Kathleen M. Regan may have not known she was making history when she became the first single parent to legally adopt children in Michigan, in 1969.

Her family says she likely didn't care; she just wanted children.

"She didn't have any children, and she wanted some of her own. She wasn't sure if she was going to marry or not, so she decided to adopt. I don't think she realized she was making history," said her daughter, Katie Regan.

Ms. Regan, a Huron Valley Schools teacher for 34 years, did make history and went on to adopt another child. Her companion at the time, Helen Collar, also adopted three children, and the two women raised a family of five children together.

Ms. Regan died Sunday after a long battle with multiple myeloma. She was 58. A resident of Highland Township since 1964, Ms. Regan was a 1960 graduate of Wayne State University. She taught at Brooks and Duck Lake elementary schools and Highland Middle School until she retired in 1995.

Her daughter described her as a strict teacher who demanded her students achieve their best. "She brought out the best in

students," Katie Regan said.

Ms. Regan was an active mem-

ber of the Michigan Education Association, serving on its board and that of the Huron Valley. Education Association, where she was a negotiator.

Ms. Regan was an active volunteer in the community with

Hi-White Athletic Association, where she was a softball coach for many years. She also was active in the Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts and the Highland United Methodist Church.
