Schools pilot K-5 drug progra

Having done away with D.A.R.E., the nationally known drug education program aimed at fifth-graders, Clarkston Community Schools will test a new drug awareness curriculum next fall that targets all grades at the elementary level.

program, to be called S.T.A.N.D., is scheduled to be introduced in Clarkston elementary schools next October, and health teachers bringing the plan to the Clarkston district hope students will take hold and run with it.

A new school drug education pilot trict, S.T.A.N.D. will be implemented in grades kindergarten through fifth, said Carla Teare, who helped explain the program to the Clarkston school board Monday night.

The D.A.R.E. program, which cost the district about \$20,000 a year for a police instructor, was dropped by the district in 1997. An interim program, called W.I.S.E., was then put into place in fifth grade health classes only — for

one year. It was a forerunner to S.T.A.N.D. and was never officially adopted to replace D.A.R.E., said David Reschke, assistant superintendent for elementary operations of the state of th elementary operations, during a tele-phone interview this week.

"S.T.A.N.D. is a response to the drop-ping of D.A.R.E. and our desire to try to strengthen the whole K-5 program in terms of healthy decision making," Reschke said.

S.T.A.N.D., an acronym coined by a third grader during a district-wide contest, stands for Students Taking Action Not Drugs. Organizers hope to have a S.T.A.N.D. kickoff assembly the week of Oct. 24-31, the Red Ribbon week set

"We wanted to maintain a highly successful program in grades K-Teare said, adding that it is expected cted to Teare said, adding that it is expected to be taught in an age appropriate fash-ion. erhaps it is a cliché to say so, but there is a light that shines in Beth Fouchey's eyes. It is a bright light that is particularly evident when she smiles. It is one that goes out in rays, in all the directions of life, like that which surrounds

a cloud when the sun passes behind it. The light is especially vivid when she speaks of her boyfriend, Dan, her longing to drive, her dreams of getting married.

If there have been clouds in Beth's time, she does not dwell on them. She much prefers to seek her place in the world.

Beth, 22, was born with Down Syndrome, one of the more common causes of mental retardation.

A 1997 graduate of Clarkston High School, she now participates in the innovative post-high school program available to developmentally-disabled students in the Clarkston school district through age

Led by teacher Linc Smith, it offers recreational, employment and educational — "real life" — opportunities. There is also a similar plan, taught by Tim Sinischo, in place for autistic students in Clarkston. To Beth's parents, Ty and Jane, Smith's program

provides not only opportunity but an extension of their hope. They envision the day she will live in an apartment — and say they have heard of no comparable option in other Michigan schools, though the

Board OKs developer's plan for shopping center

Independence Township may be getting another strip-style convenience shopping

The township's planning ommissioners voted 6-0 Thursday to grant conceptual approval for a shopping center project at the northeast corner of Andersonville and White Lake Road.

The approximately 21,000-square-foot shopping center uld house a maximum of 10 small tenants, said Richard J. Adams, the architect for the project, which is being pro-posed by Waterford-based eveloper R.E. Shell & Associates.

"We don't have any tenants on board yet," Adams said. "The owner's going to be pret-ty fussy about who comes in e center because he wants to maintain a certain image.'

have Tenants who expressed interest in locating in the building include a small deli, a small restaurant and a computer training center, Adams said.



As proposed, the "L-shaped" shopping center would go up in combination with four other buildings, of about 49,000-square-feet, for light industrial use. This portion of the project could house up to four tenants per building, but some of the structures will likely be occupied by only one tenant, Adams said.

The entire project would be located on close to nine acres of land.

"Architecturally, what we have here is something that's going to be a real important asset in our community," said Independence Township Plan-ner Richard Carlisle, commenting on the project.

Adams described the shoping center as commerciallooking with some residential building elements, such as sloping roofs.

"It should be very pleasing to look at when it's done," said Adams

days working part-time at a Century 21 realty office in Waterford Township, attend-ing life skills classes part-time at the Waterford Training Institute, and enjoying movies, dining out and vacationing with her peers, all under the guidance of Smith, who manages the students with two para-professional assistants.



In the past, she has worked at Taco Bell, volunteered at Lighthouse of Clarkston and worked and studied at Oakland Community College. She has also been an eager participant in the Special Olympics, focusing on swimming and gymnastics. A

horseback rider and jazz dancer, Beth was also a photography model for a calendar featuring children with Down Syndrome.

In many ways, Beth's is a remarkable story — due in part to her achievements and in part to her parents' determination and bravery.

They concede that it is not easy to let go of a disabled child, to turn her loose in a sometimes unkind world.

Ty and Jane remember that when she was a child they did not have long-term goals for Beth. Instead, they focused on day-to-day

objectives and gains. "We didn't have any goals," says her moth-er. "We'd like her to be independent. Do the best she can ... I guess our goal is normalization. To live as normal as possible. To have self-worth.

"Every day was a new day, nothing farreaching. What are the steps we've got to get through? That was the plan."

This story is the second of three in a series that looks at disabled adults and the opportunities available for them in the Clarkston area after they graduate. In the 1990s, following on the heels of a mainstreaming effort in the schools, a greater emphasis has been placed on including the disabled in colleges, job sites and social settings — providing a benefit to both the disabled and the general population that has come to more greatly accept them.

Clarkston school district still offering driver's ed, but kids pay

While the Clarkston school district still offers driver's training, students are having to ach into their own pocketbooks in order to take it.

Because the state no longer mandates that public schools offer a driver's training program to students, the district has opted to continue the current program but charge each student \$60 to help cover the costs of six instructors and books.

Districts also had the choices of continuing their current program and paying for it, eliminating it or contracting with a private provider.

Clarkston opted to keep the program in-house and charge a fee because, said assistant prin cipal and driver's education supervisor Jan Meagher, the district offers a program that is cost-effective and has experi-enced staff and equipment, including the high school park-

ing lot/driving range. Bowman Chevrolet Bowman Chevrolet and Hossler Pontiac, two Clarkston-area car dealerships, provide driver's education cars for a low rent, Meagher added.

"Our instructors are certified teachers," Meagher said. "These are our children, and we want to make sure we are taking care of them. If we conduct the driver's training courses within the dis-trict, we can monitor what is going on and how things are being taught.

