Paving, curb and gutter would cost about \$210 to the owner of an 80 foot lot. Where concrete is required (instead of as phalt) the cost would be about \$300 per 80-foot lot.

These assessments may be paid over a 10-year period. One might argue forever the equities and inequities of assessments in Northville. What seems most important is that we move ahead with




