

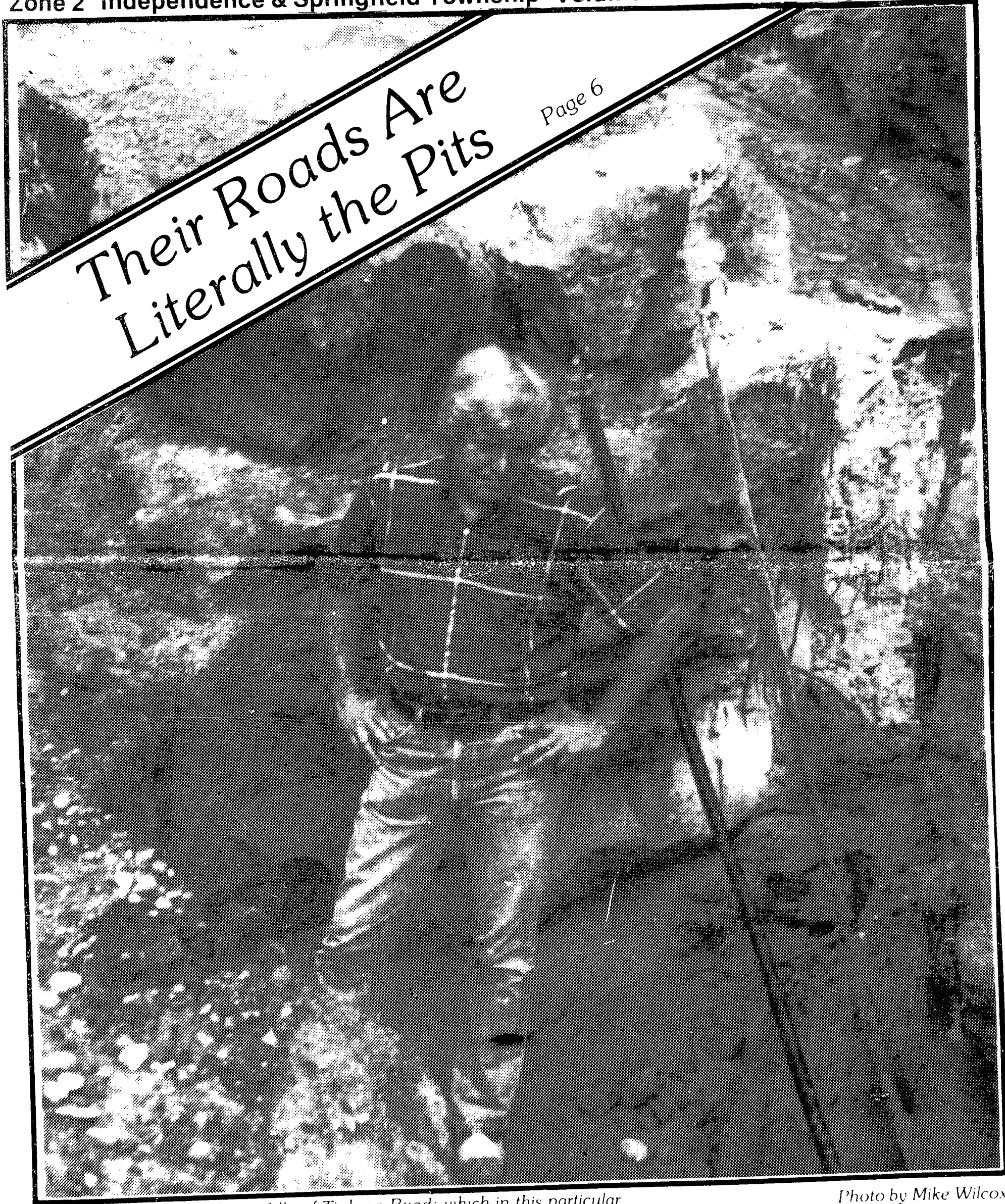

Approves Pine Knob Country Estates Plat Independence Sets Public Hearing for Adult Foster Care Home

A public hearing designed to get input from area residents concerning the application of an adult foster care home for a

residence of Timber Ridge Drive was set for 7:30 August 12, by the Independence Township Board.

