# from the PASTOR'S STUDY

In the denomination returned to London he was ready for a religious experience in depth. John Wesley's second natal day was approaching. We read his prophetic words: "I think it was about this morning that I opened my eyes to the things of God. There are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises, even that ye should be partakers of the divine nature" (2 Pet. 1:3). Just as I went out I opened it again on these words, "Thou art not far from the kingdom of God." In the afternoon I was asked to go to St. Paul's. The anthem was the 130th Psalm.

"In the evening I went very unwillingly to a society in Aldersgate Street, where one was reading Luther's preface to the Epistle to the Romans. About a quarter before nine, while he was reading I felt a strange warmth, I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone, for salvation; and an assurance that he had taken away my sins, even mine, and saved me from the law of sin and death."

For the remainder of his life Wesley preached a gospel of salvation by faith in Christ alone, and his social righteousness. He traveled tirelessly by horseback in England, Scotland, Ireland, and Wales. A people called Methodist came into being and the Methodist Church became organized in the new United States and in old England.

Richard Watson, Gilder, American poet, writing lines on John Wesley said that the "mightiest miracle of all" was "Creating God again in human hearts."

Let not that image fade. Ever, O God, from out the minds of men, Of him, thy messenger and saintless priest, In a brave, sudden and un-faithful thing, Early and late, o'er land and sea, on driv'n, In youth, in eager manhood age extreme, Driven on, forever, back and forth the world, By that divine, omnipotent desire.

"The hunger and the passion for man's soul!" When Wesley died in 1791 in his 87th year his last words were "the best of all is God in with us," and in his dying gasp he was only able to utter: "I'll praise Thee, my Maker while I've breath, And when my voice is lost in death, Thy praise shall employ my nobler powers; My days of praise shall never be past, While life and thought, and being last, Or immortality endure." The Christian religion has been advisedly, earnestly, and bravely kept by this one man whom God used powerfully.
