

Time For Police Services to Get House in Order

If's time Independence Police Services got their house in order: Several disturbing instances involving Police Services have been brought to light recently, and if they expect to remain in business they ought to be resolved.

As: charges against Police Services officer Tom Cavalier unfold, we've learned that the department has. been infiltrated by petty infighting. If Police Services Chief Charles Kimbel can't get along with Cavalier and the charges are founded Cavalier should be let go.

But the fighting doesn't seem to end there. Deputies of the Oakland County Sheriff's Department who patrol in this area continue to engage in petty argumentation with Police Services.

Supposedly, after the "big scene" when typewriters and other objects were tossed in a melee between the

two departments two years ago, everything was supposed to have been worked out and relations at least bearable. Recent evidence doesn't indicate that has happened

And now when he needs it most, because of current talk of disbanding Police Services, Chief Kimbel seems to be shying away from the press. The Reminder has made repeated attempts to talk with the Chief about a variety of subjects but have always found him unavilable.

Police Services, if they expect to serve alongside the Sheriff's Department must get their house in order. Personnel problems and petry argumentation and jealousies must be eliminated. A public relations effort must be instituted. To fail at any one of these means Police Services is doomed.



The Lucia legend comes from Sicily when many years ago Lucia was born of noble parents and raised as a Christian. She vowed to dedicate her life to giving her wealth to the poor. She would go in secret at night and inorder to carry more food with both hands, she strapped a candle to her head to light the way. When her pagen suitor found out, he had her? brought to trial as a Christian and she was accussed of witch craft. Sentenced to die at the stake on December 13, 304 A.D.

Later the story of Lucia was brought to the Northern countries by the Vikings and celebrated on the eve of the Light Festival, which was the shortest day of the year. Afterwards Lucia was made a saint.







McCormick, Haddad, Sheldon Return

Could be Year for Wolfpack State Championship

The end of the football season means only one thing, the starting of the basketball season. One team that is eagerly awaiting the 1979-80 season is the Clarkston Wolves, or as their many fans refer to them, the "Wolfpack". The Wolves' training camp is full of enthusiasum and all the players are excited about the upcoming season. The Clarkston cagers are also anxiously awaiting the February game in which they get to play in the Silverdome.

Last year was the Wolves' best season in twelve years. Clarkston finished the season with a first place in GOAL. and then they made it to the district finals. Unfortunately, the Wolves were defeated by Pontiac Central, who went on to win the S ate Championships. Still, nobody was depressed with their record; 20-3.

The claw of the Wolves, Tim McCormick, was by far the most impressive player on the team. Last year, McCormick received numerous all-state awards. He was also voted team MVP. Standing at 6'11" he averaged 31.3 points a game last year. Tim also averaged 18 rebounds and has a free throw percentage of 81. Right now, McCormick is being eyed by colleges all over the country, and is rated one of the three top players in Michigan.

Co-captain Ed Haddad was also a big help last year. Shooting 11.5 points a game, he was the master of several key assists. Another player to look for will be John Sheldon. Last year, Sheldon averaged 7.5 points a game, and was deadly from the free-throw line.

Another player who will prove to be helpful is junior Scott McKoin. McKoin started on the Junior Varsity last year as center. He pumped in 25 points a game and this year he'll be playing forward.

Another new player is junior Greg Lane. Lane, a transfer from Lake Orion, usually put in 18 points a game. One more super Wolve cager is Senior Chuck Nicoli. Chuck is tough under the net, and it shows with his 17 rebound average. The remaining players are seniors Nick Lekas, Paul Brown, Doug Hagyard, John Pappas and Larry Balis; Juniors are Rick Schebor and Jerry Tatu.

The Reminder talked with the coach of the Clarkston Wolves, Gary Nustad, and he indicated that the team is very promising. He said that the way the team does will depend on how the other players play around McCormick. He said that Tim is a very mature and smart kid and the way he plays will be an important factor. Nustad said that he is looking for Ed Haddad to have a good season, too.

