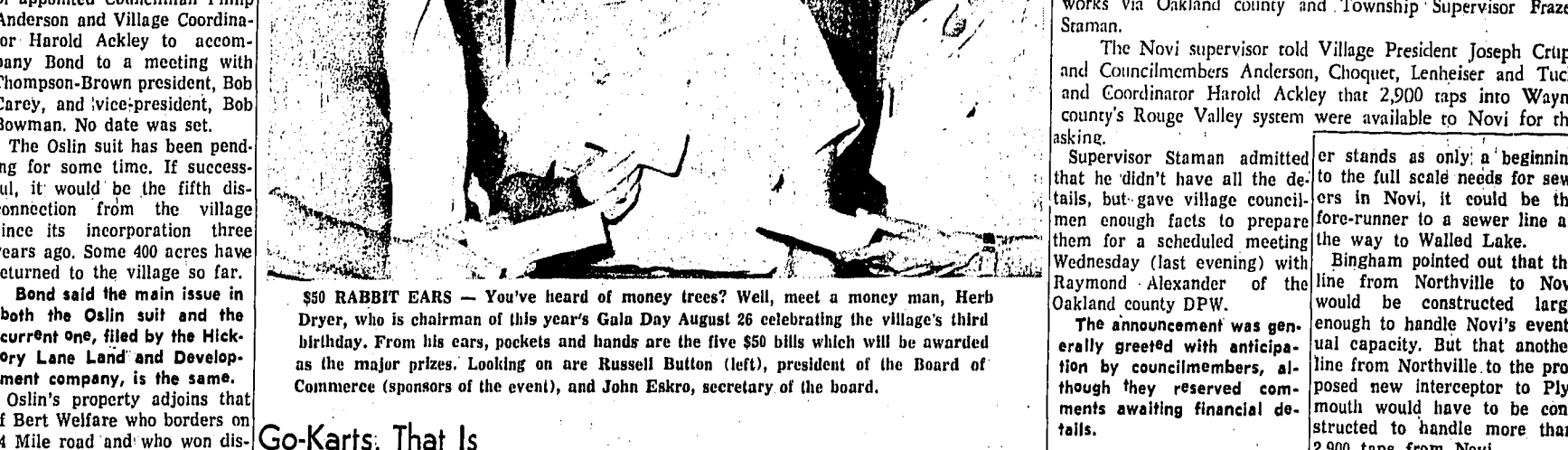

SPEAKING for the Record

For a city to be located in two counties has few (if any) advantages and numerous disadvantages.

Northville residents have known this from past experiences with different assessing practices in Wayne and Oakland counties that, until corrected, resulted in school tax inequities.

There's another odd twist connected with the multi-county status of the school district that concerns the library.

Kenneth Shrewsbury, a township resident and member of the recent city-ownership library study committee, brought it to our attention.

While all city residents may use the library without an additional fee (regardless of whether they reside in Wayne or Oakland county), the Oakland county residents of the school district must pay a \$10 annual family fee.

Shrewsbury points out that this discourages assignments at the public library by the school system.

"As far as I'm concerned, the committee wasn't trying to bring the township's share of the cost up to the city's," Shrewsbury declared. But he calls the present library set-up in contradiction with the school district.

Under the committee's proposal residents of the school district would be asked to vote a one-mill levy earmarked for library support. The school board would then be the contracting agency, but not the administrative arm, Shrewsbury added, giving all students and adults within the district equal library privileges.

NORTHVILLE TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 11

AN ORDINANCE IN FORCE AND SAFETY FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING STANDARDS FOR CONSTRUCTION, MAINTENANCE, REPAIR AND ENFORCEMENT OF SWIMMING POOLS; PROVIDING FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTHVILLE ORDAINS

ARTICLE I
DEFINITIONS
1.1 SWIMMING POOL, any artificially constructed, portable or non-portable structure, intended for human swimming or bathing, located either on a lot, or on a public street, and having a depth of two (2) feet or more at any point and a water surface area exceeding two hundred and fifty (250) square feet.
1.2 PRIVATE RESIDENTIAL SWIMMING POOL, any swimming pool intended to be used by the occupants of a one-family or two-family dwelling and constructed on a one-family or two-family residential property.
1.3 ENFORCING OFFICIAL, The Building Inspector or his authorized representative.
1.4 REPAIR, any work that is necessary to restore a pool to compliance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE II
DESIGN REQUIREMENTS
2.1 LOCATION AND FENCING. The pool and its enclosure shall be located in a manner as to prevent any hazard to the public.
2.2 OVERFLOW. The pool and its enclosure shall be designed to prevent overflow of water onto the adjacent property.
2.3 SURFACE DRAINAGE. The pool and its enclosure shall be designed to prevent surface water from draining onto the adjacent property.
2.4 PERMITS. No swimming pool shall be constructed or repaired without a permit issued by the enforcing official.

