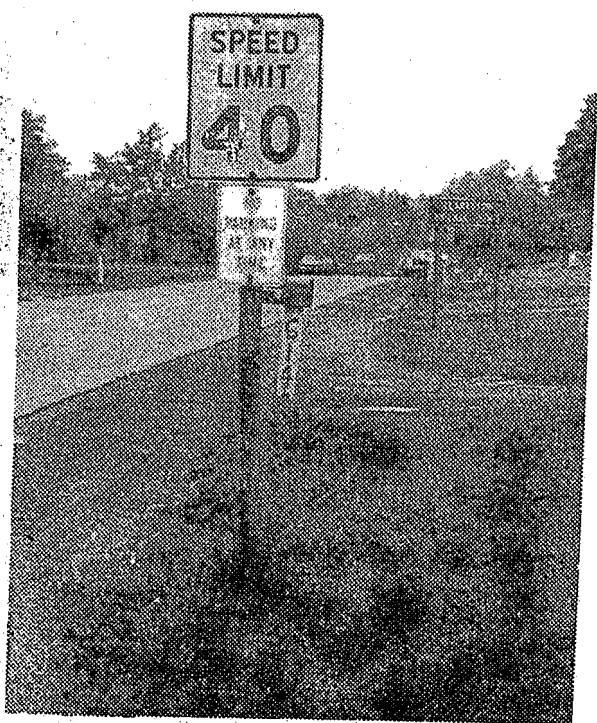

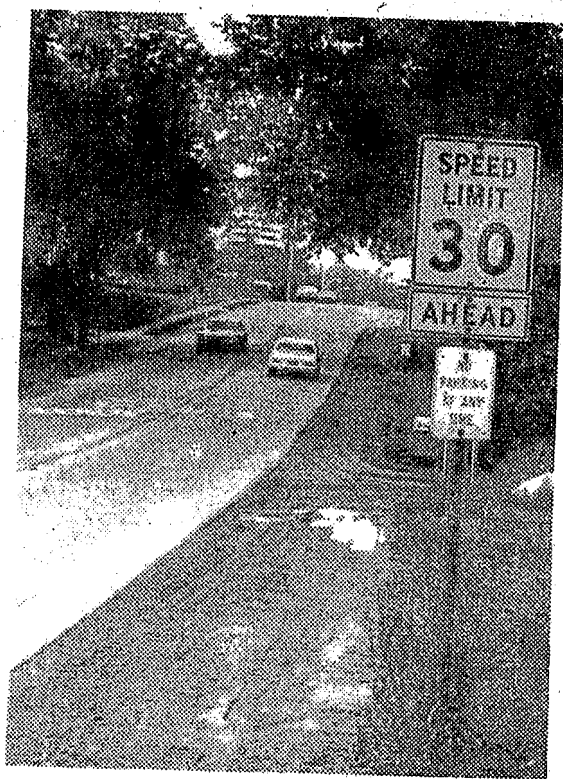

## editor's note Signs Don't Make Sense



Going North on Ortonville Road.



Just before the Business District.



At the other end of town.

Betcha can't guess what the speed limit through Main Street in the Village of Clarkston is?

If you're traveling towards I-75 on Main Street, the speed limit, according to posted signs is 40 MPH.

That's right! Not 25 MPH, Not 30 MPH, but 40 MPH. That's the same speed that is posted on parts of 4-lane Dixie Highway.

Fortunately, I don't think it's supposed to be that way. As the photos above show a 30 MPH Ahead sign is posted just before the Waldon/Main intersection. Either that sign should read 30 MPH period or soon thereafter a 30 MPH should have been placed.

However, the 30 MPH sign doesn't appear until you get through the entire business district and are approaching the township hall.

I wonder how come?

Last week The Reminder announced who had filed for local political offices. One of the most interesting contests will be for the County Commissioner seat in District 2 that includes all of Springfield Township and a small portion of Independence Township. Republican Robert Gorsline currently holds the position, but is retiring to pursue a career in the ministry.

That's unfortunate, because Gorsline has proven to be an effective commissioner. Unlike most of his fellow commissioners, Gorsline treated the position as a fulltime job, and thus worked extra hard to see that his rural district got fair treatment.

