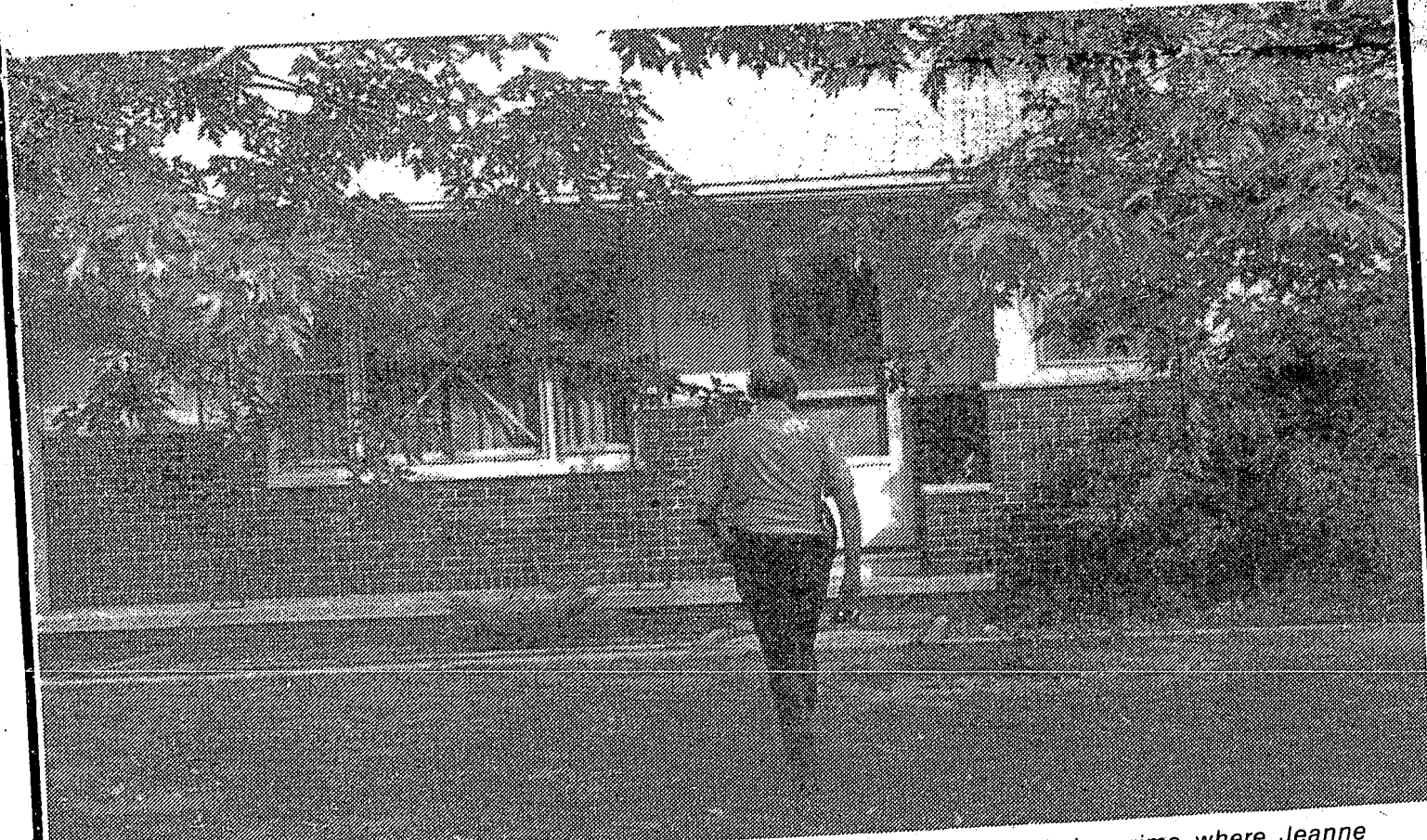

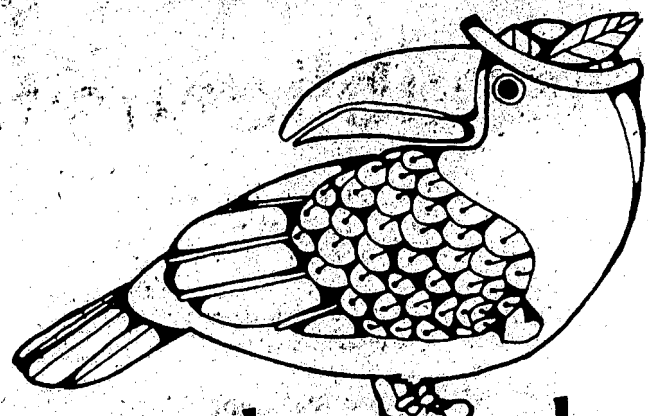

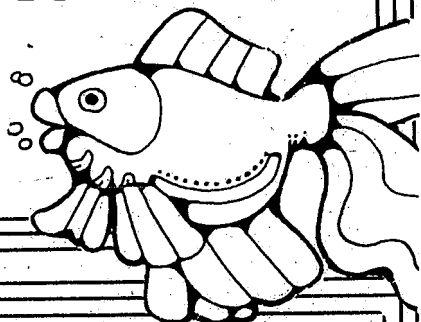

permit.

When contacted about the roast, Bill Vandermark said his brother was a logical "roastee" for the club. "Who's more closely identified with the Republicans around here than my brother? 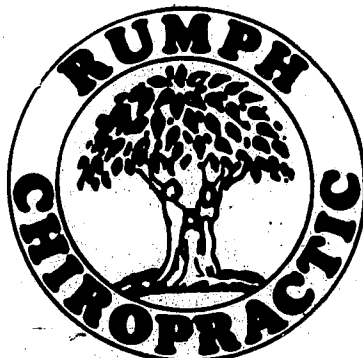

FINANCIAL PLANNING FOR THE 80's

There are several key factors to proper and complete financial planning. Estate Planning, Business Planning, Benefits Planning and Investment/Income Tax Planning. Estate Planning consists of a systematic organization of all assets with the proper coordination of the different methods of distribution that can be used. Woman Dragged from Home and Beaten

Victor and Jeanne Racowsky seemed to be on top of the world. They were proud of

their baby girl, less than a month old. They were proud of their new house on Paramus in Clarkston that they had purchased less than

two weeks ago. And they had good, stable jobs. Jeanne as a nurse and Victor as an adult education teacher.

One night last week their happiness turned to bitterness. Mrs. Racowsky, while home alone, with the exception of the baby, was dragged from her new home and severely beaten.

She ended up in Pontiac General Hospital after Independence Township Paramedics answered an emergency call. Her face was a bloody mess and required plastic surgery.

What caused a man, which police believe may have been wearing brass knuckles, come to a quiet neighborhood like Paramus, which borders Clarkston High School, and beat up Mrs. Racowsky, remains a mystery.

There is, however, a possible motive, and police, although they are not talking, say they have a very good lead.

"I don't feel that it has anything to do with me teaching boxing (he's a boxing instructor at Lakeland Arena) or anything at school," said Racowsky. "I have never had a problem with anybody."

Racowsky does, however, remember being threatened several weeks ago. He had shrugged the threat off, however, figuring they were only threats.

Now he wonders whether he took the threats too lightly.

He also wonders what kind of man could commit such a cowardly act.

