Tax Proposals to be Debated in Clarkston

Three tax proposals that are expected to appear on the General Election ballot in November will be debated in the Clarkston Little Theater on September 18 at 8 p.m.

Participating in the debate will be Gerald H. Miller, State Budget Director; Richard Putney,

Executive Director of the Michigan State Trooper's Association; and Dick Jacobs, a member of the Tisch Tax Cut Coalition.

Miller will be speaking for Governor's Milliken's proposed tax shift. He has been State Budget Director since 1975. As the Governor's chief fiscal officer,

Miller prepares the state budget and oversees the work of 1600 employees.

Putney will represent the Smith-Bullard proposal, a tax proposal authored by Michigan Representatives Roy Smith and Perry Bullard, and favored by the Michigan Education Association.

Jacobs will be speaking for the Tisch Tax Cut. He's a manufacturer's representative from Grand Blanc who has toured the State in support of Tisch. A couple of months ago he was in Clarkston to speak on behalf of the Tisch Plan.

The debate is a public service sponsored by the

Independence Republican Club.

"It's going to be an opportunity for people to hear the straight dope on all these proposals," said Dale Stuart, spokesperson for the club.

He continued, "There will be no speeches by any candidates and no solicitations for contributions. This is not a meeting of the Republican Club," he stressed.

Independence Deadlock Means Ad Valorem Sewer Tax Continues

The Independence Township board deadlocked on, and thereby defeated, a motion to eliminate the ad valorem sewer assessment tax for 1980-81 at their regular meeting Tuesday, September 2.

Trustee William Vandermark, who submitted the motion, had argued that it was "indefensible" to assess the millage while funds totaling over 1.5 million dollars were available to make the bond payments from a county held construction fund.

But other board members were unwilling to go along with the motion before consulting with financial consultant Robert Bendzinski, who had worked out the payment plan for the township in 1976.

DPW head, George Anderson, said that the county reserve had been calculated into the initial plan to make payments on the bond issue when the assessment period ran out. Assessments run through 1996, while bond payments continue until the year 2006.

"If we use up the reserve by then," Anderson said, "we'll need not one mill but three or

four."

Township treasurer Fred Ritter agreed "We got this expert advice that bailed us out of a bad situation and I don't think we should throw it out now."

Thanks to a surplus in the township's general fund the assessment has been lowered two years in a row from the original 2.0 mills to 0.5 mills. But this would be the first time that the county fund, held up in an EPA audit, would be available.

Chris Rose, township secretary, commenting on the motion said, "The (Bendzinski) report was based on low interest rates on our investment; we've had anything but low interest rates since 1976. I don't think he could have known how much money was going to be in that fund."

But Anderson countered by noting that building permits, and therefore potential assessment money, were also not what might have been expected.

"None of us here are financial experts," he said in defense of retaining the millage and

sticking to the assessment schedule of at least \$210.00/year.

One board member, Rudy Lozano, appeared to favor the motion on principle.

"I've only agreed with Bill Vandermark three times all year," he said, "But goddammit, the government just loves to play with my money."

"I don't mind paying taxes, but let them come to me when they need it, not take it and then decide what they need it for."

When the vote came it was a 3-3 split, yeas--Rose, Lozano and Vandermark, nays--Ritter, supervisor Whitey Tower and trustee Michael Thayer. Trustee Jerry Powell was absent.

Another vote is possible at the September 16 meeting when consultant Bendzinski is slated to appear. An alternative discussed, too, was to vote the one mill for this year, have Bendzinski make another projection and, on his recommendation possibly roll it back again next year.

One way or the other, supervisor Tower would like to have the matter resolved. "We have this argument every year," he says.

Currently a road deputy, Liggett formerly was liaison officer for the department's records bureau. He also is chief steward of the Oakland County Deputy Sheriff's Association and sits on the union's bargaining committee.

Saying he is anxious to begin his new duties, Liggett stated, "The POAM is the most progressive and

fastest-growing police union in the state. It is by far the best labor organization I have been involved with."

A graduate of Wayne Community High School, Liggett attended Oakland University. He and his wife, Charlene, reside in Clarkston with their two sons, Larry Jr. and Charles.