A large number of candidates from both parties have jumped into the District 2 race. One of those, Kurt McLaughlin, went to great expense in buying stationary and business cards; and then preparing a professional

several page resume, only to withdraw before the filing deadline.

Another candidate, Maggie Cavanaugh, dressed in an Indian headdress for her campaign photos. This was supposed to signify that she will represent the working "warrior" rather than the chiefs.

Other candidates haven't been so flashy, but you can bet, as the August primary gets closer, District 2 will be one of the livelier commissioner campaigns in the county.

Also, we wanted to make note that Carolyn Veresh, author of "Why Not Ask Carolyn", a weekly column that appears exclusively in The Reminder, has taken a summer sabbatical.

Her column will again appear in this paper starting in September, as it has for every week for the past year. Have a nice vacation Carolyn!

## Seven-Year-Old Uses Machine to Talk

by Kathy Rush

Like any other seven-year-old boy, Clarkston resident Christian Chambers loves to swim, fish, ride horseback and bicycles. Nothing phenomenal about this—except that, at age two, Christian's parents, Ralph and Doreen were told by doctors that Christian would never be able to walk. But Christian does walk...and much, much more. The conclusion that he would never walk was drawn from the fact that when Christian turned ten months old, it was discovered that he suffered from cerebral palsy.

Unfortunately, the illness did affect Christian's speech center which incapacitated his ability to speak. Neither Christian nor his

family let this handicap stand in the way.

"He loves a challenge," says Mrs. Chambers. "He's motivated enough to try anything. Christian enjoys everything and loves going any place—just as long as he's going."

Christian attends the Herrington Orthopedic Unit, a school in Pontiac which specializes in teaching their students alternate means of communication. This school offers techniques to help him overcome his communication barrier.

One such aid is referred to as a "Bliss Board". It's a poster that Christian carries with him with symbols of often used words and phrases having the written word printed

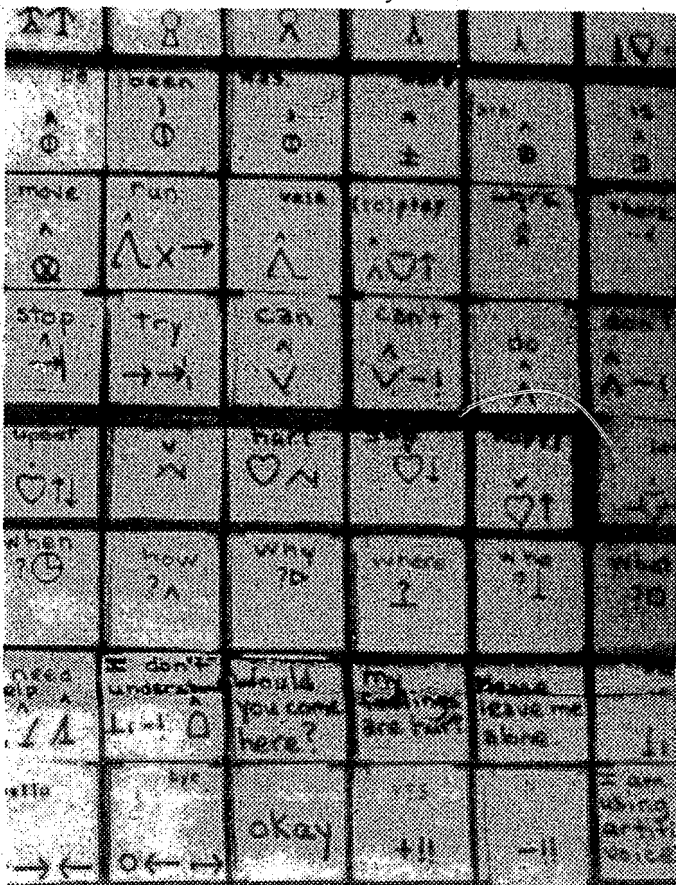
under the symbol. By expressing himself with the Bliss Board, Christian is not only able to communicate, but learns the orthography (art of spelling) as well.

Another group involved in Christian's special learning process is the Oakland County Communication Center-Reading and Language Clinic. The director of the program is Dr. Nathaniel Peters and she is assisted by Communication Consultant, Ina Kirstein.