ARTICLE III
CONSTRUCTION AND EQUIPMENT
3.1 CONSTRUCTION. The pool and its enclosure shall be constructed in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance.
3.2 EQUIPMENT. The pool and its enclosure shall be equipped with the following equipment:
3.2.1 SAFETY. The pool and its enclosure shall be equipped with a safety cover.
3.2.2 FENCING. The pool and its enclosure shall be enclosed by a fence at least four (4) feet high and self-closing.

ARTICLE IV
OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE
4.1 GENERAL. The pool and its enclosure shall be operated and maintained in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance.
4.2 SUPERVISION. The pool and its enclosure shall be supervised by a qualified person.
4.3 DISINFESTATION. The pool and its enclosure shall be disinfested in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE V
REPAIRS
5.1 REPAIRS. Any repairs to the pool or its enclosure shall be made in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance.
5.2 PENALTIES. Any person who violates the provisions of this Ordinance shall be liable to a fine not to exceed fifty dollars.

ARTICLE VI
REPEAL
6.1 REPEAL. Any ordinance that is inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance is hereby repealed.

ARTICLE VII
ENFORCEMENT
7.1 ENFORCEMENT. The enforcing official shall enforce the provisions of this Ordinance.
7.2 COMPLAINTS. Any complaint filed with the enforcing official shall be investigated and reported within ten days.

ARTICLE VIII
SEVERABILITY
8.1 SEVERABILITY. If any part of this Ordinance is held invalid, the remaining provisions shall remain in effect.