So, to sum it all up, the Wolves can look forward to a very promising season. Tim McCormick should play to the satisfaction of his fans. Ed Haddad and John Sheldon will prove to be key players, along with Chuck Nicoli. The Wolves are looking for a GOAL first place and maybe even a State title. left...Go gettum Wolves.



own ashes, M-275 has risen again after being killed three years ago by the State Highway Commission. Last



week the expanded commission voted 4-2 to build the highway along a route slightly different from the one originally proposed. The \$98 million, six-lane super highway would link I-96 near Walled Lake with I-75 north of Clarkston.

Approval of the highway was a blow primarily to environmentalists and to those who fear its construction will hasten urban sprawl. About 22 miles of the highway would run through undeveloped park and farm land in western Oakland County. Opponents living in the southern urban areas felt easier access to suburban areas would hasten the outward migration and leave them in a situation similar to that of Detroit.


Approval of the highway, on the other hand, was a clear victory for real estate developers, those involved in road construction and state highway engineers who proposed the highway in the first place. It was also a plus for those living in the Springfield Township area.

State Representative Claude Trim of Davisburg was present at last week's session of the State Highway Commission and said the general feeling of those members who supported the major north/south route was that people were moving into these northern areas with or without the highway and that it was needed for easier access. They felt the modified version to be less disruptive than the other proposed routes: it would have less impact on existing communities. The next step they will take. Trim said, is the preparation of an environmental analysis of the project with an eye toward lessening its impact.

Trim said he himself has always favored some sort of major north/south highway, either M-275 or some modification of it. He said he has watched the population explosion in his area with no corresponding road

improvements. The traffic count has multiplied, he said,

and the roads have not kept up.
"If this road is not built," he said of M-275, "others will have to be drastically improved and with local funds, not federal funds, because those plans would not meet federal guidelines.'

"We should have our help from the federal government just the same as any other area," he concluded.

Existing parks in the area such as Springfield Qaks County Park would benefit from easier access as would the proposed Indian Springs to be developed by the Huron-Clinton Metropark System in the south central portion of the township. Trim said the proposed construction of M-275 was a major factor in the decision to establish that park.

Springfield Township Supervisor Collin Walls, like Trim, has always supported the projected route. He said the number one reason for his support was the majority of township voters who said in August of 1978 they favored some form of north/south highway even though the original M-275 had been cancelled at the time.

Walls said the highway was necessary to serve the people already in the township. A special census taken three years ago showed the township population to be 6,500 people. Walls estimated that figure to be about 7,800 now.


These past three years have been the most rapidly increasing activity in the township building department ever, according to Walls. "Things went crazy," he said.

The Springfield supervisor said he, too, had environmental concerns about the proposed highway,

but reminded that people were also an important part of the environment. He said the State Highway Commission felt this Foute would have the least possible damaging effects on the areas involved. The modified version, he said, is identical in Springfield Township to the original plan. It will cut through some wooded and wetland areas but not to any great extent.

Walls said construction plans were indefinite. He said he was told the whole section north of M 59 had never been in question; it even had federal approval. The problems were with the section south of M-59. There was also the possibility the entire approval process would have to be repeated because so much time had

ZBA Blocks Pine Knob's Last Avenue in Township

The Independence Township Zoning Board of Appeals voted last week to affirm the decision by the building department to deny Pine Knob's application for a building permit. Approval of the permit, according to Jerry Powell, would have, in effect, created a principal use not allowed in a recreation district.

Pine Knob attorney Tom Raguso argued unsuccessfully the proposed 21-story, 600-room hotel was the township zoning ordinance.

Raguso said the word "hotel" was not specifically used but that "ski resort" was a permitted use; not a ski area but a ski resort, he emphasized. Hotel plans, he told the ZBA, meet that use for that ordinance.

The proposed hotel, he said, has an artificial ski hill (a permitted use), an incorporated parking area (a permitted use), eating and drinking facilities (found in a ski resort), a liquor license for resort use, and sleeping facilities.

Separately, he said, these items could not be denied and he asked the ZBA to reserve the denial by the building department because that denial was not in compliance with the zoning ordinance.

Tim Palulian, head of the township building department, told ZBA members a ski resort is a principal use and that a hotel is a "possible ancillary use" and perfectly acceptable. But, in this case, he said the hotel would be the principal use.

Township Attorney Richard Campbell called it a "relatively simple" case. The proposed hotel was not ancillary at all, it would be a principal use and could not be considered incidental to the ski resort. "Anything of this magnitude is not incidental," he said.

