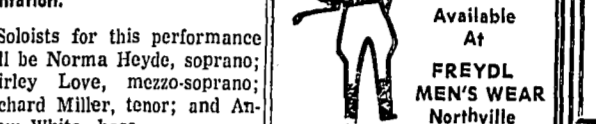

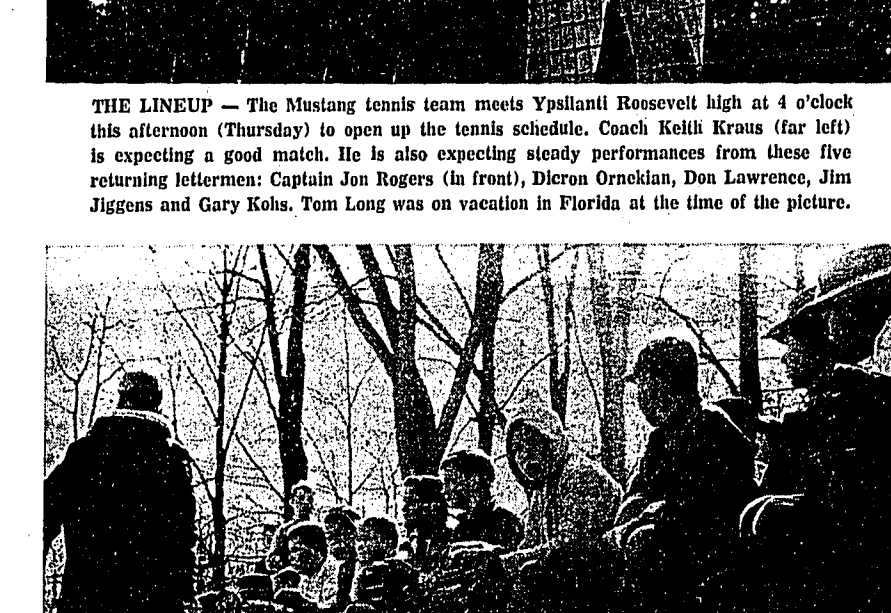

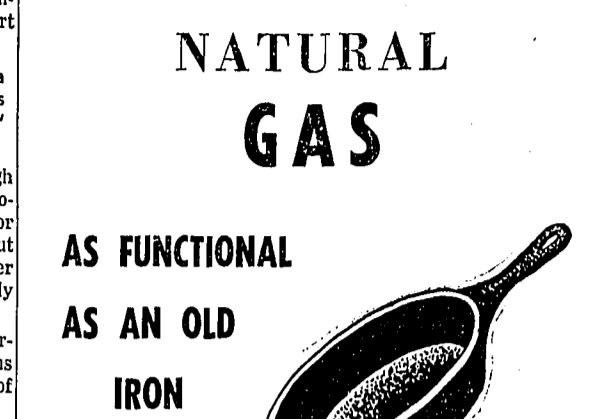
State Can't Buy Hastily

The state of Michigan as an employer often seems to drag its feet when it is merely choosing its path carefully. A case in point is provided by group insurance programs both life and health protection which Michigan recently decided to adopt. Barring hitches the plan will go into effect with the start of the 1961-62 fiscal year July 1.

The problems and pitfalls have been enormous, however, and they may not be over yet. A mistake by Civil Service would be even worse than one in private business. Industry cannot afford too many mistakes, of course, but there are too many enemies of government employment policies to permit a single serious blunder without drastic reaction.

The Civil Service Commission looked long and hard at programs in private industry before it authorized an insurance plan for the roughly 30,000 state workers with Michigan paying part of the cost. Authorization came last November. In March, insurance companies were solicited and program terms defined.

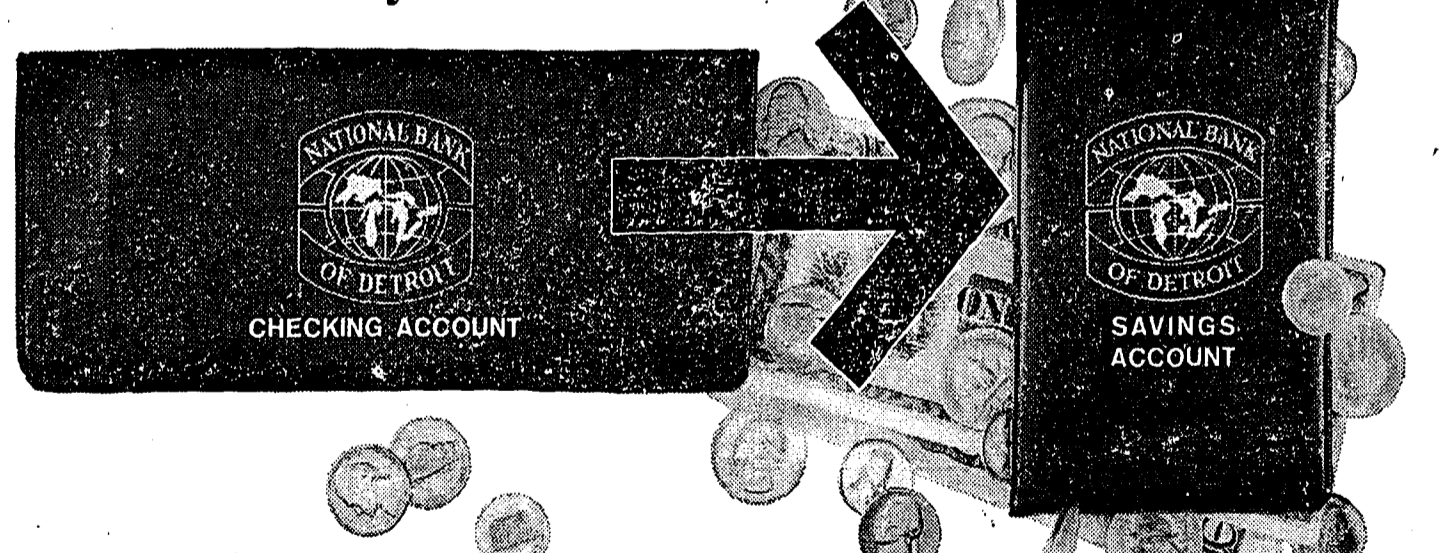