Dick Claffin, driver education consultant for the Michigan Department of Education, said studies show that driving cours-es taught within the school are usually more successful.

"If they are taught within the district, the public, the board and the administration have a say in how things are taught," Claflin said.

Despite the added cost to students, nearly 350 signed up for the course. This year, 288 stu-dents will participate in one of two sessions, which begin in June and July; an additional 80 had to be placed on a waiting list.

The numbers don't surprise Meagher, who said the district offers the course at a bargain price. "If the students were to go to a private company, they would have to pay around \$300 for a driver's training program, Meagher said. "We're not looking to make any money; we are just concentrating on providing a service to the community."

Cost for the district to operate the driver's education program last year was approximately \$50,000. The state will contribute \$70 per student and requires the district to match that contribution.

According to a survey conduct-ed by the Michigan Department of Education in April, 19 of 439 districts across the state are discontinuing their driver's education program; 184 will continue the program without charging their students and 167 will be charging their students to participate in the program

It was also noted that 82 districts will be charging their stu-dents between \$51-\$100 to participate, while two districts will

charge their students between \$201 and \$250.

Michigan's Graduated Licens ing Law went into effect April 1 to provide students with more road experience under the tutelage of their parents.

The graduated system requires a student to attend driver's education in two segments lasting a minimum of six months each. They must also log 50 hours of driving experience with their parents, who must keep a written log.

The new system also requires 24 hours of classroom time and

six hours of combined road and range driving practice in level one. Level two requires three, two-hour seminars on defensive driving and driver behavioral patterns, including what hapns when drivers are under the influence of alcohol or drugs. A road test is also mandated.

Last year, 22 students in the Clarkston district failed the first segment and nine students failed segment two.

There have been no accidents during driver's training in Clark-ston the past few years, Meagher said

lum. "We're trying to reach a lot of different people and get a lot of people involved," said another nter, Damon Rocho. "Students should have more ownership of the program," said curriculum presenter Nancy Cohen. "We're excited about S.T.A.N.D. because it's going to have continuity from kinder-garten through fifth."

As a part of their plan, the teachers intend to bring older peers into the younger classrooms and use them as positive role models. The logistics of how to transport older students to elementary schools — and whether their teachers would release them for such purposes

were of concern to the presenters, but no board action was taken on that matter.

"Peer education has a positive impact on levels of knowledge," said health teacher Bill Gunther. Gunther said he hopes the program will take advantage of existing groups such as Students Against Drunk Driving, the drama clubs and bands, etc., where positive role models might be found.

"We're still trying to find the best way to select our peers," Gunther said.

During the telephone inter-view, Reschke also said the middle schools and high school would continue to teach drug awareness as an integrated part of their health classes and through grants awarded to Special Servic

In an effort to educate and involve parents, the S.T.A.N.D. program will also have student/parent homework, to be done jointly, and parent/teacher organization outreach workshops

The presenters said they would like to work in cooperation with existing youth organiza-tions such as the Clarkston Community Task Force.

Drug surveys have indicated that Clarkston students abuse substances at a rate higher than the national average.

There was no formal action taken by the board during the presentation.

Weak for arts

On paper, it looked like a big victory for the arts. The Michigan House on June 9 approved, 74-26, a bill amending the Metropolitan Council Act that would allow southeastern Michigan to fund the arts with a half-

mill property tax. But much of the opposition came from Oakland and western Wayne counties, where voters would have to approve any tax.

"Supporters of the arts and other cultural organizations should seek voluntary support from patrons, not impose higher property taxes," objected Rep. Greg Kaza, R-Rochester Hills. "When Proposal A was

approved by the Legislature and voters in 1994," he went on, "one fear that a few of us expressed was that, over time, new property taxes would be enacted that would erode the benefits of the school tax cuts. This could lead to higher property taxes at the county level."

Voting no with him was Penny Crissman, R-Rochester, who also represents Addison Township, Oxford Township, Orion Township, Oxford and Lake Orion.

Tom Middleton, R-Ortonville who also represents Springfield Township, Independence Town-ship and Clarkston, missed the vote - the equivalent of voting no. Lawmakers got "the word" in

favor of a cultural tax during the May 30-31 weekend when they were entertained by the Greater Detroit Chamber of Commerce

Cooks relish flavorful new condiments

he word condiment is a combination of Latin and French, meaning to season or pickle. As defined in the "Chef's Companion 1994," a relish or pickled seasoning is highly aromatic, and accompanies food at the table to stimulate the appetite.

A condiment is added or offered post production. otherwise. its use would be considered an ingredient. I can't imagine life without condiments. Coffee with no cream? Tea without honey? Would it be worth waking up for cereal with no milk? Where condiments have taken cen-

ter stage, and have been experiencing fame and fortune, are those that accompany our summer grilling.

Whether you are smoking fish in your Weber Kettle, tossing a New York Strip on to your high gloss steel turbo barbecue with side burners, or going hibachi style on the beach, it seems all grillers are searching for the same thing – perfect condiments. Thanks to our backyard gourmets,

our ethnically diverse population, and of course us hardworking creative chefs and cooks, the classic condiment of yesteryear is breaking the jar, so to speak.

Mustard

Mustard, often referred to as "the spice of Nations," has been cultivated all over the world for centuries. In many European countries during the 1500-1600s, mustard seeds were considered as valuable as gold. Today, mustard includes some New Age ingredients - apricot, wasabi, champagne, chipolte, honey and onion.

These magnificent mustards are used on upscale deli sandwiches, slathered on fish, poultry and meats before and after grilling, and whisked into sauces and dips.

"Ketching-up"

Ketchup is also catching-up from its origins in China where a pickled fish sauce called ketchup was a popular condiment. The sauce traveled through Asia incorporating new ingredients along the way until it was met by an English sailor who shanghaied it home to spice up the dishes of his homeland.

Colonists in America later added tomatoes. What would Mr. Heinz say today to the flirtatious varieties of ketchup gaining speed such as peach, blueberry, cherry, salsa style, smoky and more. Chefs across the nation are bottling their own brands due to the demand for variety from those who want to add a little zip to an old favorite.

Boy, it sure seems like every time we turn on the news there is another food scare. First there was hamburger contaminated with E. coli, now a new strain of antibiotic resistant salmonella has made its way into chickens.