The action resulted from the urging of Donald Shuster, an attorney who is representing citizens of Lake Oakland Woods subdivision, in their efforts to enforce zoning restrictions on this type of activity.

Shuster asked the Board to join his group in legal action to stop the group home and uphold zoning laws. He asked the Board to make their decision within the next two weeks.

Supervisor Floyd Tower answered, "We don't have any problem with special meetings, but I would like to know more about what's going on before we vote on it."

Tower was referring to the surprise registered on each of the Board members' faces when Shuster spoke. They had no advance warning about his proposal. Shuster said he would brief them in writing before the public hearing.

A second foster care home failed to receive approval at the meeting. A home proposed by Mike Whaley on Parview Street was delayed because Whaley made application to Waterford Township, instead of Independence.

Whaley's home would be different from the proposed Timber Ridge home in that he and his family would be utilizing Parview as their primary home. Living with them would be three retarded girls.

Like Shuster, Whaley indicated time was a problem. He had to be out of his Waterford home, where he had been a foster parent for 5 years, by this week. The Board accommodated him, by promising to act swiftly once they had received his corrected application.

In other business, the Board approved the final preliminary plat for Pine Knob Country Estates after a presentation by its developer Leonard Grossman and lengthy discussion.

The development would include 47 parcels on 92½ acres near Clarkston-Orion and Pine Knob roads. Grossman said the homes, including the lot, would sell for over \$100,000.

In a letter, the Fire Department asked that a central watering system for the development be required. Trustee William Vandermark supported that idea, suggesting it would be better to install it now than later.

But Treasurer Fred Ritter said, "I think it's an unreasonable request. It's totally unreasonable to expect a developer to do this (install a central water system)."

From the audience Dick Schmaltz of nearby Stowe Trail objected to a 2000 foot long cul-de-sac proposed by Grossman. He received support from Clerk Chris Rose, the only board member to vote against the plat.

Other nearby residents complained about additional traffic.

Larry Beamer of Boyne Highlands, immediately adjacent to Grossman said, "It would be great if I could put a coke and coney out there for all the people driving through."

Mike Morris of Pine Knob Road, who had been concerned about the proposed development since its inception and has attended every meeting concerning it for a year and a half said, "Let's share a little bit. The man has given us four entrances into that subdivision."

Lynn Mead asked when, if ever, he and his neighbors could expect to see Pine Knob Road paved.

Tower answered, "I'm not opposed to paving roads but the name of the game is to go down to the county with money in your pocket...and the money isn't there."

St. Joe's Adds Cardiac Bypass Surgery

For many years, St. Joseph Mercy Hospital--Pontiac, has offered the community a wide range of cardiac care services with the exception of cardiac bypass surgery.

Now, in a joint endeavor

with its sister facility, St. Joseph Mercy Hospital--Ann Arbor, it will begin cardiac surgery on Monday, August 4.

The decision to make the surgical program a joint endeavor between the two

hospitals was made based upon the fact that the Ann Arbor facility has been performing cardiac surgery for over thirty years and that it has developed one of the finest teams of cardiac surgeons in the country.

Instead of each facility having its own team of cardiac surgeons, one team will work out of both facilities.

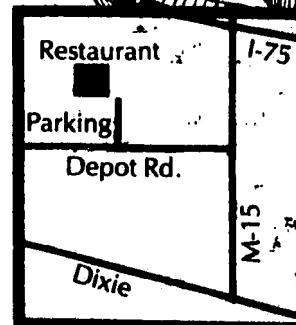

WHAT DOES THE TERM "HOSPICE" MEAN?

During medieval times, a hospice was a way station where travelers could rest and relax before continuing on their journey. In the late 19th century it became a term used to identify homes and hospital-like locations where Roman Catholic nuns cared for the dying.

Today the hospice has become a whole new thought-concept relating itself to the needs of the dying and terminally ill. Psychologist Robert Kastenbaum identified this special concern as the latest development of the death-awareness movement. The hospice concept recognizes two cardinal needs of the dying: 1) the need for relief from pain and 2) a closer contact with loved ones.

With these two specific needs in mind, health-care professionals are now exploring alternative methods to care for the terminally ill, methods other than those normally provided in the traditional hospital setting.

The greatest attention is being given to that of home-care of the terminally ill. Special hospital units or teams of doctors, nurses and psychologists are working toward this special home-care technique.

