





MAKE A PORCH SWING

Although the porch swing consists of a large number of pieces, it is easy for the home craftsman to make.


All pieces should be sanded before assembly. Exposed edges should be rounded.

First make the two end supports for the seat; then add the seat boards, using No. 10 wood screws, 2 inches long, countersunk.