Strawberries, alfalfa sprouts and apples are just a few examples of the types of produce that have been to harbor contaminants.

Each year, about one in every ten Americans has an illness caused by food. Most of these cases result in sim-ple stomach aches, diarrhea, or the "24 hour flu." Some are more serious, and about 9,000 people die each year because of food borne illness.

But wait, there is no need to fear the food you eat. Americans have the safest food supply in the world. At each step in the food chain, from the farm to your grocery store shelf, there are regula-tions in place to keep food safe. Howev-er, with our global marketplace, we increasingly have available to us foods from countries not so highly regulated. We need to handle food properly, cook it thoroughly, store it safely, and reheat it completely. Thanks to modern technology, and good old-fashioned bleach, keeping food safe is easier than you may think.

How does it happen?

Bacteria are present everywhere around us - on our skin, in the soil, on our animals - so it is normal to have bacteria on our food. However, if food is mishandled, this bacteria can multiply rapidly and cause problems. Bacteria needs time, and the right conditions, to grow. Bacteria love temperatures just about 40°F to around 140°F. This is called the temperature "danger zone." Bacteria can double in number every 20-30 minutes if food is left in the danger zone

growth. This is why fruits are generally considered safe. However, fruits can have other pathogens on their surface, which is why it is important to thor-oughly scrub all fresh fruits before eat-

ing. Dairy products such as yogurt and buttermilk are also acidic, but can still buttermink are also actual, but can stan be unsafe if they become moldy. Meat, fish, poultry, eggs, dried beans and nuts have nutrients to support rapid bacteria growth. It is probably best to

bacteria growth. It is probably best to assume that they, in fact, do contain contaminants, and to treat them carefully. Breads, cereals and grains when dried - are usually safe. Howev er, once hydrated, items like pasta and rice can harbor bacteria. Vegetables, especially cooked vegetables, also contain nutrients that bacteria and molds

need to grow. Oils flavored with raw garlic, ginger or other herbs can support the botulin toxin. Don't make your own flavored oil unless you plan to use it all immediate-

Don't worry, the beans in your pantry, and chicken in your freezer, won't make you sick if you learn how to fight "bac" (bacteria).

Safety guidelines

Clean food starts with clean hands. Wash your hands frequently with soap and water, especially after touching raw meat, fish, poultry or eggs, and before handling any other foods. Be sure to wash the handles on your faucet, refrigerator, and any cabinets that you may have touched with hands that also handled raw meat.

Don't use the same knife or cutting

toxins are stored. Purchase meats, poultry and fish only from reliable markets.

Always buy food in good condition. Avoid produce with cuts or bruises, cans with dents, partially melted ice cream or frozen foods, or other foods

that have packaging that is not intact. Remember F.I.F.O., "First In, First Out." Always rotate your foods and eat the oldest things first. Another adage from the food service business, "When in doubt, throw it out," also makes good food safety sens

Use a food thermometer to determine the doneness of foods. Hamburger should be cooked to a minimal internal temperature of 160°F., pork to 160°F, and poultry to 165°F ground, 180°F whole

Don't thaw food on the kitchen counter, or in the sink. Raw meat drip-pings can contain bacteria that can contaminate any other food to be prepared on the counter. It is best to thaw meat in the refrigerator, tightly wrapped, so drippings won't spill onto shelves or other food.

Never leave perishable food out for more than two hours. Reheat foods thoroughly to at least

165°F.

Freeze or refrigerate leftovers com-pletely. If you are cooling soups, stew, chowder or sauces, transfer them to shallow pans for rapid cooling in the refrigerator. The temperature should drop to 70°F in two hours, and 40°F in another four hours.

Sterilize your kitchen sponges every day in your dishwasher, and change dishcloths and towels daily. You sanitize a wet sponge easily in

Salsa. The price of halibut, one half that of swordfish, was no small consideration. Cost, combined with the requisite meaty texture, makes this fish perfect for grilling. I used Worcestershire sauce to emphasize the meat-like qualities. I prefer not to marinate fish because the acid in the marinade will partly cook the fish flesh before you ever get near the heat. Overcooking is one of the reasons people don't like fish.

Of course, you're familiar with the nutritional virtues of fish. Halibut is one of the lowest fat fishes. This, of course, holds true only when it's not cooked in fat or accompanied by a fat laden sauce such as tartar sauce. You don't need these when you have a really fresh of fish. From sky to earth to a cultural mosaic

In his starched white shirt, wellgroomed politeness and policy wonk speech, Bob Block appears as the prototypical city administrator of a big-city suburb.

But for a moment, he doesn't sound overly bureaucratic. There's no intricate talk about budgets, impending public projects, or how to address governmental ineffi-

He wants to talk about art. Or more accurately, he's interested in interpreting art.

Block, city administrator of Southfield, stands amid the former B'nai David Synagogue on Southfield Road and is quite comfortable discussing the gradation of stained glass that encircles the transformed house of worship inside what is now the Southfield Centre for the Arts.

"It goes from blue to represent the sky to a brown for the earth," said Block, pointing at the mosaic. "The idea is to show the transition heaven to earth.

Transitions have been plentiful for the Southfield Centre for the Arts in its first year.

What began nearly 20 years ago as an utopian idea based on a formal, community-wide survey (known as the Golden Report) to establish an art center became a reality last June with the grand opening celebration, highlighted by a concert by legendary singers. The Platters, and a parade of spe-

During the last year, the art enter has been a multicultural mosaic with a perpetual assortment of fine-art and performingart programs, events, exhibits and concerts.

It has offered venues to a fledgling youth theater company, and musical groups like the Motor City Brass. Recently, an "International Cafe" series was initiated to celebrate the ethnic foods of cultures in Southfield's melting pot of Jews, Chaldeans, eastern Europeans, southern Asians and African Americans

For mainstream appeal, the center brought in big-name star Lou Rawls for a concert in early May.

Next season, the center has developed an extensive classic film series, multicultural music concerts and a series of events for kids, including storytelling, folk singing, puppetry and chil-dren's musicals.

Not surprisingly, the first year of operation at the art center hasn't been an obvious or easy transition.

That's not because of a lack of effort. It's simply a matter of economics, history and what sup-porters like Robert Martin claim comes from being at the cutting edge.