This group possesses advanced technological devices that are lent out to individuals like Christian. He presently utilizes a device called a "Handi Voice", which according to Kirstein is a "pre-programmed voice synthesizer that combines phonetics." Again, similar to, but much more complex than the Bliss Board the Handi Voice uses symbols for words but when pressed will actually speak the word or words. "It has the capacity of eighty different inputs and has two memory banks," added Kirstein.

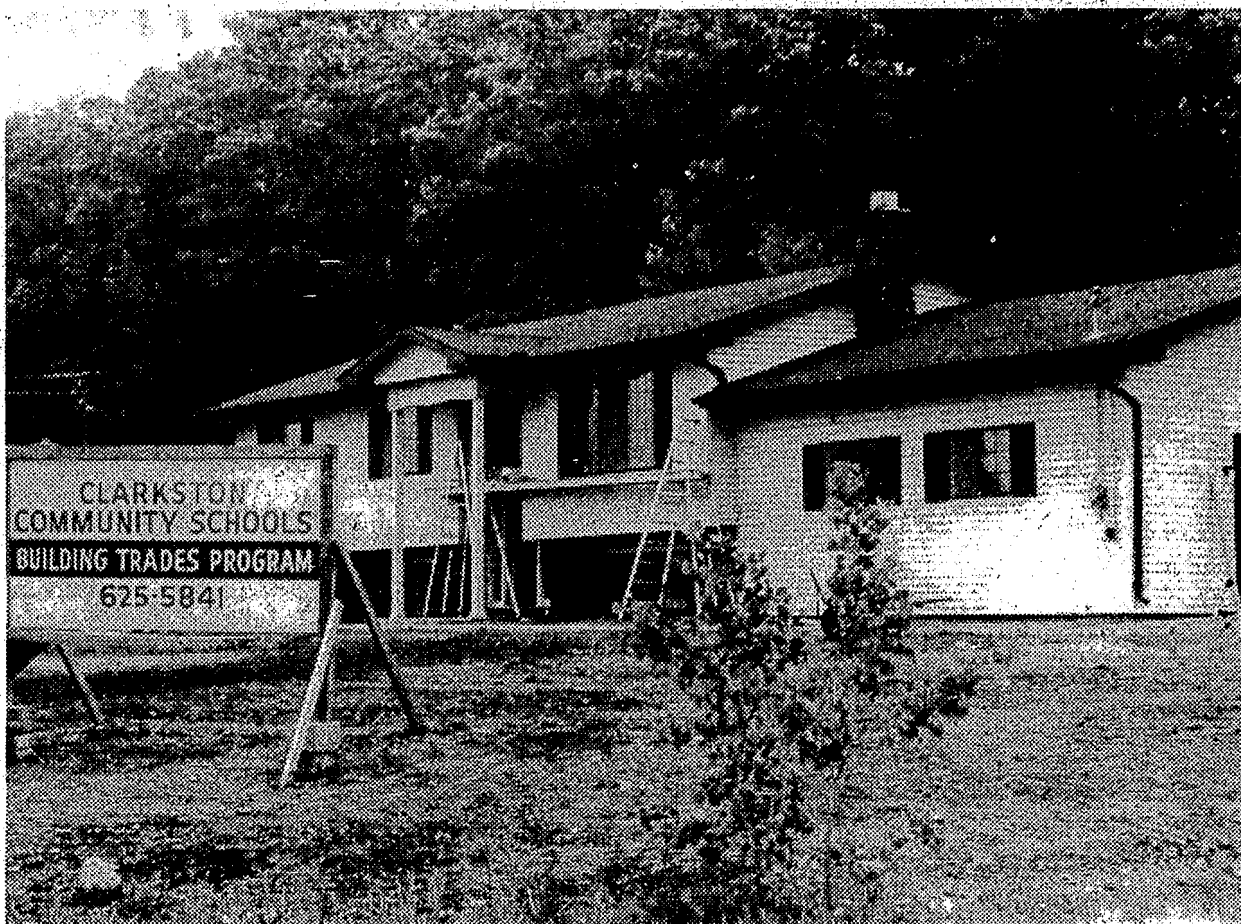
## Clarkston Program's Second Home is Bigger and Better

the corner of M-15 and Paramus in Clarkston. The house near completion is, as mentioned, a much larger bi-level on the corner of Sunnydale and Paramus—just a stone's throw from the first.

