Mrs. Helen (Lomerson) Reppert Rider passed away in Alameda, California October 10, at the age of 84, following a two year illness.

Born in Detroit, the second of seven children of John H. and Eva (Hummer) Lomerson, she was a graduate of Orion High School.

Mrs. Rider worked in the office of Oakland Motor Car Co., and was several years employed in the office of Pontiac State Hospital. In 1924 she married Harry W. Reppert of Reading, Pa., who preceded her in death in 1957.

She was a member of the Methodist Church, the Orion Eastern Star, the D.A.R., and was active in West Virginia politics, where she resided for 25 years.

She was a fraternity house mother for five years at Davis-Elkins College, and was employed by the State of West Virginia Dept. of Social Services.

Mrs. Rider is survived by one daughter, Alison Franklin and her husband Ed of Godalming, England, one son Harry W. Reppert and his wife Linda, and three grandchildren, all of Alameda, Ca. One daughter, Constance preceded her in death in 1957.

Mrs. Rider married Mr. Reed Rider of Imlay City in 1976, who also survives her, as well as one sister, Hazel Demberger formerly of Oxford, and one brother, Gene Lomerson of Lapeer. One sister, Esther Reed, and three brothers Sol Lomerson, Elmer Lomerson, and J. M. Lomerson, preceded her in death.

Burial will be at Eastlawn Cemetery in Lake Orion, following cremation.