"We think of ourselves as progressive," said Martin, a member of the Southfield Federation of Arts, composed of nearly 80 arts groups from the area. Many of those one-time nomadic groups, according to Martin, hold regular meetings at the art center.

Not since the Macomb Center for Performing Arts opened in 1982 has a major arts center been unveiled in metro Detroit. The Mount Clemens-based facility is exclusively a performing center. Although it rents space, the Macomb Center isn't driven by a need to reach out to local

arts groups. Indeed, when pushed to make comparisons to other art centers, staunch supporters of the Southfield Center for the Arts are at a loss

"We have no benchmark," said James Cristiano, chair of the parks and recreation board, which oversees the budget for

After one year, the Southfield Centre for the Arts is perhaps best described as a work-inprogress with myriad possibilities, and profound challenges. Particularly, the center must further build recognition, increase audiences and attract corporate sponsors and foundation support, said Marlowe

agencies throughout the state, considers the center's prime goal to educate and offer an affordable way for families to enjoy the arts.

"Our focus is on being constructive rather than destruc-tive," she said. "Everything we do in the arts is about encouragement.

In the long-term, said Belanger, that means the center will offer an ever-growing list of art-instruction and cultureappreciation course.

Since the city of Southfield purchased and renovated the property for about \$4 million four years ago, the center has been under intense scrutiny both from artists looking for a home cynics who can't grasp the and relationship between art and governmental services.

An additional \$1 million is expected to be raised through grants to finance subsequent renovations and expanded programming. And, a multi-million pie-in-the-sky plan, entitled the Redstone Proposal - which would add a second story to the center - is at least 10 years away, said Belanger.

Debates about the purpose of the center have ranged from using the 55,000-square-foot facility as a community meeting place to promoting the perfor mance, exhibit and rehearsal space as a symbolic bridge connecting the suburbs with Detroit

"You won't survive if you appeal to only people who live in your area," said Cristiano. "This facility helps bridge Detroit and the suburbs."

While the ongoing physical evolution is quite apparent -

classrooms. kitchens and rehearsal spaces have been reno vated - the city's understaffed division of cultural arts has a hit-or-miss marketing strategy that has left some wondering why the "word hasn't gotten out" about concerts and exhibits.

Perhaps that criticism is unfair considering typical firstyear trial-and-error experies To its credit, Southfield has placed the arts on the same level as other basic city services.

"As our community has matured, we've found that establishing an art center provides for refining the quality of life in Southfield," said city administrator Block.

"Culture in our city existed before (the establishment of the center). But has the center become a cultural meeting place? Undoubtedly, yes.'

Not only have the myriad arts groups responded to the accessibility of rehearsal, exhibit and performance space, but the center is showing signs of becoming self-sufficient

"As we make this facility more available, it'll create greater demand," said Lucius Theus, president of the federation of

But Block, ever the cautious administrator, is compelled to qualify the center's ability to fund itself.

"I'm not so sure we'll be profitmaking," said Block, who estimates that the center might break even in four years.

Renting the center's spacious conference room and classrooms to businesses could provide much-needed additional revenue, said Block.

"We have an evolving plan (for the center)," he said. "We've been careful not to over-promise. We need to make improvements before we start talking about the center as the most outstanding place

Perhaps the most appropriate view of the center, according to Block, is to consider it one of the many ingredients to enhance the quality of life.

Guide to Michigan state parks is must reading for summer

Michigan State Parks: A Com-plete Recreation Guide By Jim DuFresne

(The Mountaineers, \$16.95)

Clarkston outdoor writer Jim DuFresne is the perfect guide for an exploration of Michigan's superb state park system.

DuFresne, who writes regularly for the Booth Newspapers, has hiked, biked, fished and skied the many trails of Michigan's park system. He is an outdoor writer who obviously loves the outdoors

DuFresne's guide to the park system was first issued in 1989. This new, trade paperback second edition takes note of the many changes in the last 11 years including the development of "linear parks

"Michigan State Parks" is not a critical review of the system. It was written with the cooperation of the Department of Natural Resources and is meant to be comprehensive, informative, useful and inviting. DuFresne succeeds on all four counts.

The book is divided by sections of the state - Southeast Michigan, Heartland, Lake Michigan, Lake Huron, Northwest Michi-gan, Straits of Mackinac, Eastern Upper Peninsula, Western Upper Peninsula, DuFresne describes each park, giving a brief history of its development and its outstanding features. He then describes camping, hiking, biking, fishing, winter activities and day-use activities. Each profile includes a map of the park,

directions on access and, often, a black and white photograph

And what wonderful parks they are. Michigan is bles ssed by the Great Lakes, from Huron's rocky shores to the soft white beaches of Lake Michigan to the chilly splendor of Superior. But in addition to the Great Lakes and Lake Michigan's wonderful dunes, the state also has abun-dant woodland, hardwood and pines; rolling hills; waterfalls; large inland lakes and smaller fish ponds; and even, adjacent to one state park, a national music camp.

The foresight of Michigan's people and the generosity of many landowners led to the preservation of these lands as *public* parks. The park system has come under criticism in recent years and some weaken-ing of resolve when it comes to keeping public lands public. But, clearly, the residents of Michigan love their parks, filling many of them to overflowing on weekends. In recent years the state started a new reservation system to handle the demand in a fair and sensible fashion.

The system, administered by the Parks Division of the DNR, consists of state parks, recreation areas, state historic parks and smaller scenic and historic sites. These lands attract almost 25 million visitors a year, of which more than 5 million are campers

DuFresne avoids the political disputes and concentrates on providing a practical and inter-esting guide that should be kept in the glove compartment for quick reference when traveling

through the state

Some parks are regular mag-nets: Warren Dunes is a popular landing spot for Chicago residents seeking relief from the city heat; Mackinac State Park is the more interesting 75 percent of the island where fudgies can go to escape commercialism; Grand Haven is a beautiful beach next to a beautiful Yuppie shopping experience; Mitchell State Park is tucked between two large inland lakes; Burt Lake provides a long, soft sand bottom for family swimming; several parks have great Dunes - Warren, Silver Lake, Ludington and, on Lake Huron, Port Crescent; and Tahquamenon Falls State Park has the third largest falls east of

the Mississippi. As a bicyclist, I have enjoyed The Lakelands and Kal-Haven linear parks, long bicycle trails created from old railroad beds. The other two in the state are Hart-Montague and the new, and longest, White Pine, stretching 92 miles between Grand Rapids and Cadillac. These are wonderful parks for bikers, hikers and equestrians.