ZBA member Robert Newlin agreed with Campbell as did John Dunlop who said the word "resort" was subject

to interpretation. He said he himself had tried unsuccessfully to find a definition for the term. Lodging, however, would be a principal use.

Dunlop predicted Palulian's interpretation would eventually be subjected to interpretation by the Supreme Court of Michigan.

Powell's motion to uphold the previous decision by the building department was approved by unanimous vote.

ZBA member Mel-Vana and Paul Menke were and present.

Raguso could not be reached for comment about a future course of action to be taken by his clients Joseph Locricchio and Gary Francell.






elapsed.

A timetable is due to be presented at the December meeting of the highway commission. Walls speculated construction could start at the north end of the proposed route and move southward but he had no definite answer to that or to the question of when actual construction might begin. Some estimates have been up to ten years.

Another step in the approval process lies with the federal government. The U.S. Department of Transportation must okay the project and its current secretary Neil Goldschmidt is credited with having stopped the Mt. Hood freeway in Oregon prior to joining the Carter cabinet.

Obstacles to its construction also may come from Washington. Environmentalists feel the possibility exists the U.S. Department of the Interior may not be impressed with the highway's route and may move to quash the plan.


There is also the possibility of a lawsuit by Citizens in Opposition to M-275, a group formed when the highway was first proposed years ago. That group is led by Stephen Rosman of Commerce Township who even submitted his own alternate highway route to the highway commission which would have lessened the impact on the Commerce/Union Lake area.

Foster Care Adults Learn Life and Leisure Skills

A special recreation and socialization program recently implemented at Springfield Oaks County Park near Davisburg is giving residents of adult foster care facilities in Northwestern Oakland County a chance to do many of the things the rest of us take for granted.

These activities include sewing, music and rhythm, exercise projects, "New Games" and field trips.

"They're learning basic socialization and life skills,"

The program's initial field trip took place last month at Red Oaks County Part in Madison-Heights. The adults tried out the 25-station driving range, shopped at a nearby shopping center and participated in other socialization activities such as table games.

The program at Springfield Oaks is coordinated through the Northwest Oakland Life Enrichment Coalition (NOLEC), in cooperation with the Oakland County Parks and Recreation Commission. NOLEC consists of 11 human service agencies and educational institutions committed to the development of multifaceted programming for the adult mentally handicapped population in northwestern Oakland

County. The coalition, which is the only one of its type in Northwest Oakland County, has been programming at Springfield Oaks since September of this year. Springfield Oaks was chosen to house the program because, "It's centrally located and large enough to accommodate multi-programming," says Clinton-Cirocco.

NOLEC's roots go back to the fall of 1976 when the West Oakland Community Mental Health Clinic and the North Oakland Adult Basic Education Consortium, realizing they had clients in common, joined forces and began developing inter-agency programming.

In July 1978, League Goodwill of Detroit was contacted and agreed to consider functioning as an umbrella agency for what has become NOLEC.

The coalition plans to expand into more diverse activities and programs in the near future. The eventual goal is to service 75 people at Springfield Oaks and to offer fine crafts, woodcarving, individual and group counseling, vocational assessment and training as well as remunerative work experience programs.

In the simulated work experiences, the adults will be participating in simple assembly line tasks to orientate

them into the world of work.

"They'll find themselves in productive lines of work." says Marion Tucker. NOLEC program developer. "They first step into community work programs and then into regular jobs." she adds.

The program at Springfield Oaks is growing continuously, as is NOLEC, in order to serve Northwest Oakland County's adult mentally handicapped population with educational and recreational resources.

to purchase a real live evergreen.

Dr. O.J. Fusilier of Springfield Township is the owner of one of those tree farms that sells Christmas trees. He has been raising and selling them ever since he purchased his nearly 100 acre retirement retreat off of Dixie Highway back in 1947.

Since that time, Fusilier figures to have sold over 100,000 trees, and thus is considered an expert in the

Christmas tree industry. "A lot of people think all you have to do is plant the trees, wait till they grow seven to eight feet tall and then sell them," said Fusilier, in explaining how he maintains the trees.

