


### "Biggest Drunk's" Return to Sobriety Made Possible by Insight

"I was the biggest drunk at the shop at one time," Larry declared, exhaling a long string of smoke from his cigarette.

"For the past twelve years, I've been working at the Ford plant in Mt. Clemens, a 45-minute drive from my home. There were so many times," remembers Larry, "that I would get home and not have the slightest idea

how I got there. In fact, one time I made it home in 25 minutes...to this day I still don't know how.

Blackouts like this and an increased intake of liquor are a couple of the most prevalent warning signs of alcoholism.

Today, thanks to Insight, Larry is a pretty average kind of guy. Works at the shop, married for ten years, six kids, two cats, a

Seven Whipple Lake residents have filed a petition with the Oakland County Road. Commission protesting a 3-foot deep drainage ditch dug in front of their yards the first week of this month. The petition states that a ditch would "be a very dangerous public safety hazard for cars that have had a tendency to veer off the curve of our road." The ditch would also be a danger to school children who have to walk the length of the 550 foot ditch to the bus stop on the narrow shoulder of the road, exposed to 50 MPH traffic.

Fred Houghton, Chairman of the Oakland County Road Commission explained that the ditch digging was a normal maintenance decision because of water on the road. "Our records indicate people swerving to miss water and going off the road."

Residents are baffled by this decision. Treat March, 9412 Sashabaw, has lived in his home for ten years and has only seen water on the road one time and he felt that was because of ice.

Martin Bakken, 9370 Sashabaw, the backbone of the petition drive, attributes cars running off the road to "people driving who are tired or intoxicated and not to water on the road."

Keeping mailboxes has been a problem for several of the families as cars veering off the road have knocked mailboxes down on numerous occasions. Now it is feared if cars run off the road they will face the possibility of turning over in the ditch.

Residents feel that the "supposed drainage problem could have been solved by putting in a tile drainage field for the same cost of less, or by raising the culverts under the driveways."

"Twenty years ago ditches were dug along the side of roads for drainage," Bakken said. "Now there are residents on the road and three times as much traffic."

On Monday, the Road Commission staff will present their recommendation to the Road Commission based on their investigation of the problem; normal procedure

dog, and a home in Pontiac Township.

Insight, for the unaware, is a residential and aftercare program located at Colombiere Center in Clarkston which has a primary goal of teaching people to understand and deal effectively with alcoholism. ...

in Larry's case, he began drinking heavily Approximately sixteen years ago, gradually increasing his intake just to get himself through each day.

"It began with beers after work with the boys. Then I was drinking a pint of rum every day during lunch.'

It got to the point where I would buy a bottle of Coke and pour a fifth of rum or whiskey into it and walk into work and nobody knew the difference." Also there were always the six to eight beers after work and always the bottle under the seat of the

The amount of liquor increased for Larry while the quality decreased. He no longer cared what he drank just as long as the shaking subsided.

Then the violent spells began. On one occasion Larry tried to wash the dishes in the trash compactor. "I was so mad I threw the Kirby downstairs and the TV across the room. I literally wrecked the house.'

This is the straw that broke the camel's back. Maria, his\_wife, relates, "I became very scared when he started to get violent. The children and myself were so afraid to rock the boat...it was like living with Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde.'

In desperation, Maria took the childrenand left for several days, then, realizing this would not solve the problem, called Al-Anon (a support group for the families of

They taught her to face the situation of Larry's alcoholism, ways of inducing him to seek help, to stop blaming herself, and how to attain peace of mind while living with an alcoholic.

"Al-Anon teaches the concept that you can find happiness and still live with someone who is drinking excessively," related Maria.

'My friends and co-workers," said Larry, "had been expressing their concern and telling me that I did have a problem but I would not accept it. That is, until about two years ago. I looked for about a year for a treatment center that would help me. Then my neighbor's father told me about Insight at Colombiere, a program he had already been through.'

Larry went through the 28-day treatment program at Insight in October, 1980 and has just celebrated his 13th month of complete

in my second marriage and between marriages plus the good relationship I've had at home for the past ten years but never realized."

for this kind of complaint. Bakken plans to attend the meeting. "I want to make it clear that I want to work with the road commission on the problem...I always believe in negotiating.'

The residents were given no notice of the ditch digging; several came home from work to find a ditch in front of their homes. They are angry. They want to see the ditch filled in, and have the drainage problem solved another way.

The seven families affected by the ditch have worked hard to maintain well-kept vards, putting in sod up to the edge of the road and keeping it cut and fertilized. Not only will the drainage ditch be an eyesore but it will become overgrown with weeds and will draw insects in warmer weather, they say.

Prior to the ditch, rain water and snow was no problem as the front lawns sloped down to meet the side of the road, providing an even drainage. "Rain and snow will now stand in the ditch, whereas before there was no standing water," says Thelma Ball, of 9350 Sashabaw, "It is really sad that they spent their time and money on this.

Residents fear for their children walking to school and riding their bikes on the narrow shoulder of the road. Residents are also concerned about serious accidents as a result of the kitchen.

States the petition: "This is certainly a case of curing a minor problem by creating a "major disaster."



Waterfall's 15-hour sale will begin at 8 a.m. and run until 11 p.m. Friday night. Santa Claus will be visiting until 8 p.m.







# Pine Knob Manor Approval Delayed

A decision on tentative preliminary plat approval for Pine Knob Manor East has been put off for another two weeks in an attempt to work out some remaining questions on the proposed plat. Before December 2, the township planner and building department and Borg Warner, the developers, will attempt to resolve problems with the 60 lot, 43 acre development located just off Waldon Road.