DuFresne provides some interesting tidbits: Saugatuck Dunes is built around a prison; Craig Lake is the most remote of the state's parks and a paradise for fishers and canoers; Lake Hudson is the place to go for star gazing; Clear Lake is 100 feet deep and clear; and the best place to find Petoskey stones is not Petoskey State Park but Fisherman's Island State Park.

Can sealants be Sunglasses play role in eye health a helpful option for your child?



mended that my 6 year old get sealants. What are sealants and how do they work?

swer: Sealants are Aone of the most significant developments in tooth decay reduction since the introduction of fluoride into our drinking water and toothpastes. DR. DAVID BANDA Sealants are generally transparent or white-col-

ored materials that are bonded onto the chewing surfaces of adult back teeth (most frequently molars) to help prevent the formation of decay, especially in children.

Children receive their first permanent adult molars at age six. It's very easy for parents to think that these teeth are baby teeth because they are coming in when a child still has his or her baby teeth. Chil-dren, in fact, will have 20 baby teeth in their mouth when their first permanent teeth starts to some in teeth start to come in.

How do sealants work?

At a child's regular cleaning and checkup appointment, the dentist may recom-mend the placement of sealants on certain mend the placement of sealants on certain teeth. The teeth most frequently treated with sealants are generally permanent molars, especially those with deep grooves or fissures (nooks and crannies) on the chewing surfaces.

The more hiding places on the surface of a tooth for bacteria or food to collect, the more likely it is that decay will occur in e areas. Smoother-surfaced teeth are still quite prone to decay but are less likely to trap plaque and food than teeth with oves. Sealants work by preventing **deep grooves**. Sealants work by preventing food and bacteria from gaining access to the **chewing surfaces** of teeth – the area most commonly decayed in children

How are sealants applied?

A dental team member, a dentist, or a hygienist will perform this quick and pain-less procedure. There is no need for anes-thetic since there is no need for drilling. The surface of the tooth to be sealed is cleaned of any debris and then it's treated with a gel to make the surface receptive to bonding with the sealant.

Next, the sealant material is placed in the grooves on the chewing surfaces of the tooth. A special light is often shined on the sealant material to harden it. The entire procedure only takes 20-30 minutes for all four molars. That's all there is to it.

Are there any risks? None. Sealants are extremely non-invasive and safe.

When are sealants placed?

The best time to apply sealants is as soon as adult molars enter the mouth. This occurs for the first time at approximately age six when four molars appear and then again at approximately age 12 when the next set of four molars appear

Sealants may also be recommended for bicuspids, the permanent teeth situated directly in front of the molars. These gener-ally enter the mouth at approximately 10 to 12 years of age. It is important to note that spalants cannot be placed in a tooth that adready needs or has a regular filling in it. Sealants are a preventative method to be utilized before the need for a filling occurs. How long do sealants last?

Sealants will wear down as the child chews food and may require replacement after several years of wear, but they are well worth the investment for protection in hard-to-reach, cavity-prone, nook-and-cranreas of certain te eth.



■ Golf, cycling and various water sports can provide hours of entertainment during the summer. But according to David Bogorad, M.D., wearing sunglasses while participating is essential to preserving eye health.

Wearing sunglasses while playing summer sports is more than just a fashion statement. It is essential to preserving your eye health, according to David Bogorad, M.D., a senior staff ophthalmologist with Henry Ford Health System.

"The sun's ultraviolet (UV) rays can damage the surface layer of cells on the cornea, causing temporary blindness," Dr. Bogorad says. "UV rays also promote cataracts and may be a cause of macular degeneration. Depending on the sport you play, your eyes may require special protection."

Dr. Bogorad offers this advice to protect your eyes during the following activities:

<u>Water Sports</u> The suns rays are intensified when

they reflect off the water's surface. If you are participating in activities on the water such as sailing, jet skiing or fishing, your eyes need extra protec-tion. Polarized lenses with UV protection reduce glare and actually enhance clarity of vision.

Golf

Spending hours on a sunny golf course can lead to eye strain and fatigue. It also exposes your eyes to UV rays that can lead to serious eye problems. Sunglasses are now available specifically for golf. The glasses have a wraparound design to reduce wind and glare, and are rimless so that the field of vision is not obstructed.

The lenses should offer UV protection and typically are neutral gray to maintain a player's depth and color

Cycling Special sportshields have been devel-oped to protect the eyes of serious cyclists. Because cyclists can sustain injuries from gravel and other projec-tile objects, the sportshield is larger than traditional sunglasses and has a polycarbonate lens, which is more impact-resistant. As with all sunglasses, you should purchase sportshields

with UV protection. Whether you are lying on the beach or taking an early evening walk, sun-glasses should be worn to protect your eyes from the sun's damaging rays. For maximum benefit, the following guidelines can be used when selecting sunglass

Sunglasses should be labeled as having ultraviolet protection. Lenses should not be too dark

because you'll be limited to wearing them in only very bright settings.

■ The larger, the better. Wraparound styles provide added pro-

When selecting a tint of lens, color doesn't affect the degree of UV protection. The three most popular tints are green, brown or gray, but your decision should be based on personal prefer-

"Many people prefer green because it makes the outdoor foliage appear more vivid and lush. Brown tends to increase apparent clarity. Gray distorts color visibility the least, providing the most accurate colors," Dr. Bogorad says.

For people who depend on prescrip-tion glasses, photochromatic lenses that darken in direct sunlight - such as Transitions - can be a good way to protect eyes from UV rays, especially for people who don't like switching between regular glasses and sunglasses. Dr. Bogorad warns that sometimes the lenses don't darken well in a car because they aren't exposed to direct sunlight. Some patients also find that the glasses tend not to change quickly enough in warm summer weather.

Weight loss involves leading an active life

Question: I'm a naturally overweight person. I've been watching my food intake closely. I eat foods very low in fat, drink lots of water and exercise about four times per week. I run the treadmill for about 30 minutes each

time. My question is this: What do I do when I seem to be at a point where I can't lose more weight?

Answer: This is really a especially if you say you are "naturally overweight person." Do you like to eat? You may be eating low-fat food - but too much of it. Portion-control can be a factor here.