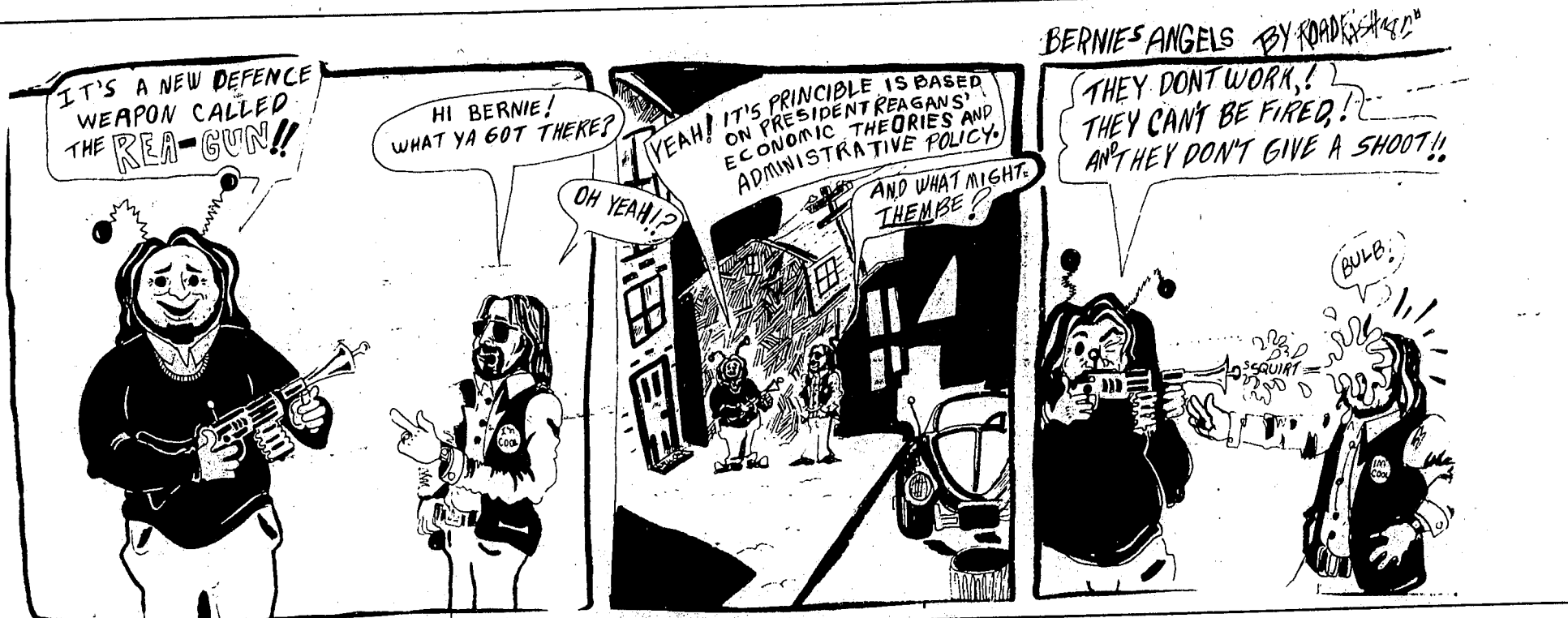

Friend of the Court

While I generally attempt to provide information rather than "editorialize", this article and the several following articles may tend to contain a great deal of opinion rather than simple objective facts. The opinions are mine and not necessarily those of the Office of the Friend of the Court.

The Office of the Friend of the Court is on the verge of extensive revision, as both houses of the Michigan legislature have passed similar bills to reform the Office. This involves the first major revision of the Office since its creation in 1919. This article and several following will deal with changes. Although there are some differences between the House and Senate versions of the reform, it is certain that a new law will be adopted. Under the changes, the involvement of the Friend of the Court in domestic relations cases will increase dramatically. This article will deal with one "minor" change from existing practice.

The Oakland County Friend of the Court has independently created a handbook which provides information to parties to a divorce action. This is available at no cost to interested persons upon request. The new law will require that this information be

provided to parties in all new cases. However, the existing handbook will require major revision, as it must now include an explanation of the procedures of the office, the rights and responsibilities of the parties, the availability of and procedures used in domestic relations mediation (a new system created by the statute and not yet in effect), the availability of "human services" in the community (no definition of "human services" is provided), and an explanation of how to file a grievance against the Office (also a new procedure). These topics will be dealt with in the future.

On the surface it is clearly beneficial to provide this service. At this time, however, the information booklet (book?) remains to be drafted, the procedures to be explained remain to be devised, and the cost of printing and distribution remain to be paid by the taxpayers. Will it be worth the costs? Undoubtedly some benefits will occur, and the drafters of the legislation felt that the benefits justified the costs. However, given the current status of the finances of the State of Michigan, there may be difficulty meeting these "justifiable" costs, as well as the many other costs inherent in other aspects of the legislation. Without increased funding, and without increased staff, and without increased space to place the increased staff, the purposes of the new law will remain unfulfilled.