One question was raised at the November 17 meeting of the township board about a parcel of land on Waldon Road itself zoned R-1R but seemingly of less acreage than the required three acres for the classification.

Planner Richard Carlisle also pointed out

that some information had not been provided by the developers in accordance with the township ordinance. Another question was raised about a letter of intent describing gradient plans, how the planned development would fit into the property. There was concern about whether or not certain areas are buildable.

The road layout, done to Oakland County Road Commission specifications, raised some questions in the planner's mind about curves and slopes. In addition, some of the lots are in close proximity to an existing private road raising the possibility of double frontage lots which are not allowed under township ordinance.

The planner also questioned the present condition of Waldon Road and what effect, if any, the proposed development could have on it. Also utilities were not noted on the

Prior to the board meeting, Borg Warner had responded that easements were noted where they could be appropriately, that land grading would be kept to a minimum with contour lines shown, that road grading would be done to county standards but changes had been made in road curves, and that the county and township would have to make the decisions on the condition of Waldon Road.

Supervisor James Smith also questioned

He reminded the developers the township had gone to great lengths to preserve its natural beauty in a variety of ways but it appeared to him there had been "some pretty violent disruption" in the proposed plat con-

trary to township standards. Joseph Galvin, attorney for Borg Warner, explained that the original plat did not contain the odd lot, that it was purchased at the request of the planning commission and added to the plat. That same commission, he said, had also suggested the double frontage lots. "The planning commission brought us to this present configuration," Galvin con-

cluded. He went on to explain his clients had complied with every township suggestion whether required or not and had acquiesced with every reasonable request, economical or not. He asked, in return, the township be reasonable and grant tentative preliminary plat approval.

Smith's response was to ask if they considered a 3000 foot cul de sac reasonable when the township ordinance allowed 600 feet? Also the road was to have been a public road built to county standards, now it appears to be a private road, and one that seemed none to safe at that, in Smith's

Trustee Dale Stuart pointed out the real question was how the township's minimum standards were not being met, that was the

basis for approval or denial of the plat. Carlisle pointed out the double frontage lots and the possibility the added lot was less than three acres. Here Ken Delbridge, head of the township building department, pointed out the original non-conforming lot may have been made more so as a result of Borg Warner's purchase.

Clerk Chris Rose was more outspoken in his criticism saying, "When you start with a bad proposal and progress to a moderately bad proposal, the new one isn't necessarily a good one."

Trustee Dan Travis, who also serves on the planning commission, said the original plan had not been acceptable. Two nonconforming cul de sacs had been eliminated from the plat. He said the commission did not suggest the extra property be acquired, just that they take care of the cul de sac problem. But, he added, this plan was "infinitely better" than the original one.

Anthony Locricchio, representing Pine

Knob Investment, told the board Borg Warner was attempting to "bend and shape land" not suited to public road access and more suited to private roads. He feared the proposed road would look like a "back alley" to the condominiums. He suggested a return to the private road concept and said a more workable plan was possible. He said he would be willing to work with both the township and the developer toward another solution.

Since rejection of the plat would have sent Rorg Warner back to square one and the





### Student Council Takes Education Concerns to Senator Levin

Thursday, a staff member from Senator Carl Levin came to Clarkston to answer questions, listen to complaints, and get a general feeling of the thoughts of the Senator's constituents.

Mark Trujillo, a community development specialist, was present at the Village office on Depot Road. Among the people that came to voice their opinions was a delegation from the Clarkston High School Student Council, who took an hour off school to come.

Seniors Bob Cattin, Melissa Savas, Karin Karlstrom, Cindy Larkin, Eric Beamer, Junior Michelle Phaup, and Sophomore Julie Beamer presented Mr. Trujillo with 534 petitions which were signed by students from their school. The petitions dealt with education and its financing. They read: Dear Mr. Levin,

I am concerned about the decreasing level of state and national funding of education.

The quality of Michigan's education is being threatened by continued decreases in funding. We cannot allow this to happen, for education is the birthplace of tomorrow's leaders. We will be unable to reverse the present trend in our state and nation's recovery without adequate leadership in business and government. Without continued support for quality education, there is little hope for the future.

In answering the series of questions that followed, Trujillo explained that the federal government was not responsible for the funding of general education. Rather, they had authority over special things such as busing, lunches, and bilingual education.

Truillo recommended that the Student Council contact State Senator Kerry Kammer for better answers to their questions. Upon their return to school, the students reported to the Student Government class and immediately made plans to invite Senator Kammer to visit the school.



### Deerhunter Wounded in Independence

A deerhunting accident that left a Independence Township man with a serious head wound occurred before hunting season officially started, Oakland County Sheriff's deputies have said.

Jerry Blevins, 18, is in stable condition following surgery to repair a wound left by a 31/4-inch slug fired from a 12-gauge shotgun, St. Joseph Mercy. Hospital authorities reported.

Deputies said another hunter apparently shot Blevins by accident. They said five hunters had taken up positions in a woods near a field three-fourths of a mile east of M-15 south of Hadley Road early Sunday morning, apparently to wait for the 7 a.m. start of deer season.

About 5:30 a.m., though, three

deer ran into the field, stopped halfway across, turned and ran back toward the woods. According to sheriff's department reports. hunters said it was still dark but the deer were visible by moonlight.

The report said that two shots were fired, one of them striking Blevins.

"At the time of the shooting; hunting season was not open, said Sheriff's Department Information Officer Ken Hurst.

DNR law enforcement officials say there is little chance they will do anything beyond writing a report to accompany the investigation.

No arrests have been made in the case. If an arrest is made, Hurst says the toughest charge that could be brought would be careless use of a firearm.
