## Stats indicate drop in crimes

Statistics which show a 25 percent decline in motor vehicle thefts and a 10 percent drop in burglaries are good news, according to Chief Lee BeGole and Captain Richard Faulkner of the Novi Police Depart-

"Those are the two areas which look awfully god," commented Faulkner after reviewing crime statistics through the first nine months of 1988.

The nine-month statistics show a four percent drop in Part I (serious) crimes and a 19 percent increase in Part II (less serious) in-

Part I crimes include homicides, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle thefts and arson. Part II crimes include forgery, fraud, embezzlement, weapons violations, prostitution, gambling, narcotics, liquor law violations, drunk driving and disorderly conduct.


BeGole and Faulkner said they were pleased with the four percent decline in Part I crimes through the first nine months of the year. There were 1.489 incidents in 1987 as compared to 1,426 in 1988.

The largest single category of Part I crimes is "larceny" which showed no change whatsoever from 1987 to 1988. A total of 1,078 larcenies were reported through the first nine months in both years.

A decrease in the number of burglaries and motor vehicle thefts accounted for the four percent drop in Part I incidents. Burglaries fell from 218 last year to 196 this year, while motor vehicle thefts dropped from 160 last year to 120 this year.

BeGole and Faulkner credited the work of the Southwest Oakland Auto Theft Recovery Unit as well as local police officers for the drop in auto thefts. "They've done a good job of cutting into that area, but our offices have contributed as well." said Faulkner. "We've been able to provide them with information that they can follow through on."

## Lower MEAP scores recorded

Michigan Educational Assessment Program (MEAP) scores are slightly lower this year for Novi students, particularly in math, where a decline is seen at all three grade levels tested.

The test results, which were released at a Nov. 17 school board meeting, showed math scores in the fourth, seventh and 10th grades fell by 1.6, 3.3 and 1 percent respectively from last year's scores.

Despite the decline, however, a large majority of students in all three grades still tested in the

highest category for that subject. Another category showing a marked change is reading. Both fourth and seventh graders tested 3.2 and 3 percent lower respectively than last year's students, while 10th graders increased their scores by 2.7 percent over last year.

Board members expressed a wish that students, particularly at the junior high and high school levels, develop better reading skills, after reviewing a breakdown of skills tested in that category. An unusually low number of

students in all grades tested read in their free time, do not request extra reading or talk about reading, according to the results.

A third category, science, showed an increase of 3.5 percent at the fourth-grade level in comparing scores from 1986, as no data is available for 1987. But scores for seventh and 10th graders remained unusually low compared to other subjects tested.

Regarding that decline, Trustee Raymond Byers noted that some of the material which 10th graders are tested on is not actually covered until the 11th grade — a fact which is also true for seventh graders, confirmed Superintendent Dr. Robert

"Do we really want to turn our

science program upside down for the sake of scores?" Byers asked board members, who indicated they were content with the current cur-

This year for the first time a pilot test in health was given to fourth and seventh graders only. A full 93 percent of the 43 fourth graders tested scored in the highest achievement category, but only 67.9 percent of all seventh-graders

made that same level. The MEAP test is administered each year to fourth, seventh and 10th graders in Michigan schools. In

## Fumble ends Novi's football fairy tale

GRAND RAPIDS — Forty-nine Novi players — some of whom found a way to get dirty even on artificial turf - all wore the same blank looks on their faces as they did a heart-tugging retreat from Houseman Field Saturday.

In a steady drizzle, an orderly single-file of players beat a path to the locker room as if something was waiting for them inside - like the fairy tale playoffs hadn't ended after all.

But they had. They ended on a fumble with seconds to play, as the Novi offense tried to pound the ball over from the two yard line for the

The exchange between center Mark Davio, quarterback Ken Hendrian and tailback Scott Wladischkin went awry. The ball popped out - like a watermelon seed does when you squeeze it between thumb and forefinger. It hung in the air, then was gathered in by a Traverse City defensive back, ending the Cinderella story for now.

Four to six feet away - that's how far the Novi Wildcats were from playing for the state title. The final: Traverse City 13, Novi

"Get your heads up - keep 'em up." spectators shouted out through

"We love you. We love Novi," said one mother, reaching into the dejected single-file of players to patone on the back - probably breaking a season long unwritten rule in the process. For once, a public display like this was acceptable between mothers and football players.

"It was a heartbreaker," said spectator Todd McNary. "A real tear-streamer."

"The wrong team won out there today," said Carl Utz. "That was without a doubt the greatest game I've seen in a long, long time."

'We didn't think they would win half the games they did, but this team surprised everyone," said Tom Marcus "This was a Cindarella team if there ever was

About 1,000 Novi fans made the trip west to take in the MHSAA Class A semi-final game, pitting unbeaten Traverse City (11-0) against the 10-1 Wildcats. Novi had earned the right to play in the "final four" by beating Okemos in the opening round of the playoffs and Monroe the week after that.

In each of the games, the Wildcats were viewed as the decided underdogs.

Novi also finished 8-1 during the regular season, beating South Lyon for the outright Kensington Valley Conference (KVC) title.

