Pine Knob Wins Round in Court

"We're going to appeal, without question," said township supervisor Jim Smith, of last Tuesday's circuit court ruling that would allow Pine Knob to construct its proposed 450-foot ski ramp.

Pine Knob Investment Company owners, Joseph Locricchio and Gary Francell, had sued the township over a decision from the Zoning Board of Appeals to deny the building permits necessary for construction.

Circuit Judge Francis X. O'Brien ruled that action unjustifiable and directed the township to incur the permits

ship to issue the permits.

Smith, however, is not convinced the ski ramp is now an inevitability. "I don't know that we exhausted all our alternatives," he said.

"I'm disappointed. But I think we will soon file an appeal and, if Pine Knob attempts to act in the meantime, we could ask for a stay (to block construction)."

Locricchio was quoted after the decison as saying he intended to start construction next spring and, hopefully, be done by the start of the 1981 ski season.

Census Shows Big Jump for Independence, Springfield

Preliminary population figures showing significant increases in both Springfield and Independence Townships are in from the U.S. Census Bureau.

The numbers from Springfield were the most dramatic, reflecting an increase over 1970 of almost 90 percent, compared to a 24 percent increase in Independence (that, despite a loss of 7.4 percent in the Village of Clarkston).

Population county-wide topped the one million mark for the first time as it rose 11.6 percent to 1,013.473. Final figures are, however, in dispute. The City of Pontiac has charged that some of the apparent loss in their number (almost 10,000) was due to census error.





5647 Dixie Hwy., Waterford Visa 623-9422 Master Charge Bill Genshaw, who has an extensive background in audio visual equipment and photography in general, began to experiment and make use of it while teaching his history classes.

Genshaw noticed his students showing an interest in the machinery, in photography and some even in cinematography.

So in 1974-75, a pilot program was launched in media communication and production that brought forth an overwhelming amount of applicants.

The one obstacle confronted at the beginning though was a lack of equipment. The students made use of Genshaw's own 35mm camera and movie camera but obviously this just wasn't enough.

Therefore, realizing the project was not just a "passing phase", with the support of then high school principal, William Dennis,

Genshaw devised an idea to raise money for the media class to put towards equipment.

Approximately one Saturday each month, the class will rent a recently released movie and show it in the Clarkston High School Auditorium and charge a much lesser fee than most theatres do.

The funds raised through this activity are put directly back into the program.

"People are starting to take advantage of the things these students can do," says Genshaw. "In fact, we have begun to get almost more requests than we are able to handle."

All video taping including football games, both boys and girls basketball games, filming, sound taping for school plays and many photos used by the school are done by Genshaw's media class.

Although there is a great deal of en-

joyment and interest involved for the students, as an instructor, Genshaw's main concern is that they gain the theory of communication.

This is evident by the stringent goals required of his media students which are:

- 1. Students will acquire a basic understanding of modern communication theory and its application to production of effective audio visual media.
- 2. Students will have the basic skills needed to properly use and maintain audio visual related equipment.
- 3. Students will be able to work effectively alone or in a group to produce audio visual materials
- 4. Students will be motivated to pursue areas of personal interest in future careers

Young Taxidermist Takes Over Waterford Hill Sports Center

Bob Brown Ready to Work

Bob Brown missed the deer hunting season this year. But that doesn't mean he didn't get in on the kill.

Bob, at his newly acquired Waterford Hill Sports Center, is surrounded by freshly harvested white-tails. All ready for his ministrations as a licensed taxidermist.

Not that he didn't miss the annual November hunt. But starting a new business, expecially one that is at its peak in the middle of hunting season, has its responsibilities.

Bob says, "I guess there are more important things than hunting....like fishing.

"Really though, I had to be here. We sold over 600 licenses in the past two weeks.'

And he is hoping that some of the 600 will be back to have their deer mounted.

At 20, Brown is a recent graduate of the American Institute of Taxidermy. In his months at the school he learned, he says, how to mount "anything that's legal".

Now he's ready to go to work.

When an animal arrives at the shop, Bob's first step is to skin the hide away from antlers and eyes, taking careful measurements and ciding hide and antlers to make sure that the finished product will match up.

The hide is salted to preserve it until all of this fall's hunt is in and then sent to a tan-

the same time Bob uses the At measurements to order specific sizes for the head mold, eyes and ear inserts that will be required to mount each subject.

When the molds are all in and the hides return from the tannery (usually 2-3 months), Bob will re-match all parts and begin to put the animal back together.

This entails placement of the glass eyes on the mold with clay, anchoring of the antlers and positioning of the plastic ear liners. With the tanned hide sewn back in place the mount is nearly complete.

Final adjustments are then made to insure a proper fit, which often involves soaking and tightening of the hide, to fit snugly around eyes and mouth.

After the mount has dried for several weeks it is ready for the happy hunter's living

No, Bob Brown didn't fire a single shot in this year's deer hunt. But he hopes that, in a business way, it will be his best season ever.