I will discuss other aspects of the new law, as well as funding schemes devised by the Legislature, in later articles. I obviously have misgivings about the legislation, but the offices of the Friend of the Court, the parties of domestic relations matters, and all Michigan taxpayers will have to deal with it. Hopefully, it will prove to be as effective in practice as its proponents contend. As taxpayers, you have the right to know what changes have been made by your elected officials and will draw your own conclusions to the question: "Will it be worth the cost?"



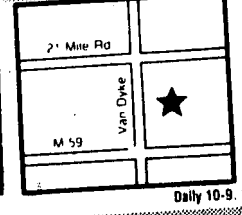
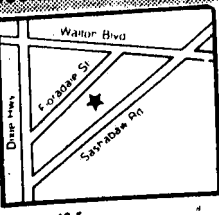

Surprise! Urban Cowboy Turns 70

Ward Carpenter was surprised by family and friends last weekend when he was the guest of honor at his 70th birthday party. Carpenter, and wife Donna, who live in Springfield Township, have long been known in the area as helping neighbors who have been very involved in their community.

Carpenter's two loves seem to be horses and children. He has owned, trained and raced horses. His home is always open to the youngsters of the area where he has been known to occasionally give hay rides and tractor rides.

"Although their love has always been with horses, they have shared that love with

people," noted one party guest, Representative Claude Trim. "I think it is great that we have people like the Carpenters living here."

Although Carpenter has lived in his Springfield Township home since 1940, his life before then reads like a Western novel. During the years of the Great Depression he was part of a circus.

Carpenter remembers leaving home to travel to Madison Square Gardens in New York to join the circus. Before he got there he found himself in jail and had to scrape up \$15 to get out.

That didn't stop Carpenter. He caught the Barnum and Bailey Circus in Philadelphia and stayed with them through 1934 and 1935

as a horse and elephant trainer. He also found time to ride with the Canadian Mounted Police and with Tim McCoy and his Rough Riders.

In 1936 Carpenter got a job with Fisher Body that earned 45 cents an hour. That was more than he was making at the circus however, where the \$4.50 he made was for a week's pay. He stayed with General Motors until retirement 30 years later.

Carpenter fondly remembers the riding stable he operated for several years and the 30 or so hayrides he would conduct from it each year. He also remembers taking the tractor to Andersonville School on occasion, giving tractor rides and showing off saddles

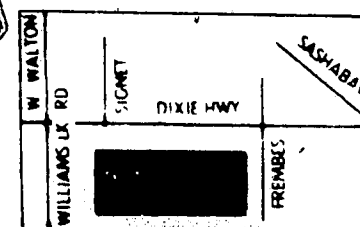

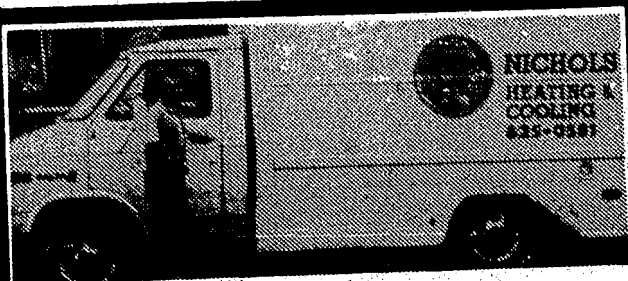

Negotiations Continue Between Board, Teachers

The Clarkston School Board held a closed session after the general business meeting of the October 11 Board of Education had ended to discuss the expiration of Clarkston Education Association's Master Agreement on August 24, 1982 and the continued state of non-contractual employment of union workers.

Many teachers, principals and others, educationally affiliated to Clarkston were in attendance to dramatize the intent of a letter to the board by C.E.A.

The letter was a statement of urgency and necessity in determining a master agreement between the two bargaining parties.

Both C.E.A. and those they represent offer comments of 'community priorities', 'the changing world' and 'not conceding the future'.

They speak of 'reasonable approach and compromise' when softening the line drawn under 'necessary' in their requests.

The C.E.A. will meet later this week to discuss further proposals and hopefully review a new proposal deriving from the October 11 closed session.

