Twenty-eight parents brought in foods from twelve different countries to share with parents and children of the class. Some of

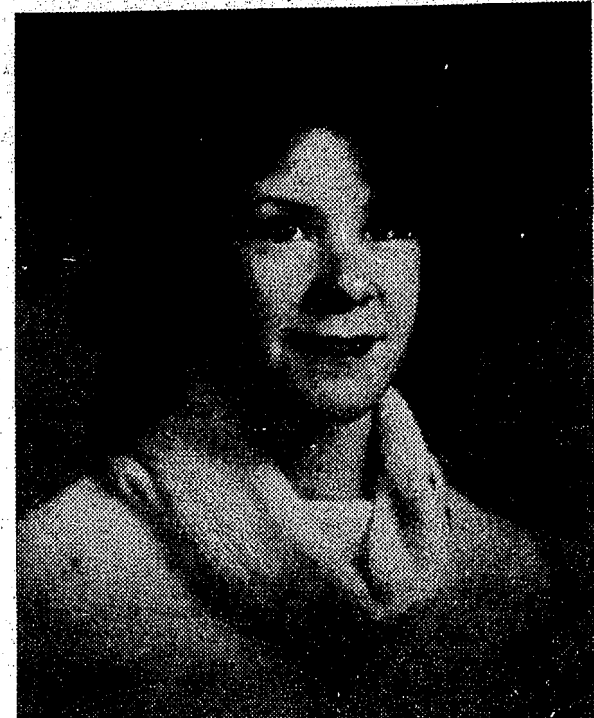

For instance, Sue Mantelle, a compulsive nail-biter at age twenty-three had tried everything known to stop but could not. Upon her husband's request, she visited Salvino, only three times. After the visits, according to Sue, "I completely quit biting my nails. I have even lost the urge. George

taught me, through self-hypnosis, how to relax. Now I do this about three times a week."

Another client, a man who had been in a bad motorcycle accident, went to Salvino in hopes of remembering just what happened on that unfortunate day. Salvino put him in a hypnotic state, as a by-stander to the mishap, thereby enabling the man to recall the exact details of the accident. Just as if he were reliving it--minus the pain.

"I do not want to be listed as a magician," Salvino said. "When I'm able to help a person overcome something, it's a very special feeling."

Hypnotism, through time and study, has become much better understood. The opportunities have opened up for people who have the desire and skill to go into research. The practice Salvino currently has is gratifying, yet he has hopes of going into hypnotism research soon.

"Close your eyes. Relax, starting at the feet and working your way up until the whole body feels completely loose...when you're completely relaxed, open your eyes."

This is how it began. The staff at The Reminder, more than a little impervious to persuasion, requested George Salvino to demonstrate his skill in hypnotism. So Renee Voit, a co-worker, graciously volunteered herself as a subject while the skeptics looked on.

Just prior to the demonstration, there was a discussion between Ms. Voit and Salvino. He explained exactly what would happen, while in turn, she told him some background information. 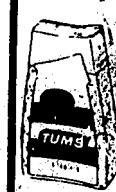

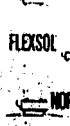

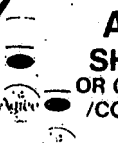

The 5th Annual Silverdome Super Cross returns to Michigan on Saturday evening, April 26 at 8 p.m. and Sunday, April 27 at 2 p.m.

Last year's events attracted over 70,000 fans and the winner each day was the three time American Motorcycle Association National Super Cross Champion, Bob "Hurricane" Hannah. In only four years, the

Pontiac Super Cross has become the largest two day cycle race in the United States.

This year there will be a new Super Cross National Champion and very likely a new winner in the Silverdome. Starting that far behind, it would be very, very, very unlikely that he could repeat as National Champ. At present, Hannah hopes to start the Super Cross Series in Pontiac. But with little physical training, no competition over six months and riding hurt, Hannah will have a tough time repeating.

Prize money for the Silverdome Super Cross will exceed \$50,000.