Your exercise regiment is

program if you've been at it awhile. The key to permanent weight loss is to make your muscles more active so you can burn calories more easily. It works like this: The "fat/sedentary metabolism" shunts a large percentage of calories into its cells after eating, and inactivity will keep the fat cells full of fat. The "thin metabolism" uses calories quite differently, however, burning hundreds of them each day during physical activity.

Part of the fuel used for that activity is stored in the muscle cells and liver. The

active muscles and liver grab and store a larger part of your calories after eating, and these calories never see the inside of your

fat cells Using your lower body muscles properly and often - a treadmill is fine but try to vary your activity – translates into your body becoming a fat-burning machine. After aerobicizing for 30 to 45 minutes, six days a week (some days harder than others), your body keeps right on working internally for several hours afterward, repairing and refueling the muscle tissue you've just used.

Generally, you can burn 20 percent more calories just sitting around after exercise. In fact, you burn the greatest number of calories in any given activity when your metabolic rate is already at a high point. I might also try exercising at a different time. What about a light dinner and healthy run in the evening? Changing times that you workout can also help.

If you burn an extra 50 calories a day, this can mean five pounds a year. My advice is check your food portions, increase exercise to six days a week, change your activity and the time of the day you workout to give yourself more variety.

What is the maximum amount of saturated fat you should cup. Here's the scoop on ice cream fat you should eat in a whole day? The answer might be in your ice cream dish! In fact, you may be eating even more



Little League game or after dinner on weekends. And, of course, there's always that handy Good Humor truck coming around your street corner.

It's hard to pass up these tasty treats on a hot day, but you should be aware of what's in the ice cream before you decide to eat it or to serve it to the kids.

You know it's hard to beat the rich, creamy flavors of Ben & Jerry's or Haagen-Dazs, but you may not realize that just one cup of some of these premium ice creams can have about 40 grams of fat, 20 of which are saturated and that's your maximum allotment for the day!

A word of caution: Read labels carefully! The amounts of calories and fat listed in ice cream and frozen yogurts are based on a half-cup serving. When is the last time you measured exactly w much ice cream you ate?

and frozen yogurt: Most fat-free brands have a calories count in the 200-250

range per cup, but the premium fat-free ice creams and yogurts can be upwards toward 300 calories due to their lower air content.

It makes sense that if you switch to a "no sugar added" variety, you'll save on the calo-ries. It's true that you will cut calories down a bit, but again read labels carefully because sometimes there's not much of a difference

If fat-free is too extreme a change, you might enjoy low-fat ice cream and frozen yogurt instead - just eat less of it. A half-cup of the low-fat varieties is a reasonable amount to splurge on while still keeping a

lid on your saturated fat intake. Most "low-fats" have around three grams of fat per half-cup serving – one-and-a-half to two are saturated – which is roughly 20 percent of a day's worth of fat. That's a manageable amount if you watch what you eat the rest of the day, but it's definitely not something you should eat out of the half-gallon tub in front of the television!

When you see "light" on the container of ice cream or frozen yogurt, don't be fooled. Light usually means it has half of the fat of the regular version, which is probably still high for a healthy diet. There can be still four or five grams of fat per half cup in these light varieties. Choosing light over regular ice cream or frozen yogurt is defi-nitely a better choice, but the best option is a low-fat or fatfree variety. You may want to try sorbet or sherbet the next time you have a craving for a frozen dessert. They will still give you that cool, sweet flavor with very little or no fat in most kinds. It's a refreshing alternative to rich ice cream. If you're at the park and an irresistible ice cream truck happens to cruise your way, your best bet is to probably order a push-up or regular popsicle. Making a habit of daily ice cream desserts is not a good idea. Armed with the facts and clear nutrition labels, we can all enjoy an occasional frozen treat, but moderation is the key. If your usual serving is the size of a tennis ball or smaller. then you're eating no more than a half a cup. Most people indulge more than that and are certainly served more than that at the majority of ice cream parlors. So if you do enjoy an ice cream cone, keep a close eye on how much you eat.

By no means does a frozen dessert with a "fat-free", "low-fat" or "light" label mean you can polish off a pint and hide it from your waistline. Fat or no fat, ice cream, frozen yogurt, sorbet and sherbets are still sugary, caloric desserts, so it's important to make informed decisions.

If you want to enjoy a cool, refreshing, frozen treat try to stick with those that have no more than one gram of saturated fat and no more than two grams of total fat per half cup. Better yet, choose those with no artificial sweeteners and those that are high in calcium and/or vitamin C.

These "healthier" desserts are fairly easy to find if you enjoy fat-free ice cream and frozen yogurt, but you won't find them in regular premium ice cream. A standard full-fat ice cream averages 300-350 calories per cup whereas a premium full-fat

If Infiniti is all about uncompromised luxury, then the QX4 sport utility is the icon that per-

sonifies it. J.D. Power, those folks from California who tell us which wheels offer the best quality and perform the best, rated the QX4 the best compact sport utility on the planet last year in its initial quality study. What's not to like? For about \$40,000, the

QX4 is fully equipped and includes a full leather interior, tasteful wood-tone trim, a Bose AM/FM cassette compact disc audio system, All-Mode four-wheel drive, smartlooking 16-inch alloy wheels, dual power heated outside mirrors, power windows, tilt steering, cruise control, rear 12-volt outlet, liftgate wipers, keyless remote entry with security system ... the list goes on and on.

"The QX4 ... has beaten even our own sales projections," says Tom Eastwood, an Infiniti vice president.

What's on the option list? Power sliding tinted glass sunroof with tilt and sunshade, heated seats and a sport package (\$1,650) that gives you the sunroof, heated seats and limited-slip differential.

I had a problem with the QX4's initial acceleration. The engine sounds powerful enough - a 3.3-liter single overhead cam 12-valve V6 that produces 168 horsepower - but when coming out of my subdivision, I couldn't take the chance that a car was coming. I wasn't certain it could get up to speed in time. In all fairness, however, once the QX4 got really warmed up, passing on the freeway wasn't a stretch. It was able to get up to speed and pass a car going 70 mph with ease. Not a problem at all.

