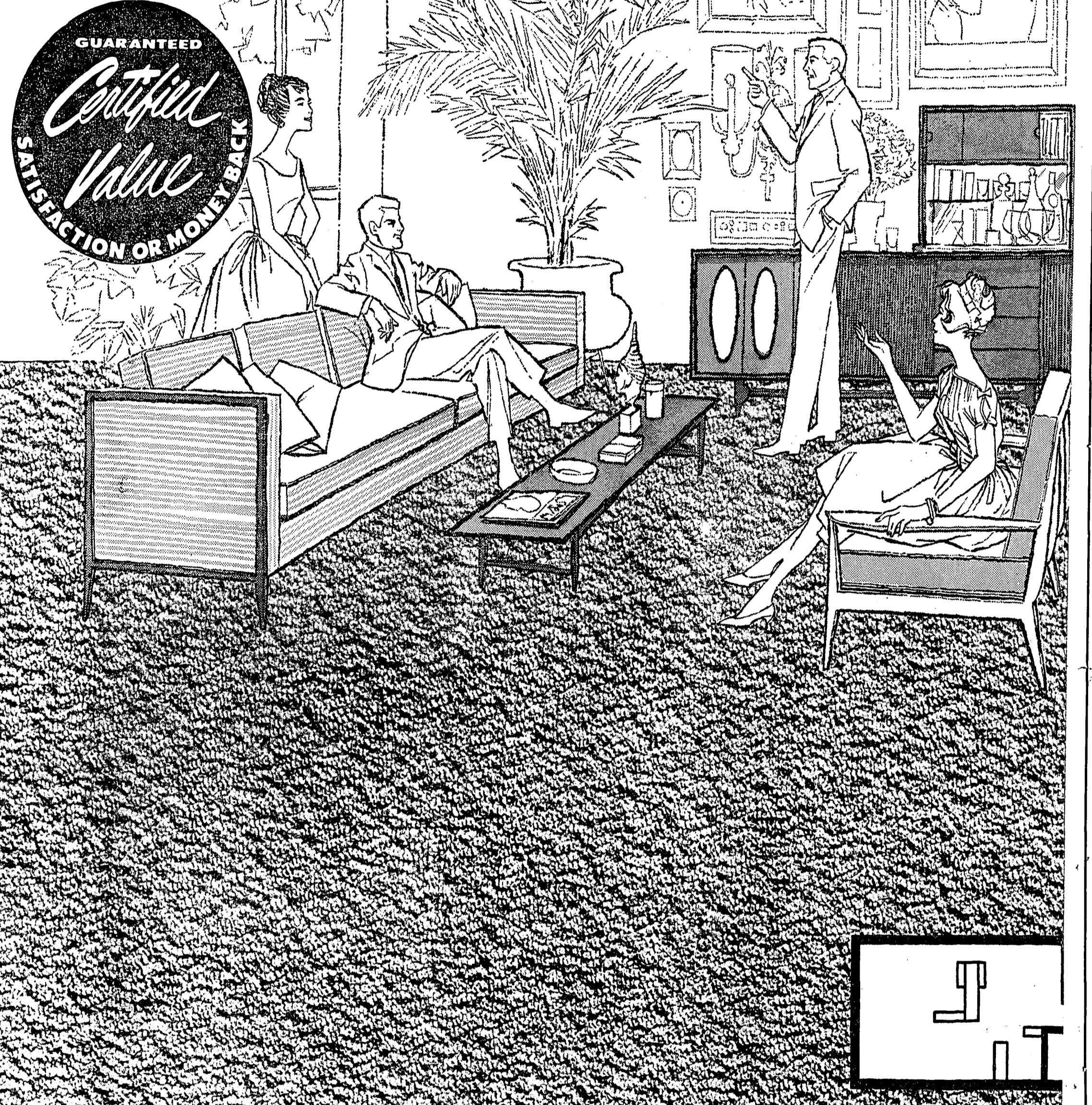
We, who have lived in our community for five to forty years, or even a life time have built up an equity in the general fund. Not only as far as paving is concerned but also in public utilities such as water, sewer, both storm and sanitary, fire protection, etc. The development of these certainly cost the residents a large amount of dollars. Further, while waiting for streets to be paved the residents had to live in the consequences of living on unpaved streets. The consequences to the unlimited consist of dust, tracking of oil, bumpy roads, etc. Any new resident moving into our community and becoming a part thereof does have the advantage of all these improvements and the cost thereof. I believe any new citizen will recognize this theory and fact.

It may take ten years instead of seven or eight to accomplish all of the paving out of the general fund. Note it has been called a street improvement program but in reality it is nothing more than just a plain old special assessment with all of its inequities because it is against the principals as laid down in the past.

However to those of us who have waited up to thirty years or more to have our streets paved, another year or so will not make any difference to me. It is my opinion from observation that any of the old paving should be put on a special assessment basis thereby alleviating the general fund. If, in any such case it could be proved that it was inequitable to handle a situation of this kind in such a manner we could take the money from the general fund.

I wonder if we the people, who signed those petitions have to be educated or who should be? Yours as ever, Earl L. Reed, Your Ex-Councilman

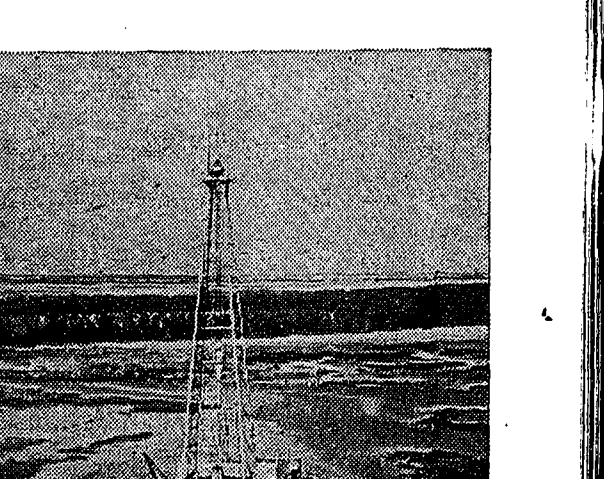