In summer, continued Fusilier, the trees must be trimmed and sprayed. Although in his mid-70's, Fusilier trims all his own trees, using a German butcher knife. that takes about thirty seconds to trim one tree.

Although evergreens are quite hardy, there are numerous bugs and worms that can cause damage to the trees, thus Fusilier like most tree farmers, sprays his trees once a year.

Fusilier claims a well-trimmed pine will take 7-10 years to reach Christmas tree height. Spruces take a little longer, on the average of 9-12 years and Douglas Firs take 13-15 years.

"This year's crop of trees are very nice and green because we had plenty of rainfall," said Fusilier. Yellowing therefore shouldn't be a problem.

There are a number of varieties of trees to choose from. "The White Pine is the most beautiful tree we grow...although it is not our most popular," noted Fusilier.

The Scotch Pine at Fuislier's and most farms elsewhere, continues to be the best seller year after

Another popular tree is the Spruce, but Fusilier warns, this short-needled tree sheds easily.

"When you hear that (a tree shedding), it's a Spruce, They're the onces that tend to shed," said Fusilier. It is recommended to buy Spruce not longer than two weeks before Christmas."

Fusilier also said there is no need to pay \$3.00 or \$3.50 per foot per tree -- which seems to be the going rate in Detroit. In this area there are many farms that sell them for much less.

Fusilier, as an example, gets \$6 for Pines, \$7 for Spruce and \$10 for a Douglas Fir. And those are total prices of any size tree.

Line tins with greased paper. Bake at oven heat 225 degrees to 250 degrees possibly bringing the hear up to 300 degrees for the last 20 minutes of baking time. Two... to three hours will be required according to size of pan.

This is an old, old recipe, my sister-in-law had, she came from Quebec, Canada. We used to get together and bake several batches in November for Christmas.

Our biggest problem making the fruit cakes was cracking the nuts and getting them out whole. Our husbands would set around the table if the nut didn't come out whole they would get to eat it.

Years ago when we started baking these cakes you couldn't buy shelled nuts.







Behind those two unassuming doors that lead off of Battle Alley Street into Battle Alley Arcade in Holly is a whole city -- a city of shops that have been rebuilt in the tradition of Holly's fabled pass.

"We are a unique street," explain Judy Rood, owner of The Pampered Lady, one of nine shops in The Arcade. "It's almost like a museum. You really have a feeling that you're going back in time."

The Arcade was conceived and built by the Raskins and Hiltys. Most of the decorative schemes and unusual annues round incide. The Arcade, were sought and found by the two families.

For instance the street lights that adorn Battle Alley came from the London Bridge, and a replica of an 1834 Holly Home (nearly full size) in which Holly historian Vera Cook Husted was born, is part of the group of shops.

The Arcade, although just recently rebuilt, has a long and interesting history. It was built to accommodate visitors from the adjacent Holly Hotel during the railroad's prime.

Holly was the first intersection and train depot in Michigan. During its heyday, the Hotel was often filled with overnight guests. The Arcade provided reprieve and entertainment.

When the car began to dominate transportation, the Hotel and consequently Holly lost its popularity. A casket maker soon took over the Arcade's retail space and he was followed by other businesses until a few years ago when Battle Alley was conceived.

If The Arcade and its antiqueish streets are unique, then its accompanying shops could be termed the most unusual in the area. The nine shops are:

The Crafty Foxe - Supplier of dried and silk flower arrangements for home and weddings.

The Baby Buggy - Specializing in handcrafted baby clothes and items.

The Pampered Gent - Reproductions of Jack Daniels advertising items for the Jack Daniels Lover.

The Pampered Lady - Custom blended perfume, toiletries and related items.

Jan's Sandwich Saloon - Sandwiches made fresh on the spot.

Victoria Clothing Shop - Antique and new designer fashions and custom evening wear.

Musicality - Everything for the music lover from classes to Kazoo.

Jin Newtown's Stained Glass - Specializing in custom windows and lamps.

Cobblestone streets accent the arcade.

Sew What - Unique interior fabric design and handcrafted quilts.

Despite the uniqueness of The Arcade and the merchandise that can be purchased from its shopkeepers, prices are reasonable.


According to Ms. Rood, "You get very high quality and the prices are as good if not better than area Malls."
