In the coming weeks we'll be hearing a great deal about Governor William Milliken's "land use and development act".

We should not be surprised either by the act itself or the furor that is certain to surround it.

Hopefully, local planners will reserve their opinions and resist any temptation (or exhortation) to oppose the package until its contents are fully understood and finally

Undoubtedly, the strongest opposition to the proposed legislation will arise from the charge that local authority will be usurped and broad 'uniformity' imposed in the areas of zoning and planning.

It's also possible that some overlapping in planning will be eliminated, thereby reducing somewhat the lucrative opportunities that have prevailed for so long for planning consultants in so many individual, small communities. This prospect, too, is certain to create opposition.

Broadly, the Governor's land use and development legislation must be viewed in the same light as many other state and federal acts inaction, or abuse, at the local level.

At one time power of property assessments rested in the hands of local authorities. Its abuses are legend. Comparison of assessments between local and nonresident property owners soon made it apparent that county and state authority was necessary to "equalize" assessment practices.

It has been predicted for years that zoning authority would be taken away from local government if it became too restrictive, or if, on the other hand, it were not properly and equally enforced.

And in the area of proper land use, preservation of natural resources, coordinated planning and proper balance the Governor is most concerned and feels a strong responsibility to act.

It is not true that all communities have not planned properly or have abused their authority to establish zoning and create master plans for their areas.

And it is not true that in all instances the state knows what is better for an individual community than do the residents of that com-







Life has died and so has a little piece of Joe Clark of Farmington...the Hillbilly Snapshooter whose pictures have appeared in the magazine for more than 30

"It's a shame, a real shame," exclaimed Joe this week, recalling his association with Life over the years. "I suppose it was inevitable but it's sad just the same. For many of us in the profession it was the greatest national showpiece for photo journalism."

Joe should know.

It was Life that catapulted the Tennessee hillbilly to photographic fame in 1940. Since then more than 300 of his photographs have appeared in the magazine that this week ceases publication.

Guest speaker at various times in our communities, Clark was a janitor-watchman with Hudson's downtown store when pictures he had snapped with a second-hand Rolliflex first attracted the attention of Life's photo editor.

explained, "and decided a good photo exercise would be to see how many different kinds of pictures I could get of the exterior of the store. I figured 10 shots would do it, but I ended up with more than 100."

"I'd just gotten the camera awhile before," he

Hudson placed the pictures on display at the store and the Life editor saw them. Introduced, he asked Joe why he had never submitted his material to his

"I thought he was joking," said Joe. "I just couldn't believe they'd want pictures taken by an amateur just getting started...a hillbilly amateur at that. He asked f I had any others and I told him I'd taken some of a mountain funeral in my hometown in eastern Tennessee but that they hadn't been processed yet and probably wouldn't be any good anyway because it had been raining when I shot them."

The idea of a mountain funeral in the rain excited the Life editor and he insisted Joe submit them for

Joe forgot about the request until a few weeks later when he was contacted by Life and admonished for not sending the pictures. Reluctantly, the Hudson watchman sent them in and Life, to Joe's surprise, said they were great, promptly published them, and urged him to send other pictures.

"Life changed my life completely," said Joe.

Within a few years he was a professional, making his living in photography. By 1944 he operated his own studio. His pictures have been published in every major publication in the United States.

But of all his work, the association with Life has been the most rewarding. "You couldn't work for

The week is an anti-smoking promotion period designed to dissuade as many cigaret smokers as possible from their habit. Despite the thousands of persons who have quit cigarettes in Michigan, figures show more cigarets than ever are being smoked here.

John A. Doherty, executive vice president of the council, notes that a pack of cigarettes and a lottery ticket are both about the same price now-50 cents. So, he says, Michigan now has two lotteries.

The first is the state operated one and it might win the participant as much as \$1 million if he or she is lucky. The second one is smoking and it can lead to cancer, emphysema or chronic bronchitis. You take your chances.

"THE AMERICAN Cancer Society reports an all-time high of 75,000 lung cancer deaths in 1971,' Doherty says. "The U.S. Public Health Service indicates that if it were not for cigaret smoking, practically none of the earlier deaths from lung cancer would have occurred. Neither would a substantial portion of the earlier deaths from chronic bronchitis, emphysema, and of cardiovascular

To localize the statistics, it is estimated there were 1,139 deaths from emphysema in 1971 in Michigan, four times as many as there were in 1961.

