#### Clarkston Public School

In 1930 our modern Clarkston High and Grade School was built with Mr. D. M. Winn acting as Superintendent. The first class to graduate from this school was the "Class of 31." Since then much has been done to make our school one of the most up to date and prominent schools in Oakland County. A new movie projector and public address system was purchased a few years ago which have proved to be useful additions. A very active athletic association is another one of our achievements with football, basketball, baseball, track and golf included. The music department is well represented in a modern band and chorus. The Home Economics and Shop classes are also filled to capacity.

At present two busses and several private cars bring in students from Waterford, Drayton, Sashabaw and Springfield.

The faculty numbers 19 this year with 500 students enrolled—approximately 275 high school students and 225 in grade school.

was another exciting game as a half-back from Big Beaver ran back two of Davison's punts for touchdowns. The Beavers rang up another counter to make the score 18-0.


