"The last time we conducted a fund drive to build a scout building in Northville we shot the editor of The Record," a man was telling me the other day.

He's probably one of the best known residents of our area. But chances are many people think of racing when they think of Orlow. He's vice president and general manager of Wolverine Harness Raceway and well-known as one of the most successful operators in this business. But old time Northville residents think of kids and

boy scouts when Orlow's name is mentioned. Three decades ago (that makes Orlow sound ancient, but when you add it up it's only 30 years) he devoted every spare moment to activities for youngsters of the community. He was scoutmaster and recreation director all wrapped up into one - and he did it free because this is what Orlow enjoyed.

I was talking to Orlow about the current scout-recreation building, fund drive, trying to find out how the original structure at Hutton and Dunlap was financed. That's when he came up with the very un-funny re-






