

In the enforcement of this Ordinance a ticket or notice may be given to any person or persons violating the provide sions of this Ordinance in the same manner as for the violation of the motor vehicle law, and if said notice or ticket is not complied with by payment of the venalty provided by the City Council a complaint and warrant shall issue: provided, however, in the case of violation of Section 1 of this Ordinance said notice on ticket needs not be served upon the person or persons in actual operation of said engine or train but in lieu thereof may be served upon the train master of local agent of said reliroad corporation.
