The Home Economics Club is a club for girls who are taking, or have had Home Economics for a year. Membership is limited to 30 girls and is affiliated with both the state and national organizations.


The objectives of the club are to foster the interest of Home Economics and improve ourselves; to prepare and do things for the school and community.