More than 90 percent of this engine's torque is available in the 1500 to 1800 rpm range. That way, you'll get great power for

But this All-Mode 4WD system was developed to enhance traction and stability on the road. And isn't that exactly what you need in a sport utility like this? This system instantly delivers torque to the front wheels, the right amount to restore traction and get you on your way. I liked the option of allow ing the drivers to override and get into man ual control if you needed it. And in difficult off-roading, the system is further enhanced with the optional limited-slip rear differential that gives you even more traction and control. And you'll always know what mode you're in. There's a display right on the instrument panel to tell you whether you're in 2WD, AUTO or LOCK. Switching between all of them takes a 10th of a sec

ond, by the way. On clean and dry pave ment, you're in 2WD. In AUTO mode, you use it for most driving conditions except for severe or offroad driving. This is the mode where the 4WD system directs engine power to the axle with the most traction

In the LOCK position, you'll get a 50-50 front/rear torque split for traction on slippery surfaces. Don't use it on dry pavement, however, or you run the risk of wearing your tires and drivetrain prematurely.

Safety for you and your family hasn't been forgot-ten with the QX4. You'll find dual airbags, adjustable front shoulder find belt anchors, 3-point rear outboard passenger seat belts, energy-absorbing steering column, child safe ty rear door locks, front

and rear body structure crumple zones, hood-buckling creases with safety step to help avoid intrusion into the passenger compartment and bodyside reinforcements.

Although I think the QX4 was comfortably low to the ground and possibly didn't really need the side step rails, as the week moved on, I started using them and found they gave me the extra help I needed to get into the vehicle. Q. You said that you read resumes quickly. What quickly. What would make you slow down and consider a person seriously?



JOB SEARCH

When the economy was less robust, one small advertisement could bring in fifty to two hundred response a week, depending upon the position. Even now, when advertising response rates are lower, we spend a lot of time reviewing data bases or paper files looking for a match.

Many candidates envision recruiters or personnel departments scrutinizing and weighing every word and number on their resumes. When I was a lot younger and had no experience at all, I spent hours responding to senior-level Wall Street Journal ads, believing that managers in large companies would consider my resume seriously and carefully. I thought that business people were equipped with a profound and mystical insight, and that they might see something between the lines about my hidden skills, talents and potential. I guess they didn't.

After reading billions and billions of resumes, it is natural for head-hunters and hiring authorities to develop a kind of template to quickly decide if a candidate's paperwork should be evaluated more thoroughly. It's a matter of time management. At the risk of sounding harsh, one-third of the resumes we receive are sent in by people who are just like I used to

be - not even close to being qualified. Five percent or less might be possible matches for the opening in question The rest are keepers and will be filed away for another day.

My inclination is to say that I don't really have a defined "system" for evaluating resumes, but I suppose that isn't true. I've simply been at it so long that I read and sort without being very conscious of the sequence or key characteristics that cause me to look harder or twice. My thinking process is probably different from other recruiters and employment managers, but it usually goes something like this:

- Immediately after opening the envelope and unfolding the papers, a bio-chemical reaction occurs. If your resume is written in micro type, has jelly stains on it or is folded in twelve places, the reaction is not good. The resume's appearance creates a "context" and generates some mini-assumptions about professionalism and polish.
- I tear off your cover letter and staple it to the back without even glancing at it. Cover letters usually offer no meaningful information beyond the resume and are often difficult to read. I'll look at it later if your paperwork survives the second or third cut.
- Without reading your Objective, Background Summary or bulletized accomplishment statements, I go immediately to the Experience section and look for your current or last job title. If it is very different from the position in question (e.g., you are a Bus Driver and the opening is for Chief Financial Officer or vice versa), your resume gets

filed. If the title is close or there is a conceivable match (e.g., Director of MIS), you're still in the game.

- Before checking out specific experience, I look at employment dates. No matter how great your skills are, our client companies usually refuse to look at job hoppers. They believe the past is the single best predictor of the future. I do, too. If your work history is stable (I know that's subjective), your resume will still be in my hand.
- Back I go to the Experience section to look for buzz words. Almost every discipline involves the performance of a relatively standard and specific set of tasks. Quality engineers usu-ally perform FMEA's. Executive secretaries do word processing and are likely to list the programs they are familiar with such as Word, Excel, etc. Some buzz words have more to do with the industry for which we are recruiting. For example, the letters CNC should appear on resumes submitted for engineering jobs with our big machining client.
- On to Education. If your resume has made it this far, we can now start exercising a little judgement and cut you some slack if other things look good. Clients who start out insisting on a four-year degree tend to lighten up after a week or two of zero applicant flow. Conversely, a person who is light on experience, but has a degree related to the job, will still be taken seri-ously. We also scan quickly for jobrelated certifications, such as CQE or CPIM.

Now I look for a dollar sign in the cover letter. Most people are savvy enough not to mention money. However, when it does appear and the stated amount is beyond the client's reach, we still consider the person's background versus the market rate, and place the resume in the action file if the dollars aren't way out of line.

OK, I'm ready to stop scanning and actually read your resume - quickly. I don't contemplate the feasibility of your having saved \$2,000 per month in material costs or dwell on your claim of having increased sales by 6.2 percent. If the document tells a logical, cohesive story and you have enough directly related experience, your resume ends up in the "Call" pile (which is remarkably small nowadays).

Department heads who aren't used to reading resumes in volume tend to take a lot of time with them. You might think this leads to better decisions, but I doubt it. These managers are often picky – I mean NIT picky. This candidate only has three years of experience, not three and a half. That candidate is only familiar with nine out of ten programs we are using. Most recruiters and experienced personnel people, however, pride themselves on being efficient and realistic. They know that the perfect candidate does not exist.

They rely on the spelling check software to proofthem. That's not its purread fo pose. It only checks spelling. In many cases the spelling is OK, but the word isn't the right word.

One recruiter said she has received lots of cover letters applying for the position of "Manger".

Cover letters and resumes with typos and grammatical errors usually end up in the trash. Why? The recruiters believe that if applicants won't take the time to make sure their personal marketing material is error free, then they wouldn't pay attention to details on the job.

Also, use a 12-point font on both cover letters and resumes. It's easy to read even if it's photocopied or faxed.