The two-and-a-half bath, three bedroom house is 2500 square feet of deep, earthy tones with an air of masculinity. The massive fireplace, heavy wood trim and beams, plus the wet bar in the family room all help contribute to this effect.

Although the degree of difficulty has increased, the craftsmanship of the students has expanded simultaneously. "Each year, in every task, you try to be just a little better than the year before," said Moscovic. "That's why we undertook a much harder

project."

Students began work on the house in October, after three weeks of planning and studying blueprints. With the exception of the plumbing, heating and electrical work, everything from laying the blocks to the interior painting has been done completely by the students.

These three categories have been sub-contracted to local businesses who have spent time with students sharing the knowledge of their particular aspect of the construction trade.

Gary Stewart, sub-contractor for the electrical work maintains that the program is such a success he wishes it had been offered while he was attending high school. "I would bet at least half of the kids involved stay in the building trades and make it their career," Stewart added.

Moscovic says, "The amount of tough labor involved in building a house is unbelievable." One of his goals is to get the kids to look beyond the hard, manual work to the technical side of building. "Through the

process, students learn exactly how everything fits together."

# forecast

by Robert C. Davis

This past May turned out to be a preview of summertime weather conditions across southeastern Michigan. The Clarkston area

received near normal precipitation during the month, but most of the month's rainfall was produced by only 3 different storm patterns. The most significant storm of the month occurred on May 17-18, with the eastern Clarkston station recording 1.21 inches of rainfall in an 18-hour period. All of our volunteers recorded at least 1 inch of rain during this period; the heaviest rainfall was recorded by our volunteer at St. Clair Shores, where 3.50 inches of rain fell during the entire weekend period.

May also had its share of severe weather

conditions; the most notable occurred on May 13, when a series of tornados devastated portions of Kalamazoo. In southeastern Michigan, the heaviest rainfall from the combination of severe storms that passed overhead on the 13th was reported by volunteers at Fenton and Sullivan Lake/Tyrone Township (just south of Fenton), where more than an inch of rain fell. Rainfall totals for May from my entire volunteer network are as follows:

For the calendar year through the end of May, the eastern Clarkston station has recorded a total of 13.22" of precipitation, which is about 1 1/2 inches above normal.

Temperatures in May were above normal for a change. The mean temperature for the Clarkston area was 58.5 degrees, which is about 1 1/2 degrees above normal. Temperatures at the eastern Clarkston station ranged from a low of 30 degrees on the morning of the 8th to a high of 85 degrees on the 22nd and 28th. Daily high temperatures reached into the 80's on 8 different days during the month, with only 2 of those days experiencing precipitation. The last day on which frost was noted was May 10, which is only 1 day later than the average for this area.

During this past month, I had the opportunity to attend a lecture given by Dr. T. Fujita, a well-known authority on tornados. Dr. Fujita presented some interesting statistics relating the observed frequency of tornado activity to cyclic peaks in sun-spot activity. Based on this theory, Dr. Fujita predicts that there will be a major outbreak of tornados in 1981 (next year). Now where is my home insurance policy...?

# Welcoming Home Buyers

With a little effort on your part, your home can be sold more quickly and at a better price. These tips have proven invaluable to owners and are worth your special attention.

**First impressions are lasting.** The front door should greet the prospect looking fresh and clean with a trimmed lawn and yard free of refuse.

**Decorate for a quick sale.** Faded walls and worn woodwork reduce appeal. A quick redecorating with paint and paper can mean a fast sale at a higher price.

**Let the sun shine in.** Open draperies and curtains to let the prospect see how cheerful your home can be. Dark rooms do not appeal. For an evening showing, turn on all your lights.

**Fix that faucet!** Dripping water discolors sinks and suggests faulty plumbing.

**Repairs can make a big difference.** Loose knobs, sticking doors and windows, warped cabinet drawers

and other minor flaws detract from home value. Have them fixed.

**From top to bottom.** Display the full value of your attic, basement and other utility space by removing all unnecessary articles. Brighten dark, dull basements by painting walls.

