In studying my grandchildren, I would judge that telephone companies also benefit greatly. When I was young, few households had a telephone, and those that did used it largely for emergencies. Today, teenagers are fond of calling a friend some distance away on a rainy day for want of something to do. In fact, I am told that the principal users of the telephone are the teenagers.

Since the newly created interest in science education, school committees are spending more money on textbooks and equipment. This also applies to school buildings and, unfortunately, to competitive school athletic tournaments. Certainly, the large universities have made a great effort in building huge stadiums which put competitive athletics ahead of studies.

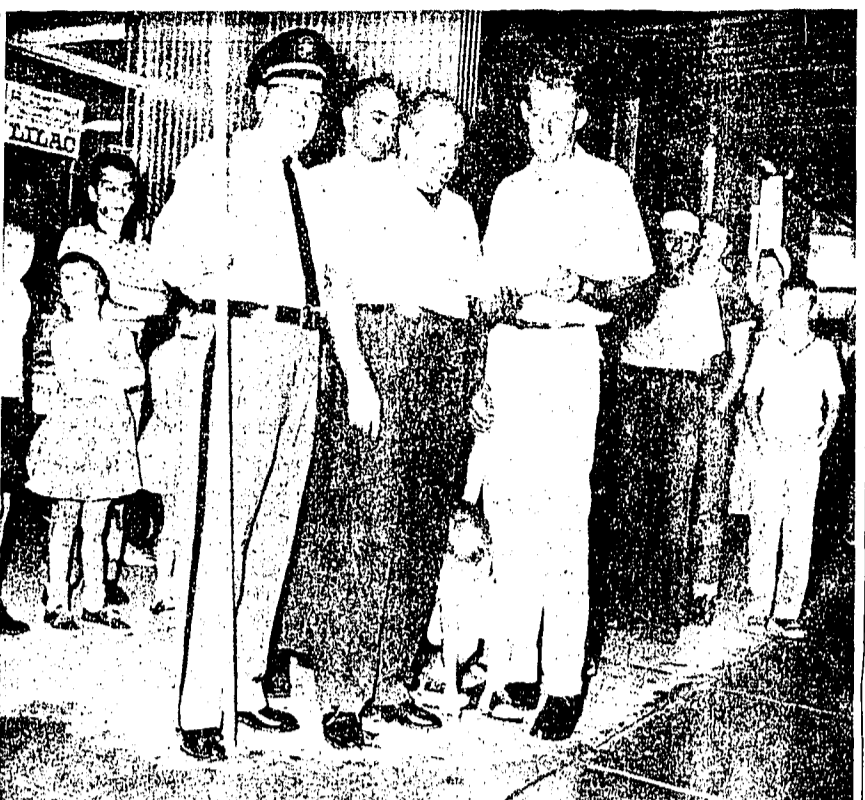

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Council for the City of Northville shall conduct a public hearing at the time and place specified above for the purpose of considering the following amendment to the Zoning Ordinance for the City of Northville.

THE CITY OF NORTHVILLE ORDAINS: That the Zoning Ordinance for the City of Northville shall be amended by adding thereto the following Article:

Article III-B - R-1-H Country Homes District Section 3B.01. USES PERMITTED. In R-1-H Districts, except as provided for in this ordinance, all buildings shall be erected and all land shall be used only for one or more of the following permitted specified uses:

(a) All uses permitted under Section 20.01, except those listed under subparagraph 1 of Article III-A.  
(b) A private stable for the housing of not more than three (3) horses on any lot which has an area of two (2) or more acres.  
(c) The following sections of this proposed Article cover the following matters: Building Height, Lot Area Per Family, Lot Coverage, Front Yard, Side Yards, Residential and Non Residential Use, Yards Abutting Side Streets, Yard Requirements for Accessory Buildings, Rear Yards and Off Street Parking.

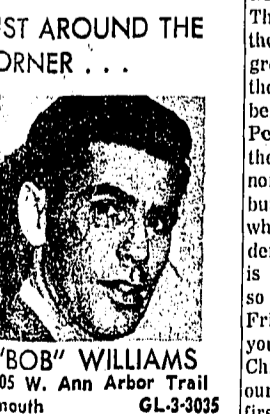

# New Assembly Line Production Takes Over Rail Laying

A two-mile long assembly line, road demonstrated the new assembly technique here. But it brought no automobiles, no washing machines, nor any television sets. Instead, it laid down a serpentine rail and new lyrics for the old familiar score. "I've been working on over a two-mile stretch of track. Machines and men are chiming, all rolling along the assembly line project, requiring more machinery than browned holes, spit splashes and snappers know-how than physical stamina. And it's a job that yesterday took days to complete but only minutes today.