Springfield Decides to Place Bavarian Sewer on November Ballot

At Springfield Township's monthly board meeting last week, topics discussed ran-

ged from design standards to be followed in newly constructed subdivisions to the township's assistance in funding a black top parking lot for the library.

However, under old business, the ongoing controversial subject involving ownership of the Bavarian Sewage Treatment Plant was again re-hashed.

According to state law, when converting apartments to condominiums, as in Bavarian Village, the sewage treatment plant must be owned and maintained by either the county or township.


Due to the county's refusal to accept ownership of the plant, it was decided at last month's township meeting that the board request Mosher-Kapelczak, Inc. (a municipal engineering firm) to investigate the existing facility, its adequacy at present and the capital expenses required to maintain the facility. The township wants the results of this investigation prior to any decision-making, as the owner must bear the cost of these expenses.

This necessary data was not available by the September 4th meeting but will definitely be on hand before the November ballot.

The question of whether the township should assume ownership of the plant by placing it on the ballot in November, or by conducting a special meeting in which mainly "concerned residents" would attend prior to voting in November was answered at last week's meeting with the proposal of a special meeting losing out.

However, Supervisor Collin Walls said he had a "gut feeling" there should be a special meeting held so that interested residents could state their opinions and completely understand the problem and be able to make an educated vote in November. Treasurer, Patricia Kramer agreed with this viewpoint.

Clerk Calvin Walters and Trustees Glen Vermilye and William Whitley, disagreed making the vote 3 to 2. The resolution was passed to have the proposal written up in an understandable manner and presented on

the November ballot. The three yeas felt that truly concerned voters would contact the township board or office prior to the voting and learn the facts surrounding the proposal.

Collin Walls made his recommendations for Springfield Township's Economic Development Corporation Board (EDCB) also on Wednesday evening. He recommended for the six year term; Harry Kirk, Ralph Tredway, Jack Watson and Calvin Walters (one EDCB member must be on the township board), five year term; Pete Beale, four year term; Mary Barker, three year term; Jean Acey, two year term; Kirk McLaughlin and one year term; Helen Vergin. All nine appointments were approved by the board.

Also approved at this meeting were design and construction standards composed by Mosher-Kapelczak, Inc. for subdivisions and site plans.

Ray Cousineau of Mosher-Kapelczak, Inc., said the plans are "...geared towards local construction but there are references to national standards" in the package. The plans were adopted by Ordinance No. 45.

Springfield Township also made a change in the Township Planning Consultant. After eight years with Tod Kilroy, the board ap-

proved a resolution to contract Gerald Luedtke and Associates of the Renaissance Center in Detroit. They believe that, like anything else there's a time for change, and Luedtke and Associates have presented innovative ideas and do lean towards environmental protection, with which Springfield Township is very concerned.

A petition was submitted by the Library Board for assistance in funding the

blacktopping of the parking lot. The resolution was passed that the remaining portion of the 1979 Sidewalk Fund will be transferred to the Library Improvement Fund for the amount of the bids for the paving, not to exceed \$6,000.

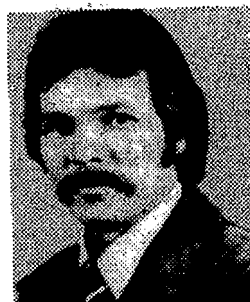

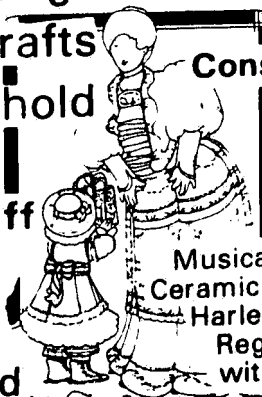

Independence Approves Preliminary Plat for Clarkston Ranch Estates

The Independence Township board met as policy-makers in search of a policy on Tuesday, September 2.

At issue, was a request by developers Jacobites and Schultz for tentative preliminary plat approval of their proposed subdivision off Eston Road in the northeast

section of the township.

Clarkston Ranch Estates, as outlined by Fred Jacobites would consist of some 100 plus homes (97 in Independence, the remainder in Orion Township) on over 300 acres, with an average lot size of 3 acres.