Doherty says he'd like to see the state cigaret tax go much higher. Not only would that increase state taxes, he says, but "more importantly, many Michigan smokers will decide to quit smoking or cut down substantially on the number of cigarettes they inhale daily.'

# Compass Won't Work

"Behold, the days are coming, says the Lord, when I will fulfill the promise I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah" Jeremiah 33:14. A few weeks ago I got lost while hunting deer in northern Michigan. Even though I had hunted in that area for the past 20 years, I got lost. Fortunately I had a compass and had long Wouldn't it have been terrible if God had not promised us a ago learned to believe what it told me. After four hours of


walking I returned to familiar surroundings. But compasses do not tell us where people are. If a little boy gets lost in a big department store, a compass will not tell him where his mother is. Only a policememan or someone who really knows his way around can help the little fellow get back to his mother.

Now, of course, you know that all the children of Adam and Eve, all of us, the whole human race, got lost. We did not get lost in the woods; we did not just lose our mother in the store; but we lost our heavenly Father, our best Friend. When Adam and Eve sinned, they got lost, and everyone else got lost with them. Just a compass would not be enough to help us find our heavenly Father again. He knew that we could never find Him without the help of someone who really knows his way around.

When a policeman finds a lost little boy or girl we say the policeman saves the child. He is the child's savior. Well, God knew that His children needed a Savior, too. And because He loves them so much. God promised His children that He would send them a Savior, who would help them find Him and show them the way to heaven. You know that Jesus did come. on Christmas Day so we could find God and not be lost

# Kriewall Sees '73 as Critical Year

'Ten years from now," says Edward Kriewall, Novi's Acting City Manager, "you won't even recognize Novi." "If we get the regional shopping center it will be built, the city will be criss-crossed with

najor expressways, all the mile roads will be paved, Novi and Ten Mile Roads will be fourane highways, and there will be a high-rise office and apartment building in both the Walled Lake and 12 Mile Road area." The groundwork for much of this will be laid in the year ahead.

"What we do in 1973," says Kriewall, "will affect Novi forever. Our destiny will probably be carved in the next couple of years and 1973 s going to be critical.'

The coming year will see the beginning of several new residential and commercial developments. It will hear the decision of the Dayton-Hudson Corporation as to whether Novi will be the site of its regional shopping center - the most important decision that may

ever face Novi, according to Kriewall. And it will see an election in which not only three positions on the city council will open up, but also the position of mayor will be subject to

Kriewall has been city manager since October when he was named to succeed George Athas on a temporary basis. But his relationship with the city goes back several years. He has served as DPW head and as Athas' administrative assistant.

He may not be city manager by the time 1973 is over. The council is currently seeking candidates for the full-time city manager's job. One application they have received is from Kriewall, but so far more than 50 other candidates have filed for the job of leading Novi through the critical period which could see the city become one of the nation's major. growth areas.

Kriewall's comments on the upcoming year and what it has in store follow.

TAXES. There is little doubt, according to Kriewall, that Novi residents will be faced with higher taxes in 1973.

This increase, he feels, will be generated not from an increase in the city's millage rate (6.5 mills), but by an increase in the city's spiralling property values. "Novi is in a dynamic growth situation and

situation will have to take on dynamic changes," he explains. "Because of the growth of the city and the demand of Novi land and Novi housing, the city will find itself in a non-static condition as

far as assessments are concerned for the next It is this constant increase in valuation which will direct Novi taxes in the years

Kriewall also feels that the impact may not be as great on the residential properties as it is on vacant land. "Those properties presently standing vacant," he asserts, "will be subject to a very dynamic increase in land

Rejected is the feeling that Novi will have to raise its millage rate. "It'll be touch and go for awhile, particularly in light of the ever increasing demand from our residents for more and more services," he says.

"There is the hopeful thinking, though, that the growth in valuation could be sufficient to enable us to maintain the present millage for

some period of time." "There is also the feeling," Kriewall admits, "that the 6.5 mills just don't create enough revenue to operate the city." The test should come in the spring and summer when negotiations with the Novi

Police Officers Association begins. Presently, the cost of maintaining the police department comprises approximately 50 percent of the city's overall budget. "In the past we've had to throw a few things