**Make closets look bigger.** Neat, well ordered closets show the space is ample.

**Bathrooms help sell homes.** Check and repair caulking in bathtubs and showers. Make them sparkle.

**Arrange bedrooms neatly.** Remove excess furniture. Use freshly laundered bedsheets and curtains.

**Three's a crowd.** Avoid having too many people present during inspections. The potential buyer will feel like an intruder and will hurry through the house.

**Music is mellow.** But not when showing a house. Turn off the blaring radio or television. Let the salesman and the buyer talk, free of disturbances.

**Pets underfoot?** Keep them out of the way—preferably out of the house.

**Silence is golden.** Be courteous but don't force conversation with the potential buyer. He wants to inspect your house—not pay a social call.

**Be it ever so humble...** Never apologize for the appearance of your home. After all, it has been lived in. Let the trained salesman answer any objections. This is his job.

**In the background.** The salesman knows the buyers requirements and can better emphasize the features of your home when you don't tag along.

**Why put the cart before the horse?** Trying to dispose of furniture and such to the potential buyer before he has purchased the house often loses the sale.

**A word to the wise.** Let your salesman discuss price, terms, possession and other factors with the customer. He is eminently qualified to bring negotiations to a favorable conclusion.

## FAMILY FINANCE



### A Word About Joint Ownership

There are several ways to own property with somebody else. However, what most people mean by "joint ownership" is something technically called "joint tenancy with right of survivorship." It's the most common shared-property arrangement for couples, although more than two owners can be involved.

Under joint tenancy, each person owns an equal share of the property. When one owner dies, his share passes immediately to the surviving owner or owners. No matter what a will or probate judge says, the property passes without interference. Convenience and family protection are prime motivations. Most married couples put their homes in both names, for example, so that the family is assured of continued shelter when one spouse dies. Sometimes joint tenancy can protect the property from debtors' claims against the estate of the co-owner. Also, some people set up joint ownership of all property in an attempt to bypass the costs of probate.

Joint ownership is not a substitute for a will. Even if you want to put your property in both names to avoid the costs of probate, there can be snags. Usually only a properly drawn will—a separate one for each of you—can ensure that the interests of your family will be managed as you would have liked. Also, without a will it's possible that your property won't get to the people you had intended. Say you've married for the second time, and you have children from your first marriage. You die and your spouse takes over all jointly owned property. What happens if your spouse remarries? You have no control over where that property goes next, even though you may have wanted the assets to be used for your children from the first marriage. Other problems can arise with the simultaneous deaths of both owners. Speak to your lawyer about joint ownership to protect your property properly.

### A Word About Closing Costs

Closing costs are all the fees and services you pay for at "settlement" time, when you close the deal and the title of your new home passes from the old owner to you. Some common closing costs you may face include loan origination fees, broker's commission, discount fees ("points") for the lender, appraisal fees, title charges, credit report fees, inspection fees, advance property taxes, recording charges, transfer taxes. See if your bank or savings and loan association will give you a copy of the booklet "Settlement Costs" prepared by the HUD. It explains your rights, the basic procedures, costs and steps you can take to protect your rights under the Real Estate Settlement Procedures Act. RESPA rules do not fix those closing costs; local laws and customs will set the price to a great deal. You can also write to the Superintendent of Documents, U. S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402. The price is 45 cents, but there is a minimum charge of \$1 per order.

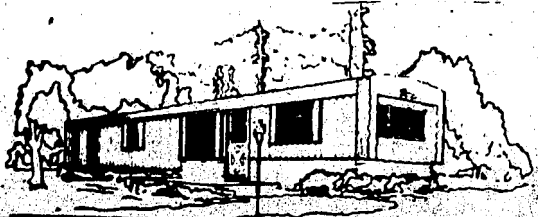

While a buyer taking over your mortgage may make it easier for you to sell your house, you're still responsible for the debt if the buyer defaults on the mortgage. Of course, you can draw up a contract that would free you from responsibility, but the bank has to agree to any assumption of the mortgage by the buyer.)

● You can't sell your house if you've fallen behind in your mortgage payments. (False. You can sell your house at any time; however, the buyer or you must make up the deficit.)

● If you default on your mortgage and the mortgage lender forecloses and sells the property for more than the mortgage amount owed, you get to keep the extra money. (True. In cases of mortgage foreclosure, the lender can't get a windfall from the sale, and you're entitled to the excess amount over and above what you owe.)
