Here's What Novi School Millage Vote Means

Novi's qualified school electors will go to the polls next week to cast ballots for the second time in three months on a school millage proposal. The school board has unanimously endorsed a request for a four-and-a-half-mill increase in property taxes for the school year.

—use of the building and site fund to retire the bonds on the building and site fund. It has also approved the transfer of the \$83,000 bond fund to be used for payment of the principal on the bonds which come due each year. The fund is large enough to do this for only four years.

The proposition would cost taxpayers an additional two mills, or \$2 per \$100 of assessed valuation as equalized. A reduction of two and a half mills in the special debt retirement levy, making the total tax increase only two mills.

The present millage request differs considerably from the proposition rejected in April. The board's plan for the six mills included additions to the present program totaling about \$10,000. It also provided for \$10,000 to be earmarked toward reduction of the school district's \$50,000 accumulated debt.

These reductions would mean half-day classes to some students, larger class sizes to others; fewer students riding the school buses, more work in the present program for all students.