#### Town Center area slated for study

Town Center expansion plans are likely to get sent back to the drawing board for another long look if they ever make it to the city council chambers, several council

members said this week. After the Novi Planning Commission essentially made no recommendation on the plans last week. city officials are in the process of figuring what to do next. Council members don't hold much hope for the current plans.

The Town Center Steering Committee, a group of council members, planners and local business officials, last week unveiled their recommendations for expanding the Town Center Area at Grand River and Novi Road. The recommendations came after 26 meetings of hashing out minute details.

Those plans called for the addition of five new parcels of property to the Town Center district, basically doubling the size of the area that is supposed to serve as Novi's downtown.

But it got a lukewarm reception last Monday, and an even chillier reception before the planning commission a few days later.

"Basically, I think more work has to be done there," said Mayor Matthew Quinn, who also serves on the Steering Committee. "There needs to be more study, analysis of the financial impact of various proper-

ty uses." The Town Center District currently straddles the four corners of the Novi Road/Grand River intersection, encompassing about 157 acres. The new proposal seeks to scrap a variety of zoning classifications on five other properties in the area, changing them over to the Town Center District classification.

The goal of those rezonings will be to allow for the development of a pedestrian-oriented downtown and shopping area.

In order for that to happen, more residential development has to take place. One of the goals of the Town Center district was to get a mixture of commercial, retail and residential uses all in the same district. But most uses are currently commercial or retail in nature with few plans for future residential expansion in the district.

"I think the possibility certainly exists to attract more residential development in the area," said Council Member Ronald Watson, who also serves as chairman of the Steering Committee. "We don't think it's impossible at all. We haven't abandoned that part of the

## School board clashes with parent

A clash between the president of the Novi Board of Education and a parent at last week's school board meeting has some trustees and residents alike wondering if the board is wrongly using its authority to stifle criticism.

Sally Marchak, a 15-year Novi resident and frequent board critic, was told by Board President Dr. Michael Meyer that her attitude was too "negative" to participate on a text book screening council. That comment was hurled during a verbal exchange producing harsh words and hurt feelings, after which there was much disagreement among board members.

Marchak: 'I am dumbfounded by your comments. I'm sorry you look at me as a negative person - if you only knew me, you would realize that isn't the case.'

The conflict began when Marchak, a parent with three children attending Novi schools, addressed the board to find out why her name was withdrawn from a list of cur-

rent curriculum council members. When pressed by Marchak for an answer. Meyer said the board had removed her name from the list

because her "prior comments have been negative to us." Meyer added candidly: "It's time you heard this from the board.

"Members of this board felt your representation would not be in the best interest of this district," Meyer told Marchak, adding that the board contacted Middle School

Principal Charles Nanas after it was made aware of her presence on the council and asked him to make another selection.

Marchak had been asked by Novi Middle School's Parent Teacher Organization (PTO) to represent it on the council in September, and had already attended one meeting.

A printed list of council members. which was distributed at last week's board meeting, showed Marchak was replaced by another parent, Sherry Watkins.



# Cost oversight irks city officials

Sexual assaults on the rise: Sexual assaults increased in Farmington Hills during the first nine months of 1988. But the statistics are

In 19 of the 28 reported assaults, victims and offenders either knew or were "There's been no increase in what's called street rapes," said Farmington Hills Police Chief William Dwyer. "I see an increase, though, as far as

assaults being reported." Despite the increase in sexual assaults, serious crime in the first nine months of 1988 showed a decline from 1987 levels. There were 2,484 serious crimes in Farmington Hills in the first nine months of 1987, compared to 2,301 for the first nine months of 1988 — a decline of 7.4 percent. Serious crimes include homicide, criminal sexual conduct, robbery, aggravated assault, larceny, motor vehicle theft and arson.

Of the 28 sexual assaults so far this year, 13 of the victims knew their attackers who were friends, baby sitters, mother's boyfriends, acquaintances or co-workers. Nine of the victims were related to their attackers, who were fathers, uncles, brothers, foster fathers or ex-husbands. Nine of the victims did not know their assailants.

Cracks in 1-696 bridges: Reports of cracks on bridges across the portion of I-696 that goes through Southfield have been acknowledged by the Michigan Department of Transportation (M-DOT).



## Drop in crimes reported

The 19 percent increase in Part II crimes can be attributed to two maior areas — vandalism which is up 10 percent and disorderly person complaints which are up 20 percent. There were 373 vandalism incidents through the first nine months of 1987 as compared to 410 this year. Disorderly person complaints rose from 282 in 1987 to 338 this year.

Other increases were recorded in liquor law violations (up more than 100 percent from 33 in 1987 to 81 this year), drunk driving (up 50 percent from 94 in 1987 to 141 in 1988) and fraud (up 31 percent from 83 in 1987 to 109 in '88).

## Novi school board mistreats citizens

The Novi Board of Education and has long prided itself on "running a tight ship" — particularly at school board meetings.

