

# SPEAKING for the Record

Officially, the Novi board of education has voted to place a five mill increase for operating expenses on the ballot June 23 — just two months after a proposed six-mill increase was soundly defeated.

But unofficially, there's a strong effort underway to change the proposal before it is legally advertised.

Close followers of Novi's school affairs are convinced the five-mill request cannot pass.

They do not argue that the millage is not needed — only that it cannot pass.

Their conclusions are logical.

The board membership is split, 3-2, on the millage proposal with the majority approving a five-mill request, and the minority a 4 1/2-mill request.

And say observers of tax-bill proposals know that the odds these days are against passage even with full school board support.

At a meeting last week a handful of citizens listened to the board discuss its different proposals.

Hope that the "rain side" might come to an agreement failed and the session was finally adjourned.

Who else considers the consequences of another defeat at the polls, it should have little room for argument among those genuinely interested in the welfare of Novi's school system.

If the board is to keep its pledge and adopt a balanced budget for 1962-63, more millage must be granted — or drastic cutbacks detrimental to Novi's educational program must be adopted.

If the board is to win an election, it must present a united front in its appeal to the voters.

It would appear (strictly from a stand-point of basic budget needs) that Novi board members are little more than a noisy splinter.

In a budget of more than \$300,000 they are within \$6,000 of agreement.

And in this proposed balanced budget is \$100,000 earmarked toward paying off the system's \$300,000 back deficit.

Some operational expenditures above board members are even closer to unanimity.

The lowest possible millage request that has been proposed that would reportedly support a school program in keeping with the present level and still provide for payment on the existing debt is 4 1/2 mills.

This would actually represent a two mill increase to voters when some \$85,000 in excess building funds are used toward debt retirement, thus reducing debt millage by 2 1/2 mills.

It is a certainty that the majority cannot gain full support of its five mill proposal.

This compromise of 4 1/2 mills, or agreement at 4 1/2 mills remain for consideration.

At this point concession would appear from defeat in this writer. Quite the contrary. Failure to reach agreement would signal defeat and there a system already planned by problems into pure chaos.