But the real issue was whether or not the developers should be required to install sanitary sewers and, if they should, whether or not it was the township board's responsibility to tell them so.

Kilroy, township planner both submitted letters to the board recommending denial of the plat without provisions for sewer construction.

Mr. Jacobites, however, argued that such a request was unreasonable given the size of the proposed lots and the cost of sewer installation.

He claimed that perk tests conducted on the site established that septic systems would pose "no environmental dangers."

"I've never heard of a three acre development that required sewers," he said.

Mr. Jacobites distributed a letter to the board from William Lohff, at Kieft Engineering, which estimated cost of on-site sewer installation at 1.39 million dollars. "That means you're asking me to add \$14,000 to the price of every lot," he said.

The board was hesitant to press their department heads' recommendation for several reasons.

The property is zoned R1C, which provides a minimum lot size of 1.5 acres. Township supervisor, Whitey Tower said, "It's refreshing to have somebody come in here with larger lots than are zoned."

Other board members seemed unwilling to deny the plat, too, simply on the unconfirmed notion that the county would require the sewers.

Rudy Lozano said, "if we're going to lose a nice subdivision because of this (the sewer requirement), then I'm opposed to it."

The township does not have an ordinance, nor has the county health department issued a written mandate for sewer construction on all new plat development. But it was the understanding of some board members that the county would not approve any new projects in the township in which sewers were not included.

The board finally decided that the only way to find out where the county stood was to rule on the question and send it along to them. If they (the Department of Public Health) didn't recommend requiring sewers then the township could act accordingly.

Fred Ritter, township treasurer, commented, "I'm not saying tonight he needs sewers unless the county says he does."

Ritter also suggested that the township might need to take a more definitive stand on

the whole question of mandated sewer installation.

"At what point are we going to cut off the requirements?" he asked.

Other board members implied that the township shouldn't cut off the requirements anywhere.

"I don't think we should look at this as an isolated piece of property," said trustee William Vandermark.

"Maybe this plat alone doesn't need 'em, but the area eventually will if we establish this precedent."

**SPRINGFIELD TOWNSHIP REGULAR BOARD MEETING
SEPTEMBER 3, 1980
SYNOPSIS**

The regular meeting of the Springfield Township Board was called to order at 8:00 p.m., Wednesday, September 3, 1980, by Supervisor Walls. All Board members were present at the meeting.

MINUTES:

Minutes of the August 6, 1980, regular meeting were approved as amended. Minutes of the August 13, 1980, special meeting were approved as amended.

REPORTS:

Treasurer's Report was accepted as submitted. Reports were read from the Building Department, Fire Department and Constable.

COMMUNICATIONS:

1. Letter from Ron Nino, Holly Township Planner, requesting that Springfield Township send a representative to their September 8 meeting. Mr. Dennis Hall of the Department of Natural Resources will discuss the State Wetlands Act.

2. Letter from Colombiere Center regarding the 16th Century Renaissance Festival to be held on five weekends, September 20 through October 19.

3. Letter from Robert Locey, Oakland County Health Department requesting that September 21-27 be set as Child Passenger Safety Week.

4. Letter from the Township attorney regarding the judgment of the Weber versus Springfield Township court case. The Judge affirmed the Zoning Board of Appeals ruling.

5. Resolution from the City of Birmingham supporting House Bill 5257, which would postpone the 1980 census for six months. A resolution was adopted opposing House Bill 5257.

6. Resolution regarding the Environmental Protection Agency, Areawide Water Quality Management Plan was adopted.

7. Resolution from the City of Birmingham regarding House Resolution 6429, Small Business Equal Access to Justice Act. No action taken.

A St. Clair County jury returned two verdicts for two brothers accused of first-degree murder. One was found guilty, the other innocent.

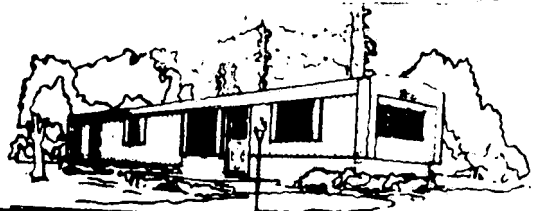
