

Then came the enforcement and a rash of tickets followed by a near equal number of complaints. It's also noteworthy that many residents along Fairrook, Randolph and other well-traveled streets have acknowledged the change. They think life and limb are Dear Dr. Mudd:

It would appear that police have followed a moderate route in bringing about enforcement of speed laws. In addition to the step-by-step introduction of the timing system as noted above, they have been instructed to issue tickers only when speed limits are exceeded by 10 m.p.h. and to move on to another area of the city after issuing a ticket to avoid the impression of creating a "speed trap". It has been stated that police catch the "innocent violator" - one who slips momentarily and exceeds the limit - and permit the flagrant speeder to get away. We're not after the businessman returning home from work — we want the real speeder," these critics argue. The trouble is the radar cannot distinguish between the "innocent and the guilty". It only registers speed. And in this dangerous business — where lives rather than dollars are concerned — this is as it should be. In many instances it remains for the officer to judge when circumstances dictate a warning rather than a ticket. But these are rare — and can result in sensitive problems. The only true solution lies with the motorist himself and his alertness to the law. This is his responsibility - a set of double standards for enforcement is simply