Thendara's Roads are Literally "The Pits"

"Tell them we need help. Please tell them we need help from someone!"

You wouldn't expect that kind of helplessness from Francie Rieser. Nor would you from any of her neighbors who own homes in the \$100,000 range in Thendara Park.

But those families living in the newly developed portion of the secluded, hilly subdivision north of Walters Lake have got a problem. It's spelled ROADS.

Every time a big rain comes, residents must cope with flooded roads and homes, extreme erosion and exposed power and gas lines.

The rains of July 27 caused the worse damage yet in the four year old subdivision.

Portions of the private roads looked like they had been damaged by an earthquake. Tiohero had washed away partially leaving a seven foot deep crevice with several exposed power lines in one part of the road.

The night before, residents on O-a-wen-sa had just finished laying \$1000 of sod in an at-

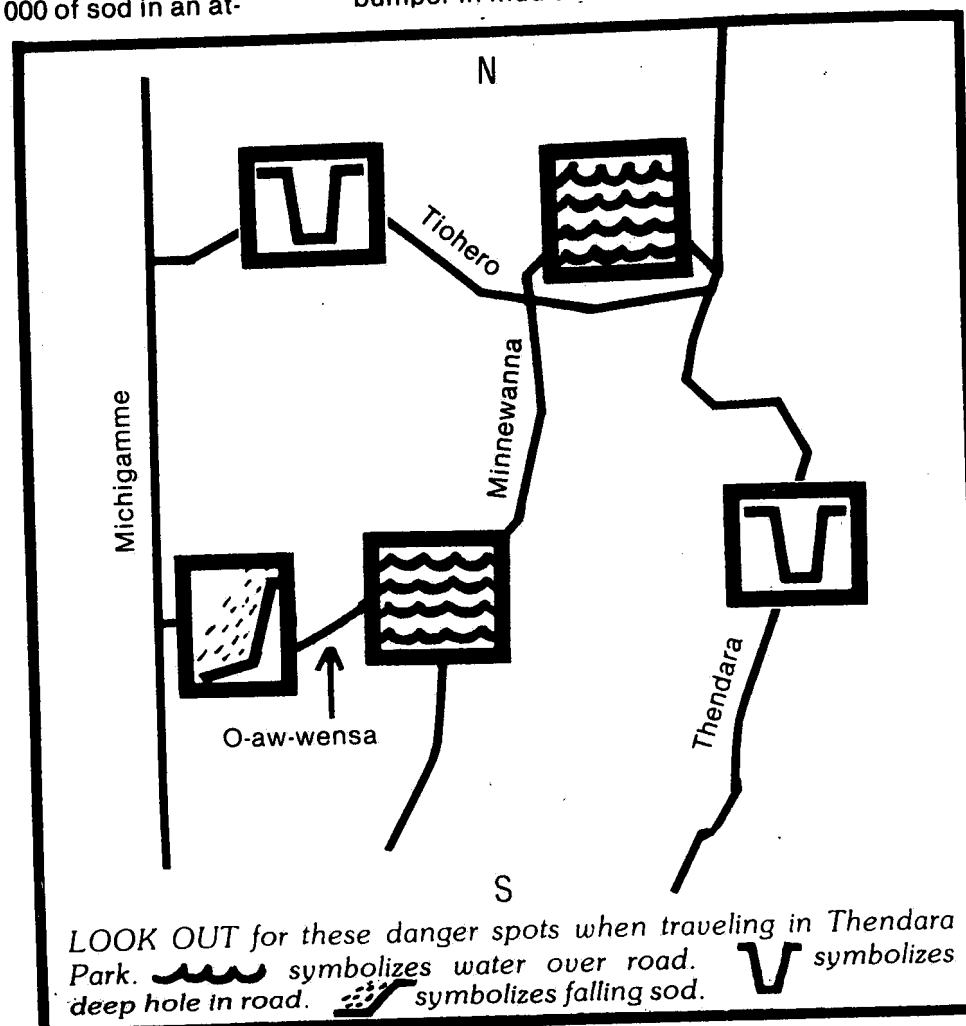
tempt to slow down the flow of water from the top to the bottom of the street. It all washed away Sunday.

