
Nearing the end of his first year in the profession, the 23-year-old teacher has found it very much to his liking. "Teaching isn't what I expected," Soule says. Quite naturally, his subject was the metropolitan govern ment and what it has accomplished for Toronto. Fully realizing the controversy and political complications

that surround such a program, I still came away from the meeting feeling convinced that eventually some form of this olan is inevitable for metropolitan areas such as ours. (I can't of course, speak for the city manager or township supervisor, who were non-committal.)

The key to the Toronto plan, it seems to me, rests with the fact that it does not remove the individual identity of the suburban community.

Instead, it is somewhat like a group of neighbors pooling their resources to solve a common problem with a minimum of needless duplication and expense. At any rate, this is how Gardiner, who has directed the program since its beginning in 1955, described Toronto's met-