Text of C.E.A. letter to School Board

Although classes resumed for students on September 7, 1982, a new Master Agreement

between the Clarkston Education Association and Board of Education has not been negotiated. As a result, C.E.A. members have now worked for six weeks as a sign of their "good faith" while bargaining continued at a very slow pace. In the interim, contract settlements have been reached between other local education associations and their boards of education. It is time for a settlement of a 1982-83 Master Agreement between the Clarkston Education Association and this Board of Education.

The Clarkston Education Association is prepared to investigate customary avenues for settlement. It is to be made clear, however, that the C.E.A. is convinced that settlement of a new Master Agreement is a necessity.

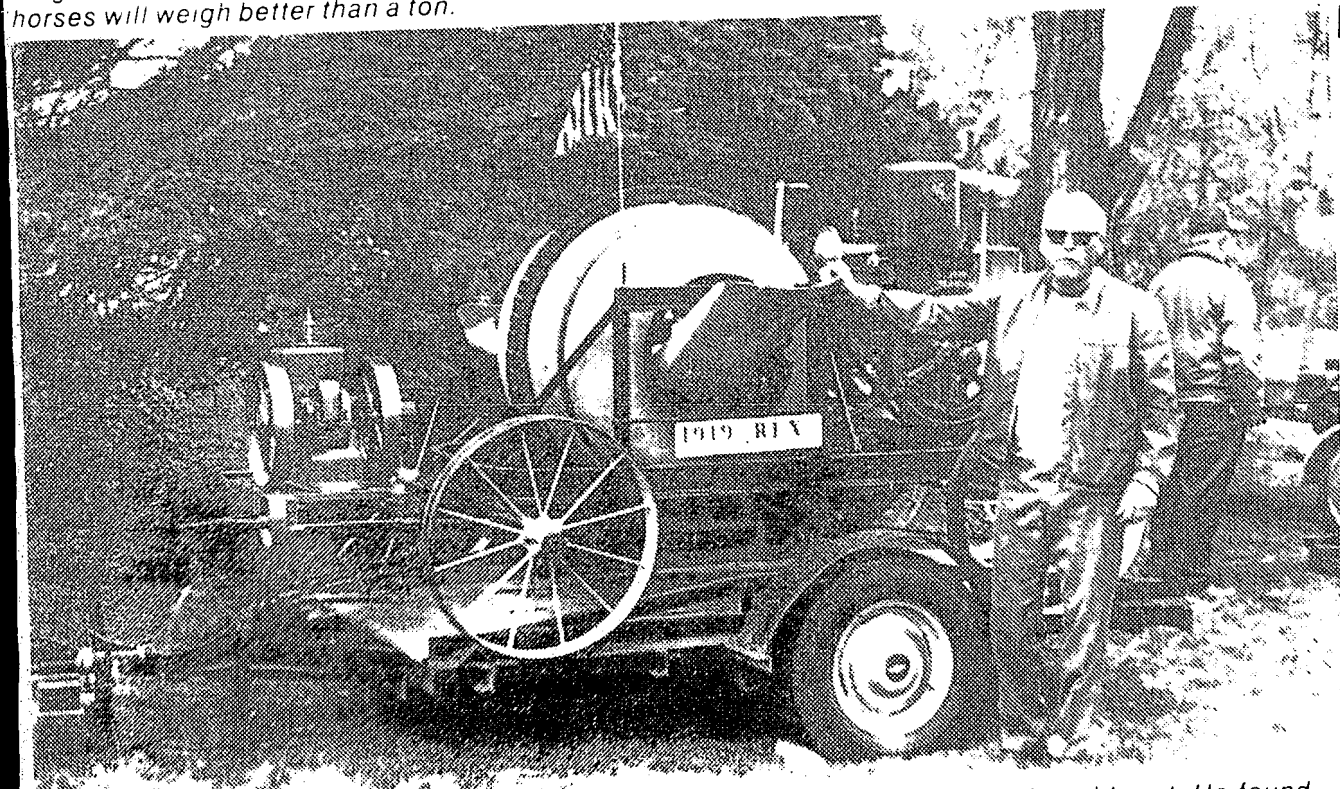
