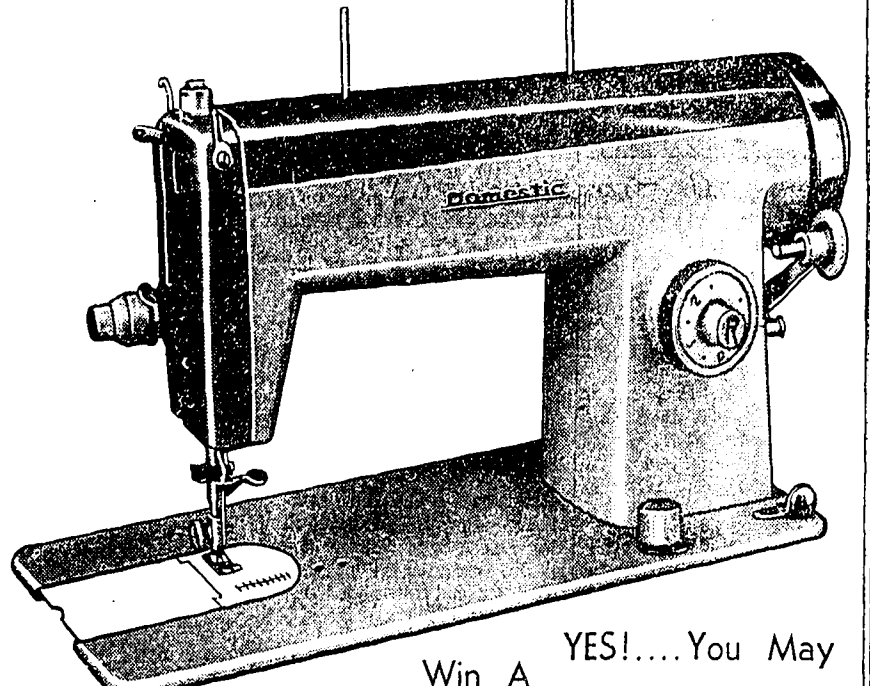

Board Okays Bond Proposal To Pay for New Grid Field

Prospect for installation of lights and bleachers at the high school athletic field in time for the Mustangs' 1962-63 home football opener appeared brighter this week following school board adoption Monday night of a \$45,000 revenue bond resolution to pay for the improvement.

And now comes the wait. Director of Administrative Services E. V. Ellison, who has been working with the school board attorney Robert Thrum, formulate the resolution, point out that before any bonds can be sold the overall plan must be approved by the Municipal Finance Commission in Lansing.

Before this step can be taken, however, Ellison said the law specifies that the election of the school district to issue bonds must appear in full in The Record this week (See Section Two, Page Four).

Progress could possibly be stalled here, he noted, if a substantial (8-10) percent of the electorate registers protest in writing. Should this occur, an affirmative vote in the district would then be required before the school board could seek a commission approval.

Barring this delay, the package will be presented to the commission April 17. Ellison said it customarily takes from three to six weeks to process the request.

It is expected that the bonds - 430 at \$100 each - will be offered for sale sometime early in May. The bonds, which are tax exempt, will bear interest at a rate of 4 1/2 percent.

In the event they are not bought by a bonding company, the purchase is considered unlikely by school officials.

Meanwhile, Ellison said officials are working on specifications for the lights and bleachers. Of the \$45,000 package, \$24,000 has been tentatively assigned for seats and \$17,000 for lights and the remainder earmarked for legal fees and other expenses.

These annual payments are to come from athletic receipts which high school athletic director A. E. Jones said totalled \$8,928 last year.

SPEAKING for the Record

In Michigan there are 54 daily newspapers and 300 weeklies. And each day the desks of these editors are stacked high with envelopes mailed from sources throughout the state and country.

The envelopes contain "news releases." Frequently, however, this is a misnomer and the news is really advertising disguised so that it may be published without charge.
The true news release is often used — perhaps even expanded upon — if it holds any interest for local readers. The publicity copy usually finds its way into the circular file.

All told, however, there must be literally tons of mail thrown away daily that has little more than a glance before being deposited in the basket.

It seems a shame when you think of the thousands of copy writers trying desperately to come up with an "angle" so that their "news" will be published.
Some of it, of course, is mere trivia. But without it you'd never know who was the sponsor of the 1962 contest (then, too, you miss that attractive picture). And you would never know what your legislator was doing — or what his political opposite was not doing.

Many items are definitely interesting—and important—but may be classified as "not local" by a busy editor or simply ignored because he already has more news than he can possibly publish that particular day.

To provide the reader with an idea of the variety of such material, and to give some recognition to the hundreds of copy writers, we have taken excerpts from a portion of the releases received in a single day. They tell us that...

THE FORTHCOMING Detroit Autorama Show sent an attractive young girl to her family's attic to look for an object for her "Attire Treasure" (picture shows the 22-year-old beauty with an old trunk) ... the Michigan Potato Industry Council announces that the initial competition for violent acts of crop and economic importance ...
