They Don't Laugh At Fish Rig Now

EDITOR'S NOTE — The following article appeared in last week's South Lyon Herald. It concerns South Lyon High School Band Director Frank Kochalko and his amazing success at fishing since his adoption of a new "gimmick." We think that anyone who has ever felt the tug of a fish on a line will thrill at this "fisherman's tale".

EDITOR'S NOTE: Number two in a series of reports covering highlights of changes in the proposed new Constitution. Summaries of each Article will appear in subsequent weeks.

CON-CON DROPPED Spring Elections

Other than judicial, incumbency designation would be limited to cases where there are candidates for the same office with the same or similar surnames.
Another section recognizes that issues and candidates for Congress are the same throughout the country. In addition to the requirement for otherwise qualified voters for the same office to move the Spring Election to November in the odd years, the Legislature could let former Michigan residents vote in a new state in which they are not eligible to vote in their new state of residence.
As in the old Constitution, when it comes to voting on the initiative or referendum, only persons having property assessed for taxation, or their spouses, may vote, but there is added a provision that the same qualifications shall apply to those who vote for increased mileage for more than a five-year term. When the question is on an increase in mileage for less than five years, any qualified elector may vote, as at present.
Existing initiative and referendum guarantees are retained but delegates deleted language considered statutory in nature. The provision was greatly amended by moving it to this Article from the Legislative Branch Article.
A new section permits, but does not require, the Legislature to exclude from voting two groups felt to be undesirable: Those who are in prison and jail or prison inmates.
Local canvassing boards are prohibited from having a majority of its membership from the same political party. A provision which now applies only to the state board of canvassers is language prohibiting candidates for an office to be canvassed from serving on canvassing boards.
The provision for recall remains as in the old Constitution. It retains the machinery for recalling nonjudicial elected officials through petitions signed by 25 per cent of the electors voting for governor in the official's district. Stating that reasons for a recall are political prevents the courts from setting aside a recall.
The many provisions of the old Constitution about gaining or losing residence for voting purposes by being in the military service, attending college, and so forth, are deleted from the new document and left for the Legislature to regulate. The provision that an elector, except for treason, felony, or breach of the peace, shall be privileged from arrest in going to and from an election, is omitted. It applies only to civil arrest anyway and the thinking is that it was not of sufficient importance to put in the Constitution.
