There are currently 2,500,000 civilian employees on the federal payroll, who I estimate received \$15 billion during 1962.

This is included in the total \$30-billion salary and wage portion of the personal income figure. Also, during the year, their savings accounts were being increased and their debts were being decreased.

But what about those who would oppose the possibility on the basis that they want something they believe to be better, when they know full well it is impossible to attain?

This, too, is obstructionism of a far more refined degree.

But as a clincher, it must surely be realized that it is so desperately needed that it is a tragedy that a new government must take on as its first assignment a fight with his administrative board and many (but not all) of the leaders of the opposing party.

It could kill hopes for harmony before the first note is sung.

But to live the battle for the constitution would be far too high a price to pay for harmony.

Therefore, George Romney announced Saturday noon to the press that "my coat is off," my sleeves are rolled up, the campaign is on.

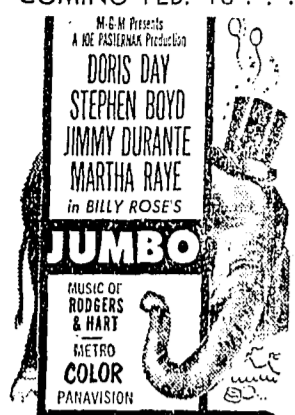

Alert Police Solve Theft

Prompt action by Northville police led to the solution of a \$800 theft at the Northville home of Dennis Johnston, 18, 2135 Lanes within hours after the W. Main street, an employee of breaking and entering was re-living the bowling alley, who in turn, implicated a roommate, John Molands, 22. Police believe Molands is somewhere in Kentucky.

Police received a phone call at 10:30 a.m. Thursday from Angelo Gadioli, proprietor of the Northville Lanes. He reported that someone had come through the sky light and then had crashed through the ceiling into the bowling alley. The thief had stolen approximately \$800 from the safe and the concession machines, Gadioli said.

Proceeding on the assumption that the thief knew the layout of the alley, police went to Johnston's apartment. There, they noticed evidence which identified the thief as John Johnston, Robert Larson, 19, to the station for questioning.

Within a few hours, Johnston confessed that he stole the money, along with Molands. Johnston had \$85 in his pocket, police said. Some \$25 was found by police at the apartment in the insulation of the refrigerator door.

Police said that Larson, although he knew about the robbery, had not participated. They released him.

Johnston later implicated Molands. According to police, Johnston admitted that he had opened the safe with tools taken from the rear of the bowling alley while Molands emptied the concession machines.

Johnston, who was released on \$500 bond, will appear next examination February 11 in justice court. He is charged with breaking and entering at night.

Investigating officers were Sergeant Andrew Cain and Trooperman Peter Pletch.

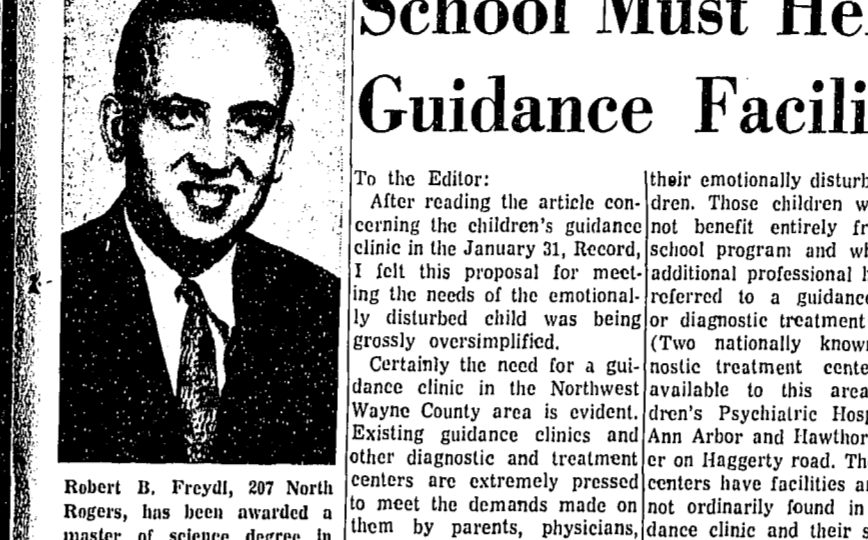

You won't find La-Bo-Co and Ply-Nor listed on the "big board" of the New York Stock Exchange, but these companies are not without stockholders who watch company fortunes with more than casual interest.

They're just two of the 10 Junior Achievement companies that meet weekly at the JA center in Plymouth.

And fully half of the 200 participants in the program are from the Northville-Novato area. The youngsters, both boys and girls, are between the ages of 15 and 19.

Specifically, they are learning the business facts of life. Each company is a miniature profit-making unit performing all the corporate functions from organization and capitalization to selling and liquidation.

And each company has its individual sponsor — an area business or industry which provides three representatives of their firm to serve as advisors to the young business people.

Sponsored by the National Bank of Detroit, the company is chartered, has area investors (no stockholder may purchase more than five shares), and is completely organized with members assigned to purchasing, production and sales positions.

La-Bo-Co is a money-making organization. Its stockholders will realize a profit on their investment.

Ply-Nor is another success story — perhaps the biggest. Sponsored by the Ford Motor company, it has already grossed some \$1,700 on the sale of outdoor thermometers selling at a price of \$1.98 each.

Junior Achievers learn the art of doing business from beginning to end — from creation of an idea for a product and accumulating capital to production and final sale of the product. They're a combination of labor and management all wrapped up into one.

Consequently, JA promoters point out that the "profits" of Junior Achievement go far beyond financial returns — although each company must succeed financially.

The youngsters also learn to appreciate the complex problems of business and while achieving the personal satisfaction that comes from individual creativity and initiative.
