

In Independence Township Full Slate Expected for August Primary

If rumors and speculation are borne out, Independence Township could be gearing up for an election based on a four-party system. In addition to the traditional Republican and Democratic candidates, there may be those representing, officially or unofficially, the Anti-highrise Party and the Pro-highrise Party.

There is no concrete evidence to support the existence of these latter two parties now nor is it definite they will materialize in the future. No one seems particularly anxious to acknowledge them, but rumors persist nonetheless.

Other equally persistent rumors tally as many as eight potential candidates for supervisor and eighteen to twenty for trustee. Speculation continues as to what present officeholders will switch either parties and/or offices within the township, the county and the state.

And just why are so many people considering running for office these days? There are several answers to that

It may be they are simply interested in taking part in the governmental process. Newcomers may feel they can do the job as well as or better than those currently in

Maybe those considering entering the political arena.

do so because they don't like the decisions being made by those already in office.

The third answer is that some people are just plain politically ambitious and equate public office with power.

Whatever the underlying motives may be, interest in the political process such as that rumored here in Independence Township can't be all bad. It's better to have too many candidates to choose from than to have no choice at all.

Anyone remotely interested in observing the political process would be well advised to get a score card and start keeping track of who says what on which occasion about any issue. Start attending township board meetings and see what the incumbents have to say and what those in the audience have to say. It seems that anyone with an opinion these days is a potential candidate.

Although the primary election is not until August, there are nominating petitions available at the township hall. Some are being circulated even now.

Anyone interested in seeking a township office needs to gather only a handful of signatures on those petitions. Democrats need at least 34 but not more than 136. Republicans need at least 32, but not more than 130. June 3 is the deadline for filing for the August 5 primary.





FORECAST by Robert Davis


With the start of the baseball season being less than a month away, shirt-sleeve weather can't be too far away. can it? You couldn't tell it from the weather in February. however, as the cold spell that began near the end of January continued throughout most of the month of February.

Conditions were also rather dry around southeastern Michigan, with precipitation totals ranging from 0.88 of an inch at Bishop Airport in Flint, to 1.41 inches at Elizabeth Lake/Waterford Township. Locally, the northern Clarkston station recorded 0.91 of an inch and the eastern Clarkston recorded 1.03 inches of precipitation during the month.

Snowfall was near normal in the Clarkston area, as the eastern Clarkston station received 7.4 inches of snowfall in February. Through the end of February, the Clarkston area has accumulated 27.6 inches of snow this season.

The northern Oakland County area has received substantially more snowfall this winter than the Detroit area. Unless the pace picks up during March, it looks like the Detroit area will experience one of the most snow-less winters on record.

February temperatures were well below normal, as the eastern Clarkston station recorded a mean temperature of 21.1 degrees. This is about 3 degrees below normal, producing 1273 heating degree days for


Although temperatures were below normal, this past February was not nearly as cold as the one we experienced one year ago. The mean temperature for February 1979 was only 14.8 degrees, producing 1406 heating degree days. Therefore, even with the extra day that this leap year provided, you should have used approximately 10% less fuel to heat your home to the same temperature in February 1980 compared to February 1979.

We did have our share of cold temperatures this past February, however. Clarkston temperature ranged from a low of 5 degrees below zero on the mornings of the 17th and 29th to a high of 45 degrees on the 21st. Morning temperatures dropped to below zero readings on 6 different mornings during the month.


Comparing differences between our old 1940-1969 and the new 1950-1979 climatological "means" for February in our area, we find that the biggest change is in mean temperature. The new updated data indicates that the mean temperature dropped from 24.9 to 24.2 degrees Farenheit; mean precipitation dropped from 1.54 to 1.46 inches, and mean snowfall dropped from 7.9 to 7.8



Clarkston Breezes to District Championship

Clarkston 85 - Holly 52

The no less than awesome Clarkston Wolves continued to advance in the District games when they defeated the Holly Bronchos, 85-52, much to the delight of the home fans, who cheered on Clarkston all the way.

The only fault in the infallible Wolfpack's game plan was defense. The Wolves gave up 8 points the first period and then gave up an unbelieveable 23 points in the second period of play. On the other hand, their offense was superb, scoring a total of 44 points to take the lead at half, 44-31.

Clarkston is a second-half team, which they proved later that night when they took an 18 point lead at the end of the third period and later to finish the game with a

32 point lead. Tim McCormick, the senior Wolfpack center who does everything but sell popcorn at halftime, finished up the night with a whopping 39 points, 19 rebounds, and 5 blocked shots. Scott McKoin, the man who will hopefully take over for McCormick next year wound up with 24 points, 8 of those coming on free-throws. McKoin was 8-8 from the line, and he was the only other Clarkston player to score in double figures. Also scoring for Clarkston was Ed Haddad with 8, John Sheldon with 6, while Chuck Nicolai and Doug Hagyard both scored 4.

High scorer for Holly was Mike Volz, who shot from just about everywhere, and rarely missed. He ended up with 22 points, and he was also the only Holly player in double figures.