Meetings are pictures of harmony. Typically, they begin with presentation of awards to students and employees, while board members bestow commendations on the recipients and praise on the

There's nothing wrong with that. In fact, it's commendable that the board recognizes achievement in the district. But it also contributes to a tone in which everyone is nice to everyone else . . . and anyone breaking the tone of congeniality is deemed a trouble-maker — someone who is not particularly welcome to attend board meetings, raise criticism or ask tough questions.

Unfortunately, the school board now has gone too far in its efforts to promote harmony and dispel dissent. And nobody is more guilty than Board President Michael Meyer, whose actions at recent board meetings have en reprehensible.

The first incident occurred at the Nov. 7 meeting after board members bad finished interviewing four candidates for a vacancy on the school board. Prior to board consideration of the candidates, Meyer "suggested" that one particular citizen (Kathy Mutch) voluntarily leave the public meeting so board members could discuss the qualifications of the four finalists for the position. To her credit, Mutch remained for the

The second incident occurred at the Nov. 14 board meeting when Sally Marchak, a sometimes critic of the board, asked why her name had been removed from a list of citizens who had been named to serve on a curriculum council at Novi Middle School. Marchak had been nominated for the committee by the school's parent-teacher organization.



Meyer responded by telling Marchak that her attitude was too "negative" to participate on the committee. "Members of this board felt your representation would not be in the best interest of this district," said Meyer, adding that the board had contacted Middle School Principal Charles Nanas after it was made aware of her presence on the council and asked him to make another selec-

We're not sure what the board's objections to Mutch might have been. We suspect the board objects to Marchak because she has been critical of board and administrative actions at

But that's not the issue here. What is at issue is the way the school board in general and Meyer in particular treat residents who attend board meetings and attempt to take an interest in the school district . . . which their taxes support.

The school board, or any public body, for that matter, need not fear criticism. In fact, criticism will make it stronger. Any decision which cannot be logically defended in the face of criticism may well have been a wrong decision. Dissent . . . criticism ... makes the district stronger, not

In light of these two recent incidents, board members need to sit back and ask themselves whether they are undermining the tenets of the democratic process in an apparent effort to stifle dissent

## Get off the phone

There's a new phenomenon in Novi politics. Well, it's not exactly new, but all indications are that the pastime is as popular as ever in city and school board politics.

It appears as if a record number of Novi politicians are "reaching out to touch someone." They're using the phone to work out nasty details of the issues of the day — saving themselves the dread of actually having to debate controversial issues in front of the public and run the risk of coming up with an unknown decision.

Novi City Council meetings are becoming more and more antiseptic by the day. The run through the agenda is well-practiced and, we fear, well-discussed before issues even come up before the council table.

We've also seen blatant examples of the same behavior from the school board in recent months, especially in the handling of the Sally Marchak issue, where a policy to cut out Mar-chak apparently was decided by a couple of phone calls between board

In addition, Novi City Administration has continually reminded council members who have questions on payments or other matters, simply to "give me a call on it tomor-

The practice simply has to stop.

The purpose of open meetings and open forums is to debate the issues of the day and work out a course of action — not simply "rubber stamp" what has already been decided in a patchwork series of members question administration about a topic, it must be shared with the public in forthright and honest fashion — maybe the next week if answers aren't available right then

What's happening now is that a lot of city and school decisions are being made without public discussion of the background, the reasons for why those decisions are being made. People who observe the council and school board on a regular basis probably can recognize some of these complexities. Residents attending a meeting, possibly for the first time,





Let's look at an example. John has an AGI of \$40,000 a year and his unreimbursed medical bills total \$5,000. Since 7.5 percent of his AGI is \$3,000, John can deduct the remainhis taxes as an itemized deduction. How did John come up with \$5,000

unreimbursed medical bills? Many people assume that the only individuals who can take advantage of medical deductions are those who have been seriously ill or hospitalized over the past year. That is not always themselves of a medical deduction simply because they are unaware of what constitutes an eligible medical



"If children overcome their fear of water at a young age, they probably will never have a problem with it," said Northville Swimming Coordinator Cecilia Ginger.

Northville Recreation Supervisor Traci Johnson said the swimming program, which is open to infants and toddlers, attempts to acquaint and make children feel comfortable in the water.

"We emphasize an orientation to water and a basic knowledge of water skills, such as learning to hold your breath underwater and floating techniques," Johnson said.

## Ship early for on time arrival of gifts

Unce you've wrapped all the gifts and set some under the tree, there are bound to be a few that need to be shipped to relatives and friends across the country -or the ocean - before you can settle down


11 Surround gifts with at least two inches of packing material such as Styrofoam pack or bubble wrap.

1) Tape box closed with filament tape, not cellophane or masking tape. (1) Write address clearly on outside of the box, and include inside the box a piece of paper with the address, in case the address on front is obliterated.

Use ZIP codes. [] Some parcel firms have size and weight restrictions - call first for information if you have an especially large or heavy package to ship. Delivery deadlines

☐ Continental United States Postal: Priority Mail for packages takes two days, coast-to-coast. Parcel Post takes seven to 10 days coast-to-coast. Parcel by ground: Six to seven working days, coast-to-coast; one to two days for a local delivery; three to four days for a

regional delivery.