Cover Letters - Recruiters usually do a 30-second scan for key information. If it's there, they'll read the cover letter, if not they won't. What can you do to ensure your letter gets read? Two things. First, make sure that you use the words from the ad. Second, avoid long sentences and long paragraphs. It's difficult for tion from both. Instead, use a few bullet points or a 2-column "Your Requirements/My Background" approach to address the points listed in the ad.

Keep your letter short, too. A cover letter should only provide a glimpse of the information in the resume.

Resumes - Starting at the top, Objectives are seldom read because all say essentially the same thing. The HR folks and hiring managers would rather see a bullet point list of skills. That's good news because the skill list can be used to give the reader a snapshot preview of what you've accomplished.

Recruiters also prefer chronological, last-job-listed-first resumes. Why? It's easier to pick out the candidate's current skills

harder for an applicant to hide things like extended unemployment, job-hopping and gaps in work history.

What would recruiters really like to see? More information on accomplishments in the last two positions an applicant has held. Four to six accomplishments for each position in bullet point format. Including dollars and percentages helps the reader gauge the impact of your contribution. Information on other positions is ancient history and needs only one or two explanatory bullet points per position.

What don't they want? Resumes that read like job descriptions, small print, narrative sentences, your grade point average if you've been out of school more than three years and

ly). Also, don't list hobbies, politi-cal affiliations or state: "Refer-ences will be furnished upon request.

Interviews - The interview process begins when the inter-view is scheduled. Asking the HR staffer for information on the company and a departmental organization chart, together with a list of the people with whom you'll be speaking will earn some points for you. The next step deals with your appearance. A few of the recruiters said they've terminated the interview process right away if the candidate does

n't pass visual muster (i.e. big smile, strong handshake, clean suit, shined shoes, conservative tie/scarf, no jangling jewelry, easy on the perfume/after shave, clean fingernails, no mint or smoky breath). Their reasoning is that the hiring manager will view the candidate as a gauge of HR's ability to recruit someone who'll do well in the firm.

Whether you show you're ner-vous means little to most HR people. They know it's natural to have some butterflies. What they are looking for is a candidate with a positive attitude and an open mind. ASK THE EXPERT Porch roof need not drip, weep

By POPULAR MECHANICS For AP Special Features

Q: I built a porch with a metal roof on it. We enclosed it in using storm windows, but have not installed heat. The problem is that in the summer with the windows open, condensation forms and runs off the inside of the roof. What is the best way to stop the condensation? Will installing plywood and shingles over the metal help?

A: The way to stop the condensation from developing is to prevent the vapor in the porch air from contacting the cold metal roof. Putting plywood and shingles on top of the roof will not help. Instead, you should put insulaunder the roof and cover the insulation with a vapor barrier. With this installation, the vapor will not migrate beyond the vapor barrier. Also, because of the insulation, the vapor barrier will have a temperature that is above the dew point. Consequently, condensation will not develop. You can cover the insulation and vapor barrier with drywall or wood panels

Q: I am looking for a replacement toilet tank cover for an American Standard Tank F409 in **Regency Blue.** Our local plumber claims the cover is not available and wants to sell me a complete toilet. Since the color of the new toilet will not match that of the other bathroom fixtures, I am reluctant to buy it. Do you have suggestions?

A: We called the American Standard Co. and inquired about the cover to your toilet tank. Although they no longer manufacture that model and color, they apparently still have some covers in stock. They suggest you con-tact the American Standard Wholesale distributor that covers your area

Here are answers to pool chemical questions

(NAPS) - When it comes to proper pool maintenance, all estions are important. These some of the more commonly asked questions, with answers m the experts at Olin Corp.

Q: Is it dangerous to trans-ort chemicals in the trunk of my car?

A: You can transport pool chemicals safely yourself, but you are smart to take the task seriously. Always follow simple precautions. Make sure the area

architecturally

where you put chemicals in your car is clean. Place each chemical in a clean, separate box. Secure the chemicals so they don't shift in the boxes; avoid sudden stops and sharp turns. It is a good idea to transport in your trunk. However, it is important to take them out once you get home.

Q: How long after adding chlorine should people wait before going into the water?

A: If the chlorine residual is higher than 3.0 ppm, let the pool stand unused until the residual drops below 3.0 ppm. For proper sanitization, maintain 1.0-3.0 ppm free chlorine. When the

water tests in this range, your pool is in perfect shape for swim-

Q: Could chlorine cause my pool water to turn a definite blue/green color? It did this right after I added chlorine.

A: If the pool walls are not slippery, the probable cause of the blue/green colored water is the presence of metals (most likely copper) in the water. Well water can be a source of copper, iron or manganese. Other sources include copper pipes, heaters, heat exchangers, pennies, the ends of garden hoses. corrosion of metal nuts and

bolts, or rusty pool equipment. To restore water clarity, check it with a test kit and adjust pH to

7.2 to 7.4. Shock the pool by adding two ounces of HTH Granular or Sock It per 1,000 gallons of pool water. Filter until the pool water clears. Adding clarifier also may help.

Q: What does pH have to do with chlorine?

A: The efficiency of chlorine is greatly affected by pH. If pH rises above 7.8, chlorine becomes less effective in controlling algae and bacteria. If pH falls below 7.2, chlorine becomes more susceptible to ultraviolet degrada-

tion from sunlight.

Q: My family says the chlorine is burning their eyes. Am I adding too much?

A: Burning eyes often are caused by compounds known as chloramines, which are formed when hitrogen-containing compounds combine with chlorine. The burning eyes are actually caused by a lack of free available chlorine. Your pool needs more chlorine.

Q: I have a scum line around my pool. Can I use a kitchen/bath cleaning compound to remove it?

A: No. Household cleaning compounds are not recommended for swimming pools. The cleansers are likely to contain phosphates, which act as nutrients for algae. Your scum line is probably an accumulation of oils and dirt which can be removed with swimming pool tile or vinyl cleaner and scrubbing with a soft brush.

Q: Our pool is in a wooded area, and we have leaves in it constantly. Is it important to move them every day?

A: Yes. Remove all debris. including leaves, before adding chlorine to your water. Leaves contain tannin, which can react with chlorine to produce reddishbrown stains. If your pool surface is stained, you can use stain controller.

Q: What do I do when I have an immediate question about my pool water?

A: Call the Olin Pool Care Hot line for a conversation with the water-care experts. They are available seven days a week from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m. at 1-800-222-2348.