"We were catching the sod as it was flying down the street," lamented Mrs. Rieser.

Two streets over, a car was buried up to its bumper in mud and water and on Thendara a

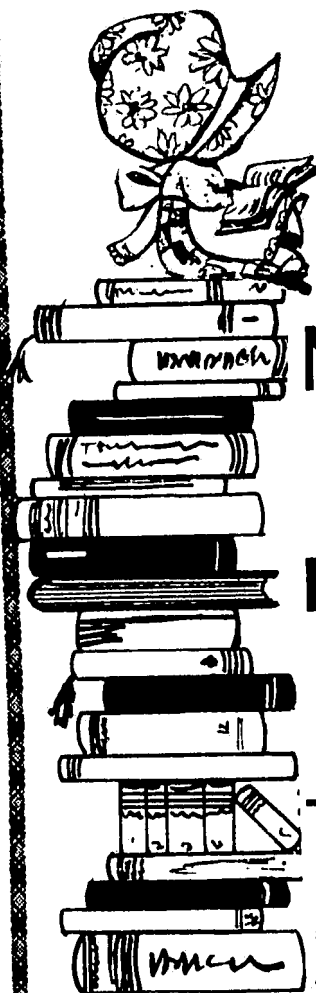

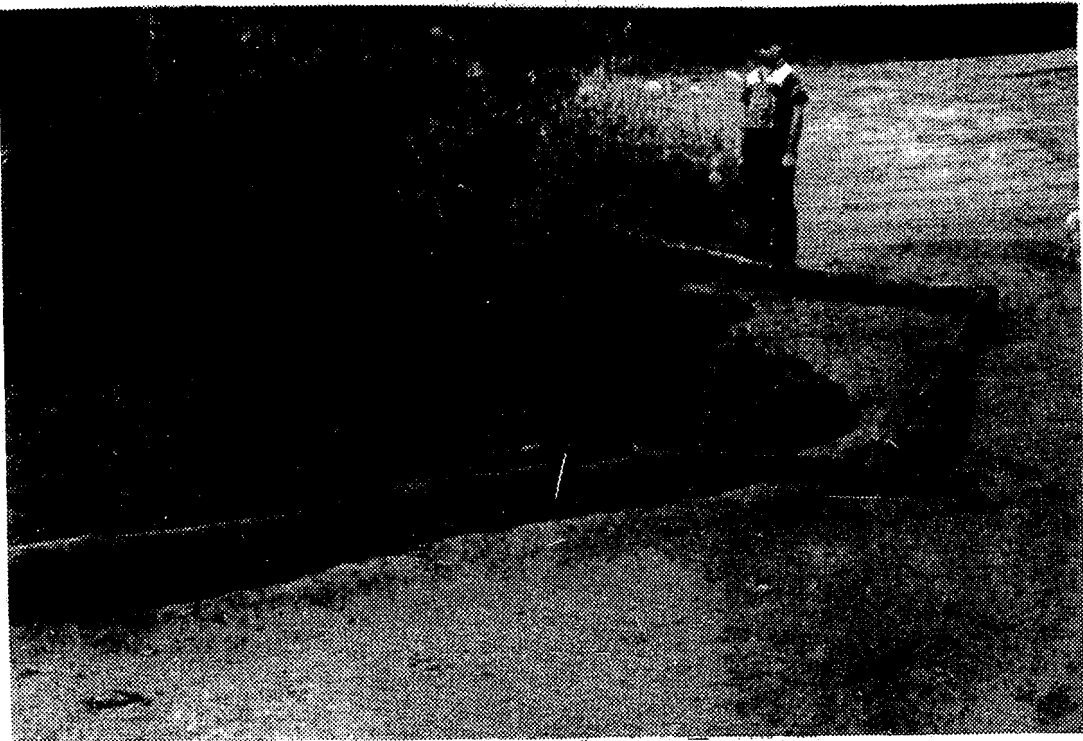

major portion of the road had eroded away making it impassable.

But the biggest problem Thendara residents face is finding someone to help them with their roads.

"We don't understand why the township or county didn't force the developer (Sylvan

Realty) to bring them up to code in the first place," said Colleen Waananen, who with her husband, is chairperson of the subdivision's road committee.