Clarkston 65 - Central 45

by John Huttenlocher Ralph Grubb, the successful Pontiac Central basketball coach, sat in the Clarkston lockeroom shaking his head. His team had just played about as well as they could, and still they lost. "We did the best we could. We came, we played, we just couldn't beat them," was Grubb's sad statement.

Grubb is used to going to the District Finals. He's been doing it at Pontiac Central for the last dozen years. Central was the team that knocked Clarkston off last year just around this time, in the District Finals.





Library, Holcomb **Road Get Large Share of Federal Funds**

A township-wide energy audit and improvements to the boat launch at Deer Lake and the Senior Citizen Center were the primary losers in the distribution of federal revenue sharing funds at last week's meeting of the Independence Township Board. No allocations whatsoever were made for these projects.

Other losers to a certain extent were the Community Center Committee and the fire department.

The Community Center Committee had asked for \$20,000 to replace a like amount previously allocated but then used for another project by the township. Their share of the federal pot when it was all divided up was \$11,000, \$9,000 short of what they had a year ago.

Frank Ronk, township fire chief, had asked for \$50,000 for unspecified "equipment". He came away with a commitment for \$20,000 considerably short of what he had sought.

The biggest winners appear to be the township library and Holcomb Road.

Librarian Jim Hibler received \$15,000 for books and improvements while \$40,000 was allocated for roads in general. In that total, however, is the money necessary to pave the stretch of Holcomb Road from the village limits to the I-75 overpass scheduled to become a reality this summer.

The remainder of the \$121,414 was distributed as follows: \$20,000 for the Safety Path Committee, \$15,000 for dust control and \$1,414 for microfilming township records as recommended by the historical society.

Later it was decided the township would pay six cents per linear foot for road chloriding this year as it has in the past. While the township contribution has remaind constant, the cost to residents has not, rising from six cents to twelve cents.



"What we found was we were right but we can't document it," said Township Supervisor Collin Walls, who sits with the Board of Review as a non-voting member.

Walls claimed economic and environmental conditions in the township are as such that the proposed 18 percent assessment increase would exceed the actual market value. In 1978, the Equalization Department penned the township's market value at \$54,915,802. It was increased by \$17,165,238 in 1979.

The Board of Review's ten percent proposed rollback would have reduced that figure by 7.5 million. Walls said he felt that was a fair reduction because it has been indicated in a trend of reduced property and home sales in the township.

"But the (trend) hasn't been happening long enough to be reflected in sales figures," said Walls. Thus they had no way of proving their claim.

"We probably couldn't have carried it through anyway," continued Walls. "We can't make a blanket (township wide) reduction. There's no statutory authority."

In other words the township has no authority to reduce taxes enmasse. If they had tried it's very possible the State would have come in and ceased their tax rolls, or at the very least, a factor would be "slapped" on the rolls.

Walls noted that the City of Northville tried to reduce their assessment last year and ended up with more problems and headaches, than accomplishments.

"It points out the frustrations in that the changes that have to be made have to be made by the legislature," he said.

'So what happens now? Are Springfield residents stuck with the 18 percent increase?

"Now we will drop back five yards and punt," explained Walls. "We (Board of Review this week) will look at each individual appeal on its own merits."

Walls did say that the number of appeals this year are

not that much greater than 1979. Several come from owners of newly developed land.

The last Board of Review meetings will be held Wednesday, March 12th, from 1-5 p.m. and 7-9 p.m.







Resolution to Oppose PK Purchase Tabled

A motion by Trustee Rudy Lozano to send a resolution to the County stating Independence Township's opposition to the county purchase of Pine Knob was tabled until the next meeting ostensibly to give the entire board a chance to vote on the resolution.



Two board members were absent from last week's meeting. Treasurer Fred Ritter was on vacation and Trustee Jerry Powell is a basketball fan particularly at tournament time.

Lozano, a long-time foe of government-provided recreation, said he opposed the county purchase of Pine Knob because it would remove it from the tax rolls.

He told board members Borg-Warner, owner of some 200 acres and the condominiums at Pine Knob, was a "viable alternative" as far as a purchaser was concerned.

County purchase, he said, would result in tax losses and job losses having a "devastating effect" on the township.

Trustee Make Thayer agreed with Lozano that private interests should buy the recreation complex.

Clerk Chris Rose and Trustee Bill Vandermark shared the opposite point of view as far as the resolution itself was concerned. Neither felt the township should interfere at this point. Rose added, however, that if 22-story hotels and carnivals were a possibility under the present ownership, he'd rather see the complex in county hands.

The possibility of adding still another lawsuit to an already lawsuit-ridden situation was discussed if the township should go on record as officially opposed to the purchase.

Hugh Rose, brother of the clerk and an owner of Spring Lake Golf Club, told board members they should have an opinion on an issue of this size. He told them not to hide behind a possible lawsuit.

Attorney Dale Stuart, on the other hand, told them they should be "prudent" because of the \$30 million lawsuit the township is already faced with brought by Pine Knob for denial of the building permit for the hotel. Stuart said recommendations were preferable to out and out opposition to the purchase.

Rose's motion to table the motion was approved on a 3-2 vote, Rose, Vandermark and Supervisor Floyd Tower approving. Lozano and Thayer dissenting.