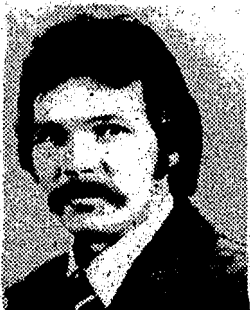

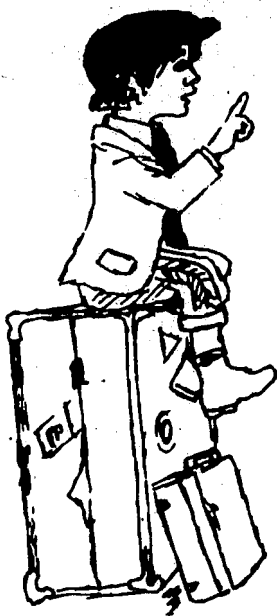



Silence could spell lost. That's right,

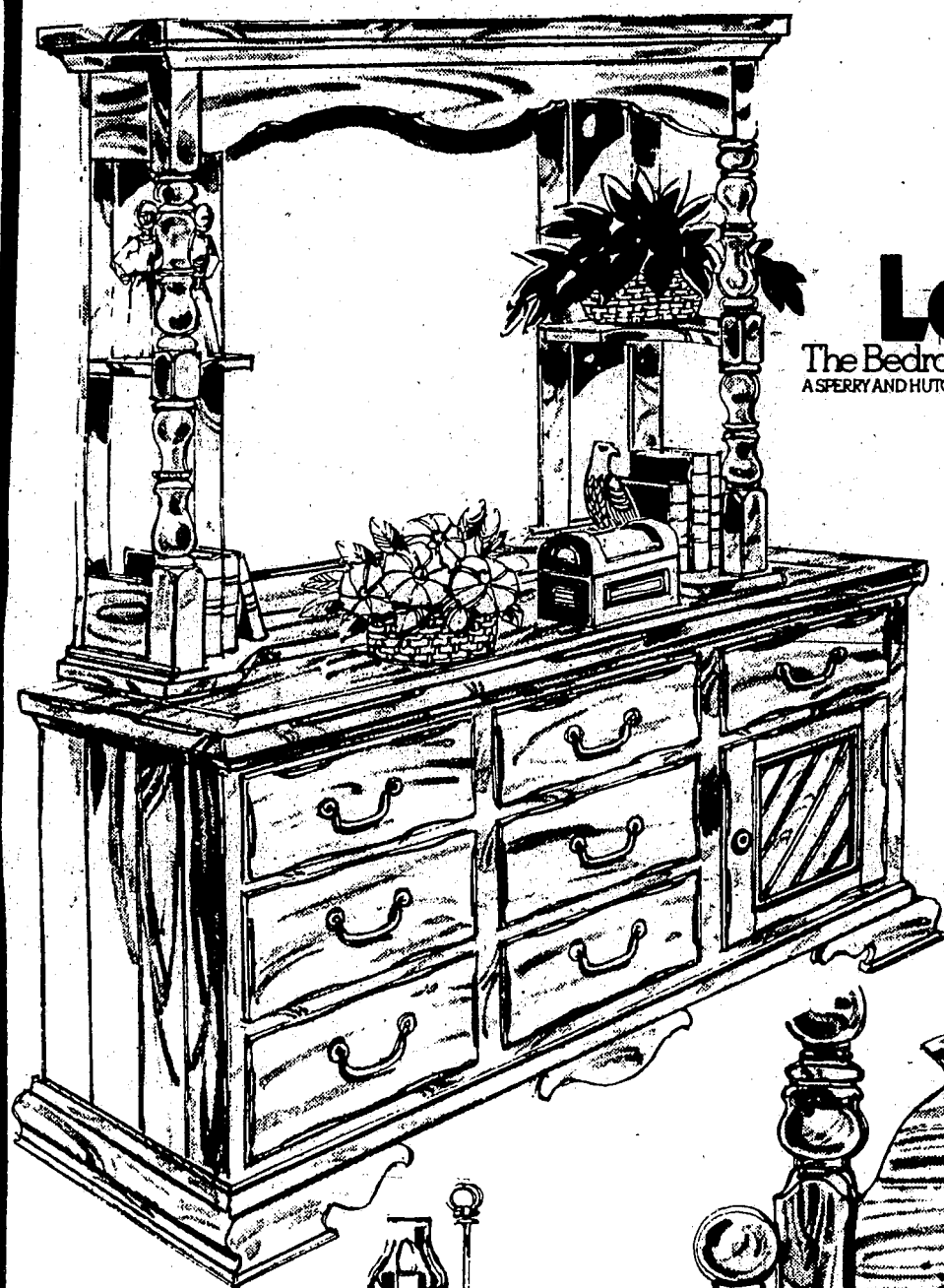
where is the Silent Majority? I understand that approximately 80% of the people in this area want General Motors to build their new plant