According to Mrs. Rieser officials told her because the roads were platted in 1925-26, the developers did not have to bring them up

to today's standards.

Ironically, the county has refused to take over the private roads because they are not up to standard.

"We have been from the township all the

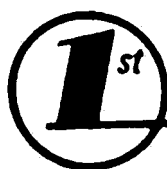

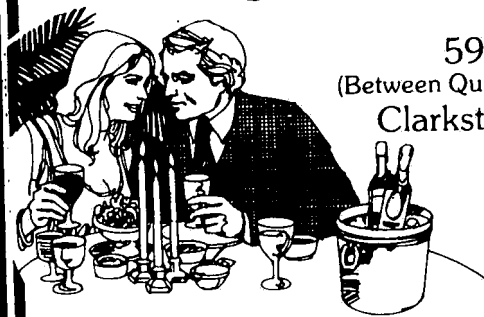

way to the attorney general and they all say they won't get involved in private roads," said Mrs. Waananen.

The developer, according to residents doesn't consider it his problem either, although he has filled in with sand in a number of places.

"He is trying but he's not doing it right," said Cindy Dye. "The only reason he does anything is because he's got pieces of property for sale."

The residents themselves pay \$135 a year for road maintenance but this year many of them expect to pay double and still the major

problems won't be addressed.

According to homeowner Al Sheppard, the private roads need the tender loving care of a good engineer. We'd probably need culverts, catch basins, retention walls and lots and lots of money.

The homeowners also need a little help from Consumers Power and Detroit Edison.

Mrs. Rieser claimed it took five months to get an exposed gas line covered last year. "I had to go all the way to Jackson to get it done."

Now both utility companies are haggling

over the exposed lines on Tiohero. Because they are private roads, according to Mrs. Rieser, Consumers and Edison don't feel it is their responsibility to provide the tons of dirt needed to fill the holes in which the lines are exposed. They have, however, deactivated the lines for safety purposes.

"All we're trying to get is some other words other than 'those are private roads, we won't help you'. We're looking for someone in government who will say 'yes, we will help you,'" said Sheppard.

from the Macomb-Oakland Regional Center (MORC). MORC's main thrust is placing clients out of institutions in appropriate homes in the community.

"We have one of the best programs in the country as far as placement," said Dzenowagis. "We only select the top people for foster parents."

Ms. Bakale is a social worker for MORC. She has a caseload of twenty homes, many in this area.

"The homes provide a family-like atmosphere," said Ms. Bakale. "They get love and care that only a family can give."

Mrs. Fraley of Shindler Road, Davisburg, is a foster parent. Besides two of her own, she cares for Scott, 11, and Gale, 5.

"I got disgusted with society because they try to put a shield around them, (retarded and handicapped persons)," said Mrs. Fraley. "The more they get out the better they will be."

MORC has been "getting them out" since the early 1970's. The Center was originally created to develop two new institutions for the mentally retarded. Rather than spend the money on building, they decided to place the patients in community residences.

There are two types of community residences. Group Homes are for residents

who want to help mentally retarded persons on a corporate basis rather than on an in-the-family basis. Group Homes can have a maximum of six residents.

Group Homes have run into serious opposition from homeowners who fear their lifestyle will be disrupted and property values lowered.

A year ago in Davisburg, neighbors

protested vigorously when a group home was established there. A proposed group home on Timber Ridge in Independence Township may end up in court because neighbors have hired an attorney to stop the home.

Community Training Homes, however, are not as controversial. Mentally retarded, up to

four, persons live in the home with the family. They are treated just like brothers and sisters, and often don't leave until adulthood.

This is the type of home Mrs. Fraley keeps. And she and her family have been enjoying the challenge of watching and helping the children progress for 3½ years since they got Scott.

"He was like a little animal left out in the woods. He couldn't do anything," recalled Mrs. Fraley, when they first met Scott.

His progress has been remarkable, but not without problems.

"His temper tantrums went day and night," said Mrs. Fraley. "In public he would just start screaming and swearing. I wanted to go hide in a corner."

She continued, "It took a lot of adjusting but it finally worked itself out."

Dzenowagis said the Fraleys are typical of the types of foster families MORC hires.

"The major qualification is attitude," said Dzenowagis. "Are you a caring, warm person?"
