Main street in Northville may soon get a new look one designed to entice more shoppers by means of easier parking and improved traffic flow, The idea was conceived by Earl Wineman, new president of the Retail Merchants association and owner of E-Jay Lumber Mart. And it follows in principle very closely the long-range master plan currently being prepared by Northville's planning commission

So when he unveiled a drawing of the idea to planners recently, it met with general acceptance and a proposal to the commission planning consultant to study the plan and suggest any needed refinements. Then planners will ask the city council to approve it on a trial basis. Wineman proposes to make Main street traffic between Hutton and Center one-way - west only. Angle parking on both sides of Main street would

then be permitted. He also proposes to remove street park-Traffic would be directed eastward through the "parking alley" between South Center street and the Presbyterian church. Thus access to Main street in the single block "oneway" area would be gained either off Hutton, the parking

alley or via West Main street. The planners thought the idea was "not inconsistent with their own master plan (soon to be announced after many months of study) and could serve as a "first step" Some concern was expressed at the reversal of the 'narking alley" traffic because of the difficult entrance from South Center street — and it's possible this might be

There are, too, sharp differences of opinion concerning removal of parking meters from the streets. The city manager has recently proposed removal of all meters from parking lots, including the "parking alley", He would prefer to replace the present automatic meters on the streets with easier-to-maintain manual meters nd then embark upon a program of strict enforcement. His theory is that multi-hour or all day parkers could e permitted to use lots, while the shopper in a hurry could use the street parking. And meters properly enforced and in working order discourage long use of parking spaces thereby providing available parking at all times for the

Right on the heels of these efforts to improve shopping conditions locally has come the proposal by the city rouncil to bay the Main street lot across from the theatre for municipal parking. This lot already receives heavy parking, although it is privately owned. And we agree with the council that it is imperative that it should be maintained, at least until an opportunity for desirable commercial use is found. The encouraging point for all businessmen to note is that something is being done; Wineman's enthusiastic approach to introduce a new idea and the efforts by city officials should be bailed by all tocal businessmen.