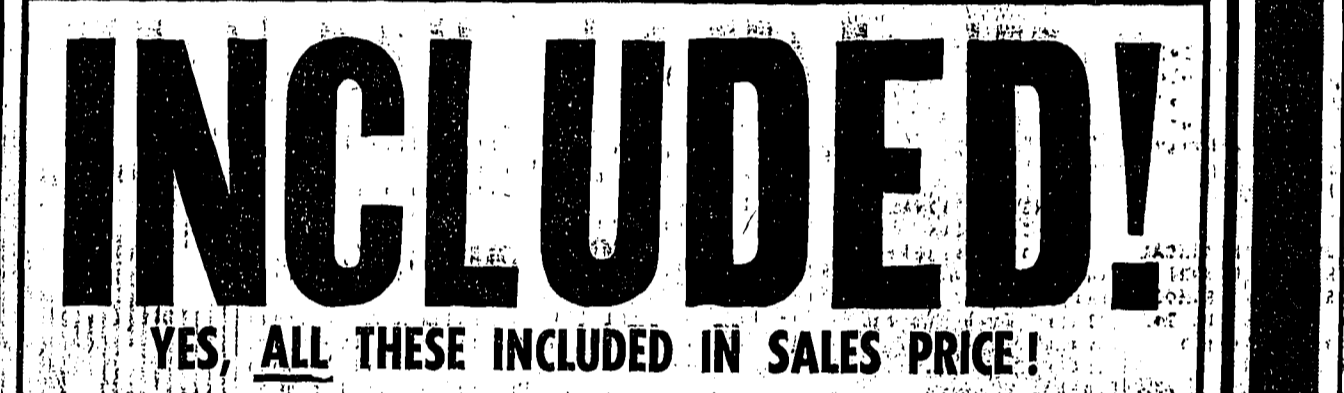

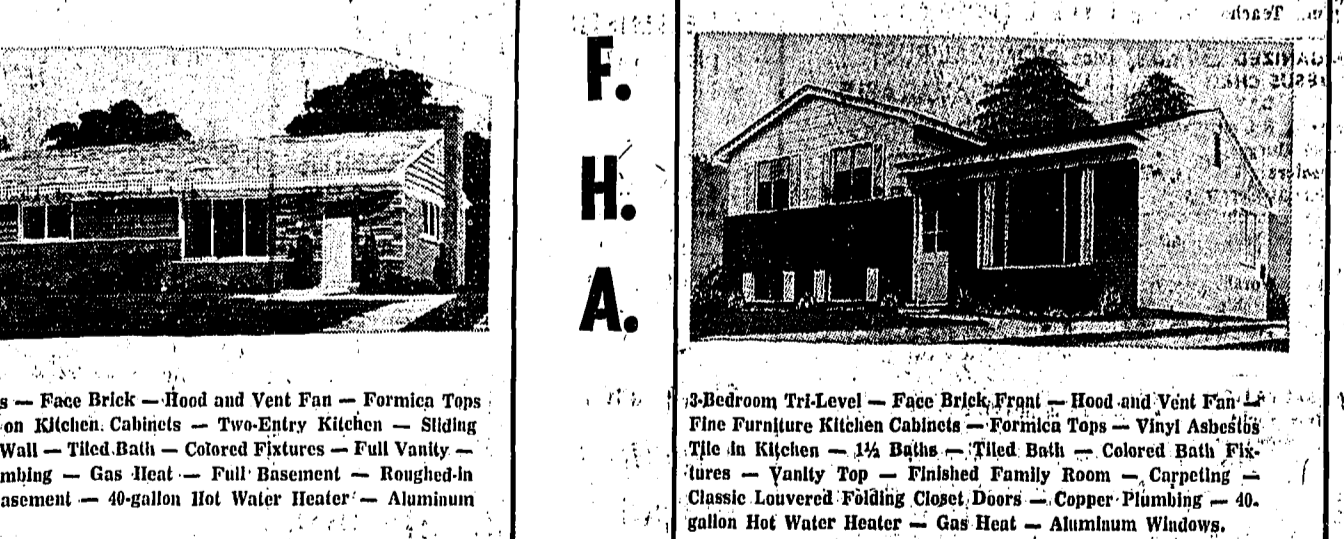

SPEAKING for the Record

Last Wednesday evening Novi township supervisor, Frank Staman, brought a message to the Novi village board that may well be the forerunner to an era of some building the likes of which Novi has never before seen.

Staman had sewers for sale.
More accurately, Oakland county had sewer capacity through the courtesy of Wayne county.

But there's a story behind the story that's interesting and really explains how the prospect of sewers for Novi came about.

The sewer taps made available to Oakland county came from the allocations turned down by various Wayne county communities in the new Wayne county Rouge Valley sewage disposal system.

As most area residents know, building throughout western Wayne county has been halted either by order of the state health department. And until the new sewer project is set to go, the state has refused to lift the ban.

In 14 of the 22 communities involved, it is anticipated that the ban will be lifted this week. They have signed contracts agreeing to buy a certain stipulated number of taps; thus the county can proceed on the Rouge Valley portion of the \$18 million project.

But some of the communities — like Northville township, Livonia and Redford township — did not wish to buy the entire number of taps allocated to them.

Meanwhile, Wayne county must guarantee the full cost of the entire sewer — and to look around for communities that might want a larger allocation.

Wayne county communities were given the first opportunity to buy additional capacity.

Then, according to George R. Bingham, director of the Wayne county department of public works, it became a question of whether to save the additional capacity for communities within the county who cannot now afford to purchase their full allocated share (like Northville township), or to permit Oakland county to purchase taps.

Bingham admitted that there was a split opinion at the county administrative level. Some believed it would be better to save all the capacity for Wayne county; others thought it would be in the interests of inter-county cooperation to give Oakland county at least a portion of the extra capacity.

The latter course was agreed upon — for more reasons than just the sake of cooperation, however.

First of all, most of Novi is the Rouge drainage basin. Therefore, the answer to sewers for Novi had to come from Wayne county.

And secondly, if Wayne county didn't invite Oakland county to purchase capacity in the Rouge Valley disposal system, plans were already underway to construct a sewage treatment plant just north and east of Northville. It would have emptied its treated sewage into the Rouge river. Supervisor Staman had an active role in this plan.

Bingham admitted that Wayne county did not look with favor on the idea of this kind of flowage through its park system.

So Wayne county has offered Oakland county 2000 taps, about enough to serve a population of 10,000. Oakland county in turn has offered the capacity to Novi.

At the same time Wayne county has reserved some of the capacity in the new system so that Northville township for example, can buy more taps if unforeseen development should take place in the next few years and more taps were needed.

It's a fine arrangement all around.

Novi, which has looked forward to the day when it might obtain its own business district, can now gain one essential element needed to attract commercial development — people.

And Wayne county will financial help by selling off some of its extra capacity while reserving taps for its own communities in case of emergency.