On the old steel rail has been removed, giant cranes lift the serpentine seamless rail in place. When it is in place and after the assembly line fastens it securely, a small crew of welders moved up to fuse together the rail ends. This special welding process, an invention of a Frenchman, eliminates the long and hot satisfactory method of welding with torches. First a mold of Tennessee sand is placed over the ends, then the mold and the rail ends are pre-heated to a very high temperature for 15 to 17 minutes. Once heated, a small bucket-like apparatus containing powdered metal is moved over the mold. A torch ignites the powdered metal, a mixture called L'Aluminothermique, and in just a few seconds the entire mixture is a molten metal. The liquid metal then drains out of the hole of the "bucket" and into the mold, fusing the rail ends together. The mold, slag and excess metal is then chipped away and the seam is then ground smooth. Although seamless rail has been used by some railroads for several years, it nevertheless is a relatively new process which greatly lengthens the life of rail. According to railroad officials, seamless rail eliminates the "bucket".

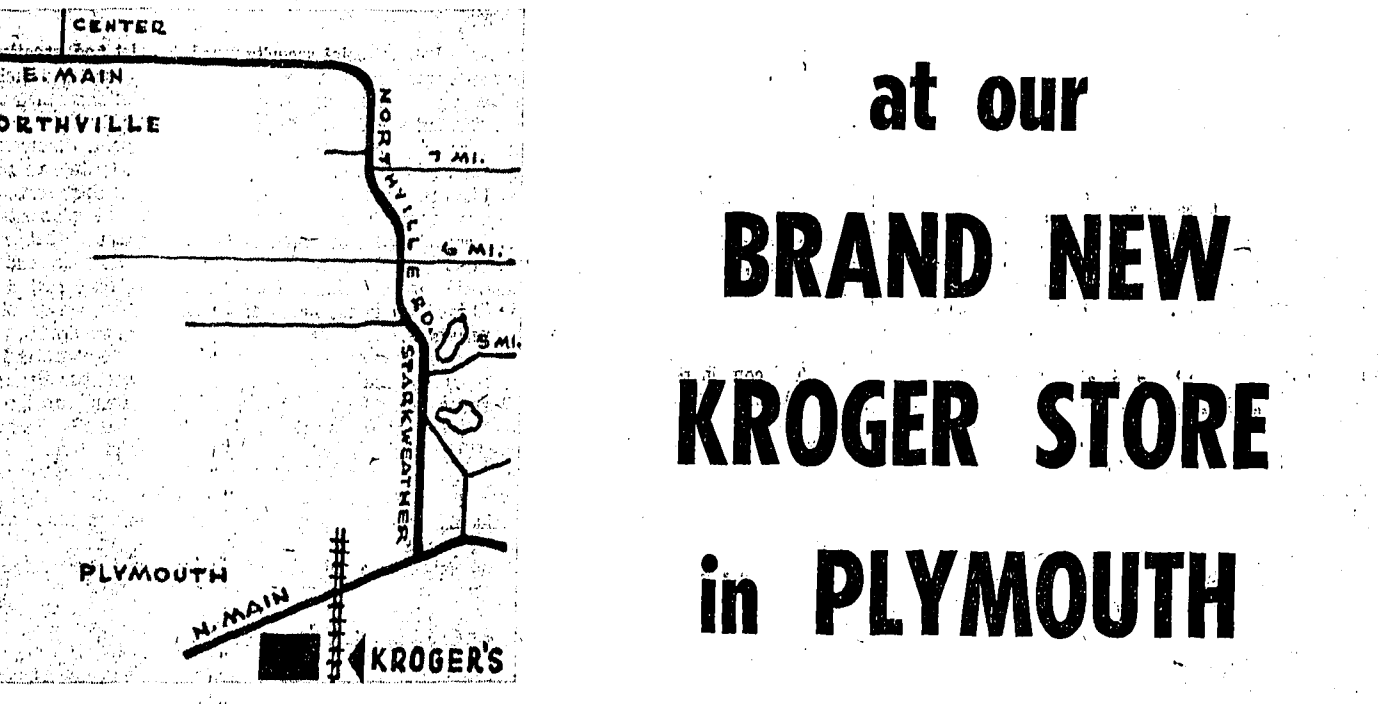
